## 2015 NATIONAL SALE: VERY SUCCESSFUL VENTURE FOR THE DORSET BREED

The 2015 National Dorset Sale held in conjunction with the Midwest Stud Ram Sale in Sedalia, MO from June 24-26 was a very successful venture for the Dorset breed. This was the first year for the sale being managed by the Heartland Group and they added a live videostreaming of the national shows to their service. It proved to be a great addition to the sale as folks who could not attend in person could watch the show to get an idea of the quality of sheep that were being offered to make online bidding easier to navigate through on sale day.

For the first time at a National Dorset Sale, "Dorset Advantage" rams and ewes had their own division and were offered for sale. Below is a picture of the Grand Champion Dorset Advantage ewe from Slack Club Lambs in Indiana. For an inaugural



showing the breeders offered 17 quality head that sold for an average of \$635.29.

The Dorset Wether Sires and Dam had another strong sale with 94 head sold averaging \$1053. The Midwest Sale has become the top consignment sale to sell these type of Dorset breeding sheep at. The CDC Board has voted to designate this as the National

Dorset Wether Sire & Dam Sale for 2016 to encourage the continued success of this sale and to encourage breeders to keep bringing their best prospects to the sale.

The Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding sheep sales were smaller in numbers than it has been in the past but the quality of sheep offered was excellant for this seasonally late National Sale. The Champion Polled Dorset Ewe from Lauden Acres, Dalmatia, PA went onto to be Supreme Champion Breeding Ewe of the Sale and then garnered a record selling price for a Dorset female at public auction selling for \$17,000 to Olivia Waggoner of East Berlin, PA. There certainly was a lot of admirers of this ewe and she ended up bringing this top dollar. Congratulations to Lynn & Dixie Laudenslager and Tim Hall of Lauden Acres for this great

accomplishment! To the right is a picture of their Champion Ewe right after she was named as breed champion by judge Mark Johnson.

of Polled Dorset breeding sheep offered still garnished a very strong \$963 average. The Horned Dorset breeding sheep also did very well as 24 head sold for an average of \$558.33. Complete sales results along with more photos of the winners can be found later in this newsletter on page 32-37.

Also, at the Annual Meeting retiring CDC Vice President and Great Lakes Director Mark lunghuhn was presented with his retirement plaque, thank-you Mark for your thee years of great service!

Thank-you to the donators and bidders!

Following are the complete minutes form the 2015 CDC Annual Board and CDC Annual Membership Meetings held in Sedalia:

#### CONTINENTAL DORSET CLUB 2015 ANNUAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS JUNE 24, 2015 SEDALIA, MO

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Vice President Mark lunghuhn. Director Casey Sidwell and Director Elect Michael Pope were in attendance. Johnnie Johnson, Dick Reece, Mike Wright and Coulter Passwaters were on the telephone. CDC Exec. Sec./Treas. Deb Hopkins was also present.

- -Secretary Minutes: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the minutes from the 2014 CDC Fall-Teleconference Meeting held December 4, 2014 and the 2015 Special Board Meeting Tele-Conference Meeting held February 11, 2015. Mike Wright moved to accept the minutes as written. Casey Sidwell seconded. Motion passed.
- **-Treasurer's Report:** Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal

2014-2015 year to date as of June 16, 2015. Total income is \$63,099.62, total expenses is \$64,642.17 for a current net cash loss of \$1,542.55. Account balances: Checking Account: \$17,760.99; Savings Account: \$25.00; CD: \$25,875.74; Money Market: \$10,109.49; Junior Association \$32,760.07 for total cash assets of \$86,531.29. Casey Sidwell moved to accept the treasurer's report. Johnnie Johnson seconded. Motion passed. Deb Hopkins also presented a proposed budget for 2015-2016 for the board to review as it goes through the meeting.

-CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins presented the 2014-2015 statistics to date. As of June 17, 2015: 3,698 head have been registered and 1,809 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 107 head from the same period last year and the transfers are down 242 head from the same period last year. In the Dorset Advantage registry, 136 head have been registered to date and 61 head have been transferred. This is above the total of 119 head registered last year and almost the same as 65 head total were transferred, so that registry is definitely on the rise.

