






CONTINENTAL DORSET CLUB 2014 ANNUAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING March 20, 2014 QUALITY INN, RICHMOND, IN

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 PM by President Casey Sidwell. Directors Coulter Passwaters. Johnnie Johnson, Mark lunghuhn Jeff Poynter were in attendance. New England Director Mike Wright was on the phone and North Central Director Elect Dick Reese was in attendance. CDC Exec. Sec./Treas. Deb Hopkins were also present. Secretary Minutes: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the minutes from the 2013 CDC Fall-Teleconference Meeting held December 5, 2013 and the 2014 Special Board Meeting Tele-Conference Meeting held February 5, 2014. Johnnie Johnson moved to accept the minutes as written. Coulter Passwaters seconded. Motion passed. Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal 2013-2014 year to date as of March 14, 2014. Total income is \$29,304.16, total expenses is \$48,356.03 for a current net cash loss of \$19,051.90. Account balances - Checking Account: \$4,826.25; Savings Account: \$25.00; CD: \$25,779.31; Money Market: \$10,090.60; Junior Association \$33,775.10 for total cash assets of \$74,496.26. Coulter Passwaters moved to accept the treasurer's report. Jeff Poynter seconded. Motion passed. Deb Hopkins also presented a proposed budget for 2014-2015 for the board to review as it goes through the meeting. Deb Hopkins also reported that the 2012-2013 tax filing has taken place and the CDC officially netted \$1,560.15 last year.

<u>CDC Stats:</u> Deb Hopkins presented the 2013-2014 statistics to date. As of March 13, 2014, 1,429 head have been registered and 931 head have been transferred. The registrations are down 268 head from the same period last year and the transfers are up 186 head from the same period last year.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Horned Dorset breeder Mike Squires had sent an email to the board a couple days prior to the meeting. He presented several proposals relevant to the promotion of Dorset Sheep including additional awards not currently covered in National Shows, showing Horned Dorsets in AOB division at fairs if numbers not warranted for their own division and slick shearing Horned Dorset Ewes. Jeff Poynter moved to appoint a committee to review the proposals and present recommendations to the CDC Board at the December Fall Tele-Conference Meeting. Coulter Passwaters seconded. President Casey Sidwell appointed the committee of Mark lunghuhn, Mike Wright and Deb Hopkins.

Coulter Passwaters moved that the CDC sponsor a first time junior exhibitor memento at either/or the All American Junior Show or National Junior Show in Louisville. Mark lunghuhn seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins will work on some awards options and email directors for approval.

Other correspondence received was from Horned Dorset breeder Tim Gadsby that longtime Horned Dorset breeder George Hunter from Stoneboro, PA passed away. Coulter Passwaters moved to have the 2014 Eastern Regional Junior Horned Dorset Show named in memory of George Hunter. Johnnie Johnson seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins will make sure the awards and show promotion state the show's dedication to George. Deb Hopkins also suggested that the new Horned Dorset show at KILE be named this year to honor George. **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

<u>-Dorset Futurity:</u> Deb Hopkins re-pre-

sented the 2014 Futurity Budget with the new additional division of "Dorset Advantage" ewe lambs. With it being approved at the last board meeting to accept online sales futurity nominations, Deb Hopkins asked for an official policy is put into effect. Coulter Passwaters move to accept the proposed Online Sale Policy for Futurity Animals. Jeff Poynter seconded. -<u>CDC Accepts Futurity Nominated Ewe Lambs from Online Sales (if they meet the following conditions):</u>

• 1. The Sale Management Company agrees to all terms of the CDC show and sale policy.

• 2. The Sale Management Company is bonded.

• 3. The Sale Management Company collects the \$25 nomination fee from the consigned and pays those funds to the CDC Office.

• 4. The nomination of the animal is indicated for the entire time the sale listing is on the internet identified by the scrapie number.