-Correspondence: Deb Hopkins had received a letter of thanks from Warren Squires and a phone call of thanks from Dick Kuzemchak for their recent induction at Ohio Dorset Sale into the Dorset Hall of Fame. Mike Squires also wrote the board thanking them for their consideration of proposals presented at the last meeting and the implementation of the first time Dorset showmen mementos at the All American and NAILE Jr. Dorset Shows.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins reported that number of nominations has decreased due to less ewe lambs entries at consignment sales but thanked the Dorset breeders for nominating ewe lambs in their online sales as this has helped the number nominated for junior buyers to purchase. 24 polled ewe lambs were nominated at the National Sale in Sedalia bringing the total up to 101 polled ewe lambs nominated and 12 horned ewe lambs were nominated bringing that total up to 47 horned ewe lambs nominated. Unfortunately, we can't seem to get breeders of Dorset wethers dams and Dorset Advantage ewe lambs to nominate as there is a separate division for Dorset Advantage offered and the purebred Dorset wether dams can be very competitive on their own in their classes. Need to encourage their participation. There were 11 yearling ewes re-nominated for the 2015 Yearling Ewe Futurity program.

**-Breed Standard Education:** There have been no new names nominated to the certified judges list since the last meeting.

-Production Dorset Committee: Deb Hopkins reported that only three breeders have taken advantage of getting their NSIP performance data onto their registration papers but she is trying to get the word out so more will take advantage of the free service. Deb also presented their concern over the increase in transfer costs and how that can be cost prohibitive to breeders. Maybe the board could look at a discount on volume transfers.

-Dorset Youth Grant Program: Casey Sidwell reported that the program had 20 applicants and she would like to increase the number given, and she would like to re-do the application and come up with a definite scoring system for the committee. These applicants are very good and she would like the judging to be more standardized to make selection easier. She will re-do and get to Debbie for publication. The possibility of the NJDA sponsoring one grant along with the CDC doing two annually was discussed. Deb Hopkins will put it on their agenda for their annual meeting in November.

-Newsletter and Website: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2015 winter newsletter had great advertising support and netted an income of \$1,034.13. This special issue was sent to all buyers of Dorset sheep the previous year whether they were CDC members or not. The 2015 Spring/Summer didn't fair quite as well as a loss of \$458.00 occurred. The advertising for this issue was competing with the new 2015-2016 Dorset Breeder's directory, which was redone this past May and was very well supported by all kinds of Dorset breeders. The web page has been updated as soon as possible to keep everyone current with happenings thanks to Frank Tiffany's great

**-Dorset Hall of Fame:** The CDC recognized Warren Squires and Dick Kuzemchak at the Ohio Dorset Sale and will be recognizing the third member of the 2015 class, Dave Birch, at the annual meeting Friday morning.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2015 All-American Junior Show will be July 3-5, 2015 at the Eastern States Exposition Fairgrounds, West Springfield, MA. The Dorset exhibitors and their families will once again have a lunch on Saturday sponsored by the Junior Dorset Association. Kyle Thayer will be judging the Horned & Polled Dorsets and Nick Miniter will be doing the Dorset Advantage. Deb would also like to

Dorsets for their ewe lamb donations. along with all the breeders that signed up for class sponsorships. We have raised \$2680 to contribute to the All American Dorset Shows. Casey Sidwell moved to contribute \$2680 to the 2015 All American. Mike Wright seconded. Motion carried. -National Junior Association: The junior association is planning on having an informal meeting and BBQ lunch at the All-American and their Annual Meeting will be in Louisville in November. They are hosting an adult showmanship class at the All American to raise funds for the National Junior Breed Associations that are participating in the show. The scholarship application has been updated for the 2015 applicants.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

-CDC Registry Program: Deb Hopkins reported that she has not been able to come up with a contract for doing other breed's registry work at this time. The CDC did sell the program to the American Southdown Breeders Association this past winter and that contract has been drafted and signed. Suggestions were made for terms on a registration service contract and Deb will try to develop for next board meeting.

-NSA Partnership: nothing to report at this time

#### -2015-2016 Dorset Breeders Directory:

The new directories were mailed out to the membership mid-June and they are available here at the sale.

- -Dorset Advantage Registry: Discussion followed on the intention of the registry, as correspondence has been received from breeders about the issue, and that was always to have one parent a purebred registered Dorset to keep the Dorset genetics in the fore front. The board thanked the Midwest Sale for incorporating them in the sale, having ram classes and the CDC will further try to promote Dorset Advantage classes into major shows. Breeders need to do the same. Next step may be to develop a breed standard for them to be evaluated by in the show ring.
- -Informative Breeder Survey: A breeder survey was discussed at the last board meeting to see if one needed to get done. After discussion the board decided not to go ahead with one at this time.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

-2015 NAILE National Dorset Shows:
Deb Hopkins reported that she did attend the NAILE spring meeting and there is going to be an extended junior show to ease scheduling on that busy weekend.
The judge selections have been submitted The Dorset shows class changes submit-

The judge selections have been submitted. The Dorset shows class changes submitted were rejected once again by the executive committee. Hopefully third time will be the charm next year so we can get spe-

cific dorset wether sire and dam classes in along with Dorset Advantage.

-2016 CDC Director Elections: Western & Great Plains will be electing directors next winter. Nominating committees will need to be made known to the office for announcement in the 2015 fall newsletter. Both current directors have completed their second terms so new directors will need to be elected.

**-2016 Regional Junior Show Sites:** The regional show junior tentative show sites for 2016 are:

- -Great Lakes Ohio State Fair in August -New England - Northeast Youth Sheep Show in July
- -North Central Moultrie Douglas County Fair in July
- -West California State Fair in July -East – KILE, Harrisburg, PA in October -Great Plains – Tulsa State Fair, OK in October

#### -2016 Annual Meeting & National Sale:

The 2016 Annual Meeting & National Dorset Sale will be held in conjunction with the Illinois Dorset Sale, two weeks after the Ohio Dorset Sale. Same format as the last time. The National Sale rotation was discussed. Coulter Passwaters moved to take Reno out of the National Sale rotation. Casey Sidwell seconded. Motion carried. Johnny Johnson moved to have the National Dorset Wether Sire & Dam Sale at Sedalia in 2016. Coulter Passwaters seconded. Motion carried. Dick Reece moved to split the Polled Dorset Yearling ewe class into fall and spring born at Sedalia every year. Mike Wright seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins will notify Sale Management of the new changes. -Executive Secretary's Salary: Mark

- Iunghuhn appointed the committee of Johnnie Johnson, Casey Sidwell and Coulter Passwaters to analyze the CDC financial situation and bring a proposal to the fall board meeting.

Total income is \$63,099.62, total expenses is \$64,642.17 for a current net cash loss of \$1,542.55. Account balances - Checking Account: \$17,760.99; Savings Account: \$25.00; CD: \$25,875.74; Money Market: \$10,109.49; Junior Association \$32,760.07 for total cash assets of \$86,531.29. Steve Myers moved to accept the treasurer report as presented. Mike Galleher seconded. Motion carried.

Deb Hopkins presented the 2014-2015 statistics to date. As of June 17, 2015: 3,698 head have been registered and 1,809 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 107 head from the same period last year and the transfers are down 242 head from the same period last year. In the Dorset Advantage registry, 136 head have been registered to date and 61 head have been transferred. This is above the total of 119 head registered last year and almost the same as 65 head total

were transferred, so that registry is definitely on the rise.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

- -Futurity: Casey Sidwell reported that 101 Polled Ewe Lambs, 47 Horned Ewe Lambs and 11 Yearling Ewes have been nominated for the 2015 Futurity Program. This includes the online sale nominations. Thank-you to the breeders for their continued support. Casey encouraged the junior owners to get their futurity point forms in within 21 days of the shows.
- -Breed Standard Education/Certified Judges List: Casey Sidwell reported there were no new names approved for the Certified Dorset judges list and she encouraged folks to submit names of judges in their area they see doing a good job of evaluating Dorset sheep.
- -Junior Dorset Ewe Purchase Grants: Casey Sidwell announced the 2015 winners: junior division Jenna Eilts, Minouk, IL and senior division Stephen Campbell, Blairsville, PA. The program had 20 very qualified applicants to choose from and encouraged youth to apply again this fall. The committee would like to expand the grants to three awarded instead of two due to the great participation in the program.
- -Production Dorset Committee: Mark lunghuhn reported that the new registration papers now will print EBV production data is submitted with registrations and encouraged breeders to participate in the NSIP program.
- -National Junior Dorset Association:
  NJDA President Tyler Myers reported that the junior association is planning on having an informal meeting and BBQ lunch at the All-American in Massachusetts along with hosting the Adult Showmanship Challenge Fundraiser to be held with the show. Tyler encouraged college attending students to apply for the NJDA Tracy Repasky Scholarships. The NJDA annual meeting will be held at NAILE this fall where the scholarships will be presented. Retired NDJA North Central director Klarissa Minish reported on the Midwest Preview Junior Show.
- -Newsletter and Website: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2015 winter newsletter had great advertising support and netted an income of \$1,034.13. This special issue was sent to all buyers of Dorset sheep the previous year whether they were CDC members or not. The 2015 Spring/Summer newsletter did have a loss of \$458 but it was competing against the new CDC Breeders Directory advertising deadline. The 2015-2016 CDC Breeders directory is now available and has been mailed out to all current CDC members both adult and