• 5. The Sale Management Company sends to the CDC office the print out of the sale with name and address of the purchaser for the entire sale.

Only sale conducted by a management company qualify, if an individual breeder has an online sale, all futurity nominations and sales must be handled by the sale management company.

Jeff Poynter moved to accept Matt Scramlin and Michael Pope to the certified judges list. Johnny Johnson seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins brought up that we really need a coordinator to oversee the Breed Standard Educational activity at the NAILE Junior Association meeting. Volunteers would be helpful.

-Production Dorset Committee: Deb Hopkins reported that we now can get the performance data on the registration papers as they have been re-designed to include a table for it on the front of the registration certificate. Just waiting for a performance oriented breeder to submit data with their registrations to finalized testing the registration program.

<u>-Dorset Breeder Spotlight:</u> Casey Sidwell is still trying to connect with the Huntrods Family for the first spotlight as it is needed for the spring Dorset Connection Issue. Really need a volunteer to do a nice article each year to be highlighted in the newsletter and on the CDC web site.

-Dorset Youth Grant Program: Casey Sidwell announced that we had 14 applicants and the grants were awarded to Noah Collins and Jarrod Alspaugh. They have been notified and will be utilizing their purchase grants soon.

<u>-Newsletter and Website:</u> Deb Hopkins reported that the 2014 winter newsletter had great advertising support and netted an income of \$1,892.90. This special issue was sent to all buyers of Dorset sheep the previous year whether they were CDC members or not. The 2014 Spring/Summer advertising deadline is April 15th. The web page has been updated as soon as possible to keep everyone current with happenings thanks to Frank Tiffany's great service.

<u>-Dorset Hall of Fame</u>: The CDC will be recognizing two Dorset breeders and influencers: Roger Huntrods & Dave Harmann at the annual meeting. Casey Sidwell will do the actual presentation to Roger at Sedalia in June. We have two more already nominated and three incomplete nominations that need more work on. It is an honor for the association to recognize all these folks who have meant so much to the Dorset breed. Need to keep encouraging nominations.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2014 All-American Junior Show will be July 4-6, 2014 at the Kansas State Fairgrounds, Hutchinson, KS. The Dorset exhibitors and their families will once again have a lunch on Saturday sponsored by the Junior Dorset Association. Evan Snyder will be judging the Dorsets. Deb would also like to thank Casey Sidwell and Mark lunghuhn & Family for their special donations, along with all the breeders that signed up for class

sponsorships. We will need to raise \$2850 for the Polled Dorset, Horned Dorset and Dorset Advantage shows. If all classes get sponsored we will have enough with the additional donations. The 2015 All American Show is heading east to West Springfield, MA at the BIG E Fairgrounds and the 3-on-3 Basketball Tourney will take place at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. -National Junior Association: The junior association is planning on having an informal meeting and BBQ lunch at the All-American and their Annual Meeting will be in Louisville in November. They are hosting an adult showmanship class at the All American to raise funds for the National Junior Breed Associations that are participating in the show. The scholarship application has been updated for the 2014 applicants.

OLD BUSINESS:

-CDC Registry Program: Deb Hopkins reported that she and Frank Tiffany have the program up and running as she has been registering sheep in the new system since mid-January. All the registration papers have been redesigned to include performance data and to include the new Dorset Advantage Registry program. Deb demonstrated the program and told the board its new features. Frank and Deb have been working on the program each week refining it and the process will continue as they have developed a system of emailing the program back and forth to get it updated. Question came up on getting the program copyrighted and the future of the program for other uses. It was decided that the CDC would rather sell the program and not be in the business of registering other breeds of sheep. Mark lunghuhn moved to pay Frank Tiffany the remaining \$2500 for registration program development. Coulter Passwaters seconded. Motion carried. -Revised CDC Class Recommendations: Deb Hopkins reported that she has forwarded them to as many major fairs and expositions that she could track down emails for, and they will be outlined in the next Dorset Connection. The class changes have also been instituted into the All American Junior Show and Louisville National Show classes, with final approval from Louisville to come from their executive board.