juniors. The web page has been updated as soon as possible to keep everyone current with happenings thanks to Frank Tiffany's great service once again.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2015 All-American Junior Show will be July 3-5, 2015 at the Eastern States Exposition Fairgrounds, West Springfield, MA. Kyle Thayer will be judging the Polled & Horned Dorsets and Nick Miniter will be evaluating the Dorset Advantage. Thank-you to Purple Ribbon Farms and Cassell Horned Dorsets for donating ewe lambs that were sold to go towards the shows. Also, thank-you to those who have signed up to sponsor classes and a few slots are still available for sponsorship. This year's show will feature the 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament being played at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame and a Saturday night fun night and chicken BBQ.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

-Dorset Advantage Program Update: Casey Sidwell reported that the Dorset Advantage registry is growing and registry numbers have almost doubled. She reminded folks that rams can now be registered as they are being offered in their own separate division here at the National Sale in Sedalia. She also reminded breeders that this is not a "breed-up" registry to becoming eligible for purebred status but a registry where animals always require one of its parents to be a purebred, registered Dorset to encourage the Dorset genetics in the product. Classes for "Dorset Advantage "sheep have been incorporated into the All American and several Regional Junior Dorset Shows, and she encourages breeders to get classes into their major shows where Dorset Advantage animals are present. The CDC last year sent out a letter to major fairs and expositions expressing the guidelines for the new Dorset and Dorset Advantage classes.

onded. Motion carried by 2/3 vote with 17 approved and 0 opposed.

#### -2015 NAILE National Dorset Shows:

Deb Hopkins reported that the judges elected by the exhibitors for the Polled Dorset Show were first choice Evan Snyder and for the Horned Dorset show first judge choice was Judy Moore. She has not received back any confirmation on these judges yet. It was proposed to expand the junior show weekend to start earlier to ease tight scheduling on the weekend. The CDC proposed a set of new Dorset classes to include "Dorset Advantage" but they were declined by the NAILE executive committee once again.

## 2015 DORSET HALL OF FAME CLASS



#### **DICK KUZEMCHAK**

Richard (Dick) Kuzemchak has been a life-long breeder from the time he talked his family into letting him raise sheep on the family farm in Indiana County Pennsylvania. His focus narrowed as a student at Penn State University, working at the sheep barns under the tutorage of Carol Shaffner, to devoting his career as the shepherd for the University for 38 years.

Dorset sheep were the primary purebred breed at Penn State for many years. Dick's career involved not only the day to day care of these sheep but the decisions of which ewes and rams to use in their breeding program. He developed a Dorset that would not only win in the show ring but also provided a good carcass for the commercial producer. These sheep became the foundation of many Dorset flocks. As important as the sheep that Dick produced, is the time and energy that he spent teaching students about sheep and the industry. Many of these students continue to be active in the sheep industry as adults.

After retirement at Penn State, Dick continues to be active in the Dorset industry as a judge and flock consultant. Over the years he has been a consultant for many major Pennsylvania Dorset flocks; helping with the management, care, showing and breeding decisions. Currently Dick is serving as flock consultant for Lauden Acres and Pine Ridge Dorsets. His influence can be seen in the sheep of many Pennsylvania flocks.

Dick has helped shape the Dorset breed as well as taught many

of us to become more knowledgeable producers. Because of him we are better shepherds as he is a firm believer that we should all keep an open mind as even a seasoned shepherd can learn something new.

Dick's nomination was submitted by Joanne Evans, a Dorset production breeder form PA and Laurie Hubbard, who work with Dick for many years at Penn State. Thank-you ladies.



#### **WARREN SQUIRES**

Warren Squires bought his first Horned Dorset sheep from Roy Galleher in 1942 paying \$35 and \$27.50 each for two bred ewes. The Gallehers bought back a ram lamb from one of the ewes for \$50 the next year. Warren bought ewes from some of the premier Dorset breeders of the day, Ben Willets and Harry McCabe, to establish his flock. He bought his first stud ram from another master breeder, Jake Hooks.

Warren was President of the Continental Dorset Club in 1954, the year Polled Dorsets were accepted into the association. He asked only asked one person, Alex McKenzie of Oklahoma, to speak in favor of adding Polled Dorsets to the association at the annual meeting. The Polled Dorsets were accepted by a landslide vote into the association. Subsequently, Warren turned down the chance to get one of the first Polled Dorset rams offered by NCSU. However, he did judge their 3rd show held in Raleigh, NC.

Warren went on to exhibit

many champions and judge at most of the county fairs in Ohio, several state fairs, and both the Chicago International and NAILE. He met his wife, Marilyn, at KILE in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. They were married in 1960 after a 5-year courtship at this sheep show.

During the 1960's, Warren and Marilyn finally sold their Horned Dorset flock to the University of Florida to concentrate on the Polled Dorsets. For the next twenty years, they marketed sheep through the many sales including the Eastern Stud Ram Sale, Keystone Sale, Oklahoma Black & White Sale, and the Midwest Stud Ram Sale. To date, Warren has sold Dorset sheep into 42 states and Canada.

In 1960, Warren & Marilyn along with several other Ohio breeders organized the Ohio Dorset Sale. Marilyn served as the first sale manager for no pay to launch this fledgling Dorset sale. The sale was held in Mt Gilead, Ohio through the early years. Many out of state consignors stayed in the Squires "hotel", our big house in Chesterville, including George Hunter, Curtis Mast, Oren & Newt Wright. Warren was particularly proud of the many rams he sold to commercial sheep people over the years. He always had a pen of rams by the door to the wool room since he was a wool buyer for many years. Many commercial sheep people would come to sell their wool and end up buying a Dorset ram.

One of the most interesting sales was several groups of ewes to Case Western Reserve University. The selling point was Marilyn's impeccable records since the sheep were used for medical research. The ewes producing twins were used multiple times to pioneer the field of fetal surgery.

The Polled Dorset flock was dispersed in the mid 1980's to once again concentrate on the Horned Dorsets. Marilyn called this their "fun time" in the Dorset business as their flock and the entire breed has grown in both quantity and quality. Warren, Marilyn, and several other breeders organized a letter writing campaign to add a Horned Dorset junior show at

NAILE. Warren continues to sponsor classes at the All-American Jr. Show as well as awards for Jr. exhibitors at the Ohio State fair.

After Marilyn passed away in 2003, Warren continued to maintain a small, select flock of Horned Dorset ewes. Stud rams are now purchased jointly with Galleher Horned Dorsets where it all began as an FFA project, 73 years ago. Warren takes care of the sheep with a little help from family and friends. One of his current advertising slogans is "Old Chester Farm-where the flock is old and the shepherd is older" since he will be celebrating his 85th birthday at the end of this month.



#### **DAVE BIRCH**

Dave started with two purebred Horned Dorset ewes from Ira P. Jones too many years ago to count, but if you do it's been 62! His passion for the breed grew as they continued to change and evolve. A solid foundation of stud ewes....great rams, solid breeding practices and exceptional integrity made Dave Birch and Birchwood Farm known Nationally and Internationally. Birchwood Farm Dorsets had many show ring class winners and topped many sale reports, but bringing out great breeding stock was not Dave's only goal. He strived to maintain the true assets of the Dorset breed....out of season breeding, exceptional mothering ability, early maturity and great cutability, as well as show ring appeal made Dorsets the smart choice for any oper-

Dave promoted the breed at every level....county, state and national. He served on the Board of Directors of the Illinois Dorset Association and Illinois Lamb & Wool Producers. He was one of several area sheep men that developed the DeKalb County Lamb & Wool Producers, as well as Dorset Country USA, Illinois Club Lamb Association and Land of Lincoln Border Collie Association. He served as President of all of

them. He was honored to represent his direct as a Board Member of the Continental Dorset Club from 1980-1986 and from 1993-1999 – serving as President 1981-1986 and Vice President from 1995-1998.