<u>-Trademarking "Dorset":</u> Mark lunghuhn will continue to look into costs and how to do it.

-2014 Regional Junior Shows: Deb Hopkins reported that the shows have been set but she was wondering how many will be able to get the "Dorset Advantage" classes instituted and who needs additional awards for this division. North Central, New England and hopefully Great Plains will be able to have them. Other regions are still pending and will need to let Debbie know by May 1st for award ordering purposes.

NEW BUSINESS:

-2014 NAILE National Dorset Shows: Mark lunghuhn attended the Sheep Committee Meeting in early March. A couple of motions were made at the meeting, that are going to enforce that animals must show as entered, no subs maybe made out of class, and switching between slick and fitted classes will not be permitted; checking in registration papers need to be done before 5 pm on day before the show and armbands need to be worn. There were 1445 market lambs, 1688 junior breeding sheep entries and 2700 open show entries. In addition to inviting back Tim Fleener and Tor Sorenson for the junior show it was voted to ask Mark Johnson and Matt Scramlin to judge breeding sheep classes, Stacy Scramlin to judge breeding sheep showmanship and Stacy Taylor to judge market lamb showmanship. Clint Cummings was first choice to judge the market lamb show. For the Open Polled Show first choice was Eric Bruns and for the Open Horned Show Steve Myers. -2015 CDC Director Elections: Great Lakes and New England will be electing directors next winter. Nominating committees will need to be made known to the office for announcement in the 2015 fall newsletter. Both current directors are eligible to run again.

*Great Plains – Tulsa State Fair, OK <u>-2015 Annual Meeting & National Sale:</u> The 2015 Annual Meeting & National Dorset Sale will be held in conjunction with the Midwest Stud Ram Sale from June 22-27, 2015. The board will still like to schedule the annual board meeting for Thursday of that week and the membership meeting for Friday morning.

-Election of 2014-2015 Officers: Coulter Passwaters nominated Johnnie Johnson as President and Mark lunghuhn as Vice President. Jeff Poynter seconded. -Dorset Futurity: Coulter Passwaters reported that earlier today there were 38 polled and 23 horned ewe lambs nominated for the futurity program which was almost 100% of the ewe lambs shown. Thank-you to the breeders for their continued support. Coulter also announced that Online Sales are eligible for the futurity program as long as they meet the Online Sale Policy that was approved at the board meeting and that there is a separate division for 'Dorset Advantage" ewe lambs. -Breed Standard Education/Certified Judges List: Jeff Poynter reported that Matt Scramlin and Michael Pope were added to the Certified Judges list. Jeff also reported that the Breed Standard Manual has been

posted online on the CDC website. We are still looking for missing pictures or improved trait pictures. If you have any please forward to the CDC Office. Once all of the pictures have been completed, the CDC will look into printing a hard copy of the manual. Thank-you to Melanie Barkley for all her work in developing this manual. without her help it would of not been possible. The manual will be emailed to the judges on the certified judges list that have current emails on file with the CDC office. -Production Dorset Committee: Mark lunghuhn reported that the new registration papers now will print EBV production data is submitted with registrations and encouraged breeders to participate in the NSIP program.

-Junior Dorset Ewe Purchase Grants: Johnnie Johnson announced the 2014 winners: junior division Noah Collins and senior division Jarrod Alspaugh, Noah is actually attending the Ohio Dorset Sale looking for his ewe to purchase. OLD BUSINESS:

-Registry Program Update: Deb Hopkins reported that the new registry program is up and running. Registration papers have been redesigned a bit and the new program has a lot of new features. It is the property of the CDC so the CDC is looking into copyrighting it and possibly selling the program to other breeds in the future. -Dorset Advantage Program Update: Casey Sidwell reported that the Dorset Advantage registry is up and running and the CDC office has already registered some eligible animals. Classes for "Dorset Advantage " sheep will be incorporated into the All American, Louisville Junior Show and at as many regional junior Dorset shows as possible, as soon as possible.