Dave started breeding and showing sheep at a young age. Continued to breed, show and lend his opinion as a judge throughout most of his adult life. The move from Illinois to Missouri in 1998 changed the direction of the operation due to circumstances beyond his control. Moving his parents to keep them close proved a problem for attending show and sales. These days, the sheep operation is mostly commercial and he raises many things, His daughter Cheri, use to say everything except pigs and chicken, until the day he brought chickens home too! But his heart is and always will be with the Dorsets.

It is an honor to induct Dave Birch of Perry, MO into the National Dorset Hall of Fame.

## Did You Prepare for Breeding Season or Have You Lost an Opportunity?

Good shepherds should be focused on good management practices, high performance sheep and meeting the needs of customers. Throughout the year you make decisions to support or improve performance, but are there areas in your operation where you are overlooking some lost opportunities? Lost opportunities are those areas that could be tweaked to further improve production or performance. Let's take a look at the breeding season to determine if there are opportunities to improve performance in that area.

A large factor that affects profitability in a sheep operation is the lamb crop. This involves anything from birth weights to growth to efficiency. Breeding season is a critical time so that we insure not only that ewes get pregnant, but that they also produce twins. We not only want high conception rates, but those conception rates need to be high during the first heat cycle.

Prior to breeding season, rams should be evaluated for breeding soundness. Start with a physical examination by evaluating both body condition and structural soundness. Rams should have a body condition score of 3 to 3.5 on a 5 point scale. Rams that are too thin will have less stamina throughout the breeding season, while fat rams may have less vigor. Either way, rams are less likely to settle ewes in the first heat cycle. They are even less likely to settle ewes in the first heat cycle if they have structural problems

and are not physically able to mount ewes. Don't forget to take a look at their feet to make sure they are free of foot rot.

Check a ram's scrotum and testicles for tone and size. Testicles should feel firm, but should not have any lumps or abscesses, which could indicate an injury or disease. Larger scrotal circumference is correlated with greater semen volume and sperm viability. Scrotal circumference also correlates to siring ewes that reach puberty earlier than ewes produced by rams with smaller scrotal circumferences.

Semen quality is also important. There should be adequate numbers of healthy sperm and cell motility should be high. This can be checked by collecting

semen and analyzing under a microscope. If you aren't willing to go through the collection process, at least use a marking method so you can monitor any repeat breedings.

What could this cost if rams aren't in top condition? If lambs gain an average of ¾ of a pound a day and it took an extra 17 days to get that ewe pregnant, you have lost 12.75 pounds per lamb right off the top (because in theory she lambed 17 days later than ewes that settle in the first heat cycle). This could be even more weight if your average daily gain is higher. Now, factor in \$2.50 as a value per pound for your weaned lambs and you have lost \$31.87 per lamb. Multiply that by the number of lambs you sell each year and you have an expensive lost opportunity!

Let's take this a step further. Suppose that ram is not in top condition for breeding and now instead of siring twins, he sires singles. The average lamb in my area at weaning can easily bring \$150. How many ewes produce lambs each year in your operation? Again, that is an expensive lost opportunity! Check out the publication "Breeding Soundness Examinations of Rams and Bucks" at

So, if your ram isn't in the best of shape, what about your ewes? Did you make sure they were in adequate body condition and were on an increasing plane of nutrition prior to and at least several weeks into breeding season? Are they able to move freely about the pasture without limping? This can affect not just your lambing percentage, but if nutrition isn't adequate throughout preg-

nancy, this could mean weak lambs at birth, lower birth weights and even a higher death loss. If lambs do survive, what effect did nutrition have on the quantity and quality of colostrum? It can be hard to put a dollar figure on this lost production, but even a 1% improvement in death loss in a small flock of 25 ewes can equal \$37.50 at weaning if lambs are worth \$150.

Are there other areas in your operation where you could improve lost opportunities? Even though it may seem very small, all these small lost opportunities can add up to a lot at the end of the year. So, take a few moments and look through your management plan to identify those areas that could be tweaked for improved production and profitability!