<u>-CDC New Class Recommendations:</u> Casey Sidwell reported that the CDC has accepted a new CDC Recommended Classes for Fairs & Expositions as follows: *Breeding Sheep*:

-Yearlings -Early Fall Lambs (born 9/1-9/30) -Late Fall Lambs (born 10/1-11/30) -Winter Lambs (born 12/1-1/31) -Spring Lambs (born 2/1 & later) *Presentation can either be fitted or slick shorn, or both shown together. *Lamb classes can be combined with beginning and ending breakoff dates remaining the same (ie. Early Fall/Late Fall Lamb Class born 9/1-11/30). Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage: -Yearlings

-Fall Lambs (born 9/1-11/30) -Winter Lambs (born 12/1-1/31) -Spring Lambs (born 2/1 and later; if numbers warrant spring class can be sub-divided into February, March, April & Later) *Presentation slick shorn.

*Classes can be combined with beginning and ending breakoff dates remaining the same.

The major change for breeding sheep is that the Winter class extends through the end of January and the Spring lamb class starts February 1, making this break the same for all purebred Dorset show sheep. For Dorset Wether Sires & Dams is instituting specific classes for that type of purebred show sheep and to add new classes for "Dorset Advantage" females. **NEW BUSINESS:**

-2014 Regional Junior Show Sites: Each director got up and announced the date and site of their regional junior show: -2014 NAILE National Dorset Shows: Deb Hopkins reported that the judges elected by the exhibitors for the Polled Dorset Show were first choice Eric Bruns and for the Horned Dorset show first judge choice was Steve Myers. The Junior Show went to the four ring system and the show did get completed earlier. The national sale rotation is: 2015 will be at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale and 2016 will be at the Illinois Dorset Sale in Bloomington, IL. DAVE HARMANN

Saint Paris, OH (from Wisconsin, via Woodbury CT, Sherburne VT, Lafayette IN and

Powell, OH)

Dave Harmann has been involved in the Dorset breed since the late 1960's and early 1970's when the Harmann family had started a small flock of Dorsets to complement the Van Vleck Farm Hampshire flock in Woodbury, CT, of which Dave was shepherd and outright owner after owner Natalie Van Vleck's passing. Dave was also a great asset and partner to the Univ. of Conn sheep flocks as he hauled their sheep all around the country to many sales and shows.


When the Green Mountain flock was purchased by Skip Sheldon in Sherburne. VT from Rick & Jean Beck. Dave went to professionally shepherd the flock in 1990. Dave was there for seven years working with fellow flock tenders Tom Kelly, Sara Kuykendall and Kyle Thayer, as Skip Sheldon also had an influential Suffolk flock and developing Texel flock. When the Dorset flock was sold to Mithoefer Dorsets in Lafayette, IN, Dave went with the flock as shepherd. Under Dave's watch, the Mithoefer flock became a nationally recognized flock that staved competitive long after Dave's departure in 2001. When Dave left Mithoefer Dorsets, he accepted a job from Riverwood Farms in Powell, OH and for the next ten years helped to expand the Riverwood Flock into a dominating flock that excelled at the top of the Dorset breed.

Throughout his years of involvement with Dorset breeding programs, Dave also became a sought after judge for many major sheep events including National Shows as his opinion is obviously highly respected by many breeders throughout the sheep industry. Dave "officially" retired in 2011 and now resides in Saint Paris, OH near his daughter Holly and her family, keeping watch on their current livestock projects. Dave and his wife Kathie, also never miss a major sheep event, keeping caught up on all the current sheep happenings and visiting with the many friends they have made in the purebred sheep industry over the years.

Even though it has been

many years since Dave actually owned a Dorset himself, he has been a major influence on the Dorset genetics of the past 40 years by making major management decisions for three very influential Dorset breeding sheep flocks. But besides his expertise in sheep genetics and management, one of Dave's greatest attributes has been his mentoring of young people in the purebred sheep industry, starting out with his own children, Wendy, Bobby & Holly; some New England Sheep kids Don & Deb Hopkins, Sara Kuykendall, Kyle Thayer; working side by side with a couple of Ohio shepherds Eric Bruns and Jeremy Etzler; and most recently working with the next generation of Dorset breeders like Michael Pope and Cruz & Trent Nichols.

Dave Harmann is very worthy for induction into the Dorset Hall of Fame for all his contributions to the breed both from the sheep side of things as well as the people side.



ROGER HUNTRODS Collins, Iowa Roger Huntrods of Collins, Iowa has been raising and registering Dorset sheep for over 50 years. He purchased his first Dorset ewes from Leonard Stewart in Kansas, in 1963. He had been using Dorset rams prior to that, but was crossing them on blackface ewes. The Huntrods operation regularly sustained around 100 to 150 head of Dorset brood ewes. At times that number stretched closer to 200 head.

Roger has maintained a strong and loyal customer base of Midwest farm flock producers that were repeat purchasers of his commercial rams for decades. He was also a long time member and leader on the board of the lowa Ram Test Association.

Through the years, the Huntrods family also regularly exhibited their Dorsets at the Iowa State Fair and other local shows. When the demand for extra frame size increased in the show ring in the seventies and eighties, Roger chose not to follow the trend. He continued to raise the kind of muscular, productive sheep that both he and his customers preferred. As a result, when other breeders began to focus on raising Dorsets strictly to produce club lambs, the Huntrods genetics caught additional attention. Not only did Roger's own wethers garner wins in market lamb shows across the country, but his bloodlines are found in the pedigrees of many of the elite wether type flocks across the nation. All the while, Roger continued to provide his multitude of commercial buyers with functional, production oriented rams.


Roger has been a top ten registrar of purebred Dorset sheep for several years registering over 1,000 head of Dorsets from 2000 until 2012, at which time Roger split up his brood ewe flock among his two sons: Bob operating as "Huntrods Dorsets" and Mark operating as "Huntrods Club Lambs". In those same 12 years, Roger sold and transferred 781 head of Dorset sheep.

Congratulations to Roger and his family on this award, as it is a very well deserved recognition from the Dorset breed. Roger and his family will be receiving his award this summer at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale.



Weaning Practices to Limit Stress to **Ewes and Lambs**

Ewes baaing, lambs crying, and shepherds wishing for quiet: these are all signs that weaning is commencing. However, some of that baaing and crying can be minimized if shepherds take a few simple steps to prepare for weaning. And, this can limit the stress to both ewes and lambs in the flock.

Weaning practices should start at least two weeks prior to the actual weaning process. By weaning, I am talking about separating the ewes from their lambs. Lambs should be started on some sort of solid feed at least two weeks before weaning so that they are adapted to living on their own. In addition, lambs should also be accustomed to drinking water. Solid feed often comes in the form of a high protein grain mix, but could also mean highly palatable and high protein hay.

Weaning can occur in a number of different ways. Some producers like to wean early to take advantage of a lamb's ability to more efficiently turn grain and hay or pasture into pounds of gain. It is more efficient to feed the lamb directly than to feed a ewe that produces milk that a lamb consumes. Early weaning generally takes place when lambs are 60 days old.

Lambs should weigh at least 45 pounds at this time.

Most ewes peak in their milk production around three to four weeks after the lambs are born. After that point, milk production decreases rapidly. Therefore, lambs should have plenty of grain and/or hay to eat by that point in time to get them adjusted over to eating solid feeds.