For open show exhibitors: In addition to sending in your entries and entry fees to the NAILE when entering the show, please don't forget to send in the matching \$10.00 per individual entry in the Open Polled and Horned Dorset shows directly to the CDC Office. This enables the CDC to provide matching funds and to guarantee at least \$10.00 per individual entry in premiums. These matching funds need to be sent to the CDC office ASAP if you haven't done so yet. They need to be paid prior to the show. Please note that junior show sheep do not have to send in matching funds unless they are staying on to be shown in the open shows.

Looking forward to seeing everyone in Louisville this year and to another great set of National Dorset Shows!

## 2015 DORSET EWE FUTURITY UPDATE

The Dorset Ewe Futurity Program has once again been active this year with point records forms coming into the CDC office. A total of \$3,725 has been raised to pay out to the participants of the Dorset futurity divisions.

We had two group nominators this year, Cassell Horned Dorsets, VA and Curtis Hewlett, KS. Thank-you to the 40 nominators for supporting this program once again! A complete list of all the breeder nominators are listed on the back cover of this newsletter. 149 ewe lambs have been nominated this year, 102 polled ewe lambs and 47 horned dorsets. Of those, 61 have been designated by their new junior owners for participation in the futurity program. To date the CDC office has received point record forms from 22 of these junior owners. The polled lamb futurity program has participation from 5 out of the 6 regions.

The CDC accepted nominations from online sales this year and a total of 46 nominations were made by breeders in online sales. 16 junior buyers picked up futurity nominated animals. Remember this next year, that even though you can not physically get to a sale, the online sales offer you an great opportunity to get a futurity nominated ewe lamb.

We also had a "Dorset Advantage" ewe lamb division but there was not any participation. As breeders of "Dorset

Advantage" ewe lambs we really need to get this word out to the junior buyers about this opportunity to earn premiums to help offset the cost of their animals.

Don't forget that you don't have to show at a regional junior show to be eligible for premiums but exhibitors are still rewarded for attending regional shows as they are awarded double points.

These point record forms need to be received in the CDC office within 21 days of the date of the show or they will not count. They also need to be signed by show management. Also, the deadline to send in Regional Point Record forms into the CDC Office is Nov. 9th.

This allows the office enough time to tabulate final regional placing before Louisville. Those regional points will carry over to your Louisville junior show placing if you are attending that show to compete for the separate Louisville premiums.

The yearling ewe division had 11 yearlings nominated. Keep sending those point record forms in on the yearling ewes. The yearling ewe futurity will also end at the National Junior Dorset Show in Louisville like the ewe lamb program.

All the regional polled ewe lamb winners will be announced and recognized at the National Junior Association Meeting on Saturday, November 14th in Louisville. So, if you are a regional winner please be on hand to receive your special recognition! Immediately after the junior shows on Sunday, November 15th, the final national placings will be announced in the polled ewe lamb, horned ewe lamb and yearling ewe futurities. Rosettes will be given out along with the breeder recognition.

The futurity points are updated on a regular basis on the CDC website to keep everyone appraised of point totals. If you have any questions please feel free to contact the CDC Office. The final update will be posted the week before Louisville.

## DORSET BREED REMEMBERS TWO PROMINENT BREEDERS -BOB HONNOLD

Dr. Robert Eugene Honnold, 81, of Carthage passed Tuesday, August 11, 2015 surrounded by family following a history of diabetes and cardiovascular disease. He was born March 11, 1934 in Sheridan, Indiana, the son of Lamar and Mable (Conaway) Honnold.

He was employed at the University of Vermont (UVM) from 1974-1990,



initially as the Associate Director of the University's Extension Service and later serving as Director of the program. During his tenure he worked diligently to secure grants and develop the Extension Service for the benefit of the University and the State of Vermont, and upon his retirement was appointed Professor Emeritus. During his years in Vermont, he was active in various youth hockey programs and was one of several individuals who established the Chittenden South Burlington Youth Hockey Association, serving several years as its President and in other capacities.

In his youth, he spent countless hours working on his family's farm and later as a teenager, bailing hay and judging in competitive livestock shows and showing sheep as part of 4H. During High School he lettered in football, was very active in drama, and a leader in livestock judging and Future Farmers of America (FFA). He graduated from Sheridan High School in 1952 and then obtained his Bachelors and Masters of Science degrees from Purdue University where he was a member of the Farm House Fraternity and honor societies Alpha Zeta, Phi Kappa Phi, and Epsilon Sigma Phi. Upon graduation, he began a life-long career with the Extension Service, working in various positions for Purdue University throughout the state of Indiana. He then went on to obtain his Doctorate degree in Education from North Carolina State University in 1970. Following graduate school he worked for the USDA Federal Extension Service in Washington, D.C.

Following retirement from UVM, he and his late wife, Malia (Dean) Honnold, moved from Vermont to Indiana and enjoyed many happy years sharing in the lives of their grandchildren and breeding and showing Honnold Polled Dorset sheep. After open heart surgery, since 2002, he logged over 10,000 miles on his stationary bike, imagining himself crisscrossing America and visiting various landmarks along the way. He was a faithful attendee of the Fletcher United Methodist Church in Carthage, and later Carthage Community Church, and appreciated regu-

lar fellowship gatherings and the opportunity to support their food bank and homeless ministries. Bob will always be remembered for his charm, his larger than life stories, and his contagious sense of humor.

He is survived by the mother of his children, Donna-Marie Edwards Armstrong of Colorado Springs, CO; children Debra (Ron) Rausch of Carthage, Denise (Jeff) Phares of McCordsville, Darla (Jerry) Nowosatko of Colorado Springs, CO, and Cary (Shelley) Honnold of Frederick, MD; 12 grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren; and cherished nieces and nephews from the Rayle, Leary, and Brown families.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his beloved wife of 38 years, Malia (Dean) Honnold, and his sister, Carolyn (Honnold) Rayle.

Clifford S. Thayer, 76, of Splendorview Farm, Cummington passed away on October 18 at Bay State Medical Center after a short illness. Cliff was born July 20, 1939 to Stanlee and Eva (Black) Thayer.

A graduate of Northampton High School and the Stockbridge School of Agriculture, Cliff married Lorena Fowles of Southampton in 1964 and spent a lifetime dedicated to building a championship flock of purebred sheep at Splendorview Farm and promoting a variety of other agricultural activities.

In 2010, the farm was recognized as a Massachusetts Century Farm, having been owned and operated by the Thayer family for over 100 years. First working at J.W. Parsons and Hatfield Farm Equipment, Cliff then worked in the livestock department at UMass and then for most of his life, for the Massachusetts Department of Agriculture as a dairy inspector, ensuring quality milk from dairy herds in a four-

county region of Western Mass. He served as a 4-H Leader of the Pioneer Valley Young Shepherds Club for 50 years and during that time influenced many youth and inspired them to be involved in agriculture.

He was a long-time sheep show superintendent of both the Cummington Fair and the 3-County Fair, as well as a trustee and animal inspector for livestock being exhibited at the Big E. In earlier years, Cliff coached little league baseball, was a volunteer firefighter and was a member of the Cummington Agricultural Commission. He was also an active member of the Hillside Agricultural Society where he served on the board of directors since 1969, the Massachusetts Farm Bureau, the Pioneer Valley Sheep Breeders Association, the New England Sheep and Wool Growers Association, the Massachusetts Fairs Association, the Hampshire County Harvest Club and the local Rod and Gun Club. He served on several Boards including for the FSA Hampshire and Hampden County Committee and the 3-County Fair, and is a trustee emeritus of the Eastern States Exposition and a past President of the Continental Dorset Club and developer of the very successful National Dorset Ewe Lamb Futurity program.

Having won multiple local, regional and national awards for his quality sheep flocks of Dorsets and Southdowns over the years, including Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor of Southdowns from Harrisburg to Louisville, Cliff was also recently elected into the Northeast Suffolk Sheep Breeder's Association Hall of Fame.

Among Cliff's favorite things were his love for country music, square dancing, the Boston Red Sox and the Patriots, deer and coon hunting, playing cards, and cheering for his children and grandchildren's athletic endeavors. He loved touring the countryside and meeting with farmer friends, attending various harvest suppers, and often had a winning raffle ticket.

Cliff is survived by his loving wife Lorie, daughters; Shawn of Cummington, Alison (and husband Fran Mason) of Worthington, Kimberley of Westfield and son Kyle (and wife Cara of Cummington.) He leaves four grandchildren who were a constant source of joy and entertainment; Samantha, Olivia, Taylor and Logan. Additionally Cliff leaves two sisters, Barbara Bergeron and Linda Belcher and their families.