Some producers will wean earlier to accommodate situations such as drought or the desire to breed back ewes more guickly. Earlier weaning may take place when lambs are just 30 to 45 days old. This can be challenging for drying off ewes at this time though. Lambs that are raised

on milk replacer are often weaned at these early ages. On the other hand, some producers prefer a natural weaning method where lambs stay on pasture with their mothers until they are four to six months old. This greatly decreases the stress of weaning for both the ewes and lambs, but can also mean lower weight gains in lambs.

When weaning, producers should prepare the ewes several days prior to the planned weaning date. Start by removing any grain from the diet of the ewes. And, switch to a lower quality hay. This abrupt drop in protein and energy levels will cause the ewe to decrease milk production. Some producers will also limit water for 24 hours after weaning, but ewes that are weaned from 60 day old lambs or older don't necessarily need water withheld unless they are heavy milkers.

Lambs should have all their vaccinations prior to lambing. Lambs should receive their first vaccination shot within the first month after they are born. A booster vaccination should be given three to four weeks later. Deworming, castration and tagging should also be completed well ahead of weaning as all these practices cause additional stress to the lambs at weaning. If unable to perform these tasks prior to weaning, producers should wait until several weeks after weaning when lambs are well adjusted to living without their mothers. Watch lambs closely for any signs of health problems for several weeks after weaning. This includes health problems such as pneumonia, scours, and coccidiosis.

To decrease stress to the lambs, move the ewes to another location rather than move the lambs.

> The lambs should remain in the pen where they were raised because they are familiar with the surroundings and know where to find feed and water. This results in less decrease in feed and water consumption and thus less weight loss in the lambs in the first few days after weaning.

Ewes should remain on the lower quality hay until their udders begin to shrink and dry off. For the first few days after weaning, be sure to look for any signs of exceptional swelling or redness. This can be a sign that mastitis is present and will need treated. If a ewe is very uncomfortable, some milk can be removed from the udder to lessen the

pressure. Never remove all the milk



NSIP's business is calculating EBVs for sheep producers and breed associations and helping producers use those EBVs to their best ad-

vantage. EBVs are statistically created based on generations of progeny performance for various traits. EBVs are one of the most accurate tools to select for or against genetically superior or inferior sheep based on traits of interest.

In June, 2010 National Sheep Improvement Program (NSIP) finalized the details of a cooperative agreement between the National Sheep Improvement Program and Meat & Livestock Australia (MLA). This agreement will transfer the genetic evaluation of sheep in NSIP from Virginia Polytechnic Institute by Dr David Notter to LambPlan, the national sheep performance program of Australia.

Australian sheep producers, academia and the sheep industry have invested in software and database technology that is much more powerful than those previously in use by NSIP. Access to this technology allows the U.S. sheep industry to perform genetic evaluations to generate estimated breeding values (EBVs) every two weeks. Data submission is done online through Lamb-Plan's Pedigree Wizard (PW). The Lamb-Plan system NSIP will utilize is also set up to perform genetic evaluations for carcass traits and parasite resistance, traits previously only available to one breed each (carcass trait for Suffolk & parasite resistance for Katahdin) in NSIP. Genetic evaluation of U.S. flocks will use breed specific genetic parameters and adjustment factors developed for each of the U.S. breeds. These are just a few of the highlights.

This agreement between MLA & NSIP is a step to the future. This is a winwin for both sheep producers in the USA and Australia. It provides unprecedented cooperation between two countries to offer better service to sheep producers in both the U.S and Australia. The agreement includes a framework for the cooperation of U.S. and Australian sheep geneticists to develop improved analyses for across breed EBVs, crossbred lambs, maternal performance, parasite resistance and other traits. The NSIP Board of Directors is looking forward to implementation of new selection indices that include classic EBV analysis and new genetic markers contributed by sheep genomic research.

The NSIP enrollment form is available at the nsip.org web site. Additionally, you can go to the NSIP Info tab and click on Enrollment. Also posted under the

NSIP Info tab is additional information regarding Pedigree Wizard based on firsttime users experiences. We will all be learning this program together. As we acquire more tools of learning, they will be posted.

With the new development of the CDC's own registry program EBV's can now be printed on registration papers. All a breeder needs to do is submit the EBV report you received back from NSIP in excel format. The CDC is able to input this data into the program and it will print out on the registration program. The CDC is providing the service of putting the original data on your papers at no additional charge to encourage our production oriented breeders to add this performance information to their registration papers, and to make this information available to their buyers.

The EBV's that will be printed on the registration papers are: Birth Weight, Wean Weight, Maternal Wean Weight, Post Weaning Weight, Yearling Weight, Post Weaning Fat Depth, Post Weaning Eye Muscle Depth, Number of Lambs Born, and Number of Lambs Weaned.

Producers have asked about updating data, which also can be done if new data is submitted. New papers can be printed out on already registered animals with the updated information at \$1.00 per paper to cover the cost of new papers.

NEW CDC RECOMMENDED CLASS DIVISIONS

The CDC has revised and updated the class division recommendations for Dorsets at shows and sales. These changes have been submitted to major fairs and expositions. These new classes will be implemented in CDC sponsored events as soon as possible on the national level and at regional junior shows as well. Total implementation of these classes will depend on fair policies, exhibitor input, regional needs and timing of publication of fair premium books. Check with your local fair to see if any changes have been made for 2014 events. They WILL NOT be in Louisville this year as their executive committee rejected the changes but the CDC will try again next year.

The major change for breeding sheep is that the Winter class extends through to Jan 31st and the Spring lamb class starts Feb. 1, making this break the same for all purebred Dorset show sheep. For Dorset Wether Sires & Dams it is instituting specific classes for that type of purebred show sheep and to add new classes for "Dorset Advantage" females. Details are outlined in the CDC Annual Meeting minutes. The CDC trying to incorporate separate classes for Dorset Wether Sires & Dams so this type of purebred and registered Dorset can be evaluated for thier purpose.





REGIONAL JUNIOR SHOW ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Following are the eligibility requirements for the Regional Junior Dorset Shows for your information:

1) Exhibitor must be a current member of the CDC whether in the youth enrollment program or as a lifetime member.

2) Exhibitor needs to be 21 years old or younger as of January 1st of the current year. There is no lower age limit but the exhibitor must be able to lead

and/or control the head of his/her animal in the show ring.

3) Exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless physically impaired. The junior owner will need to be at the head of the animal controlling it in the show ring, unless of course they have more than one entry in a class in which case another junior exhibitor showing their second animal is acceptable.

4) Sheep must be registered in the youth's name. Youth partnerships are acceptable except for futurity animals which must be in the individual youth owner's name ONLY. Farm names or continued on page 18

family" ownerships are not acceptable.

5) Exhibitor can show at an unlimited number of regional junior shows per year, the CDC does prefer they at least show at the regional show in which they reside if possible.

7) **EWE FUTURITY PROGRAM:** Your futurity ewe can earn double points at a regional junior show for the futurity ewe program. If you show at more than one regional show only your top point total will be doubled.

Regional junior shows are sometimes held in conjunction with existing shows so there definitely may be other show specific rules and regulations that apply. Please be aware of these additional requirements when making out your entries to these special shows.

2014 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION AVAILABLE ON-LINE

The National Junior Dorset Association annually presents up to three \$1000 scholarships. To qualify, a student must be completing at least half of his or her college or technical school studies the year in which the application is made or be enrolled in graduate school.

These awards are available to current and previous members of the Continental Dorset Club Youth Enrollment Program or current lifetime members of the Continental Dorset Club. Applicants may be majoring or specializing in any type of field as these awards are not limited to agricultural majors.

The application must be postmarked **September 1, 2014.** Two letters of recommendation must be enclosed with the application. The individual completing the recommendation may return it to you in a sealed envelope, which has been signed over the flap. Send applications to:




