Please make sure all spaces are completed when mailed to the CDC Office or the form will be invalid. Forms need to be mailed or faxed within 21 days of the date of the show.

-Any ewe that was nominated and purchased by a junior breeder for participation in the futurity program as a ewe lamb in 2015 is eligible for the 2016 Yearling Ewe Futurity. The ewe is still eligible even if there were no point record forms turned into the CDC office or futurity premiums paid out on the ewe as a lamb.

-The current junior owner has to forward a renomination fee of \$25.00 and a completed nomination form (see below) to the CDC Office by May 1, 2016. The ewe must still be in the junior exhibitors individual name that originally purchased the ewe at the designated futurity sale. No transfer of ownership can have taken place since the original purchase.

-Junior participants can only collect premiums on ONE yearling ewe even though you can nominate up two ewes.

2015 CDC BOARD FALL TELE-CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Dick Reece at 7:32 PM EST on Thursday, December 10, 2015. Directors on-line were: Casey Sidwell, Michael Pope, Coulter Passwaters, Johnnie Johnson and Mike Wright. CDC Exec/Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins was also on-line to take minutes.

-Secretary's Report: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2015 Annual Board Meeting held June 24, 2015 in Sedalia, MO. Coulter Passwaters moved to accept the minutes as printed. Casey Sidwell seconded. Motion carried.

-Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2015 to December 2, 2015. It was reported that total income was \$10,769.02; total expenses were \$21,335.14, for a net loss for the period of \$10,566.10. Account balances were: Checking \$20,736.61, Money Market \$10,15.90, CD \$25,938.98, Dexter Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$31,971.46 for a total of \$88,787.95 on hand. Mike Wright moved to accept the treasurer's report. Johnnie Johnson seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2014-2015 fiscal records were going to the accountants for the annual tax from filing and noted that the association's bottom line was \$12,056.28 in the black due primarily to the increase in the transfer fees and sales of reg. program

-CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2015-2016 stats. 598 head have been registered to date (down 118 head from last year) and 407 head transferred (down 96 head from last year). There has also been 15 head of Dorset Advantage sheep registered and 15 head transferred in that time period. Deb Hopkins also reported the year-end stats for 2014-2015. There were 5708 head registered (up 306 head from the previous year) and transferred 2,869 head (down 128 head from the previous year). There were 236 Dorset Advantage Sheep registered (up 117 head from last year) and 137 Dorset Advantage sheep transferred (up 72 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were: 1)Iowa 708 head; 2)Indiana 560; 3)Pennsylvania 557; 4)Ohio 481; 5)Illinois 432; 6)Minnesota 386; 7)Virginia 306; 8)South Dakota 280; 9)Wisconsin 209; 10)Oklahoma 190; 11)California 182; 12)Missouri 159; 13)Nebraska 148; 14)Texas 144; 15)Kansas 138. The top

fifteen individual registrars were: 1) Paul R. Cassell, VA (Horned) 120 head; 2)Jeffrey A. Hunter, IN (Production) 112; 3)K Bar K-Ken & Kathy Soder, PA (Production) 105; 4)Thomas J. Dagel, SD (Frame, Wether & Production) 92; 5)Huntrods Dorsets, IA (Wether & Production) 87; 6) Robert L. Vander Schaaf, IA (Production) 82; 7) Virginia Tech, VA (Production) 65; 8)USDA Meat Animal Research Center, NE (Production) 63; 9)Lauden Acres, PA (Frame) 58; 10)Chad Heisdorffer, IA (Wether) 56; 11)Peter Janicki, WA (Horned) 55; 12)H.F. Sanford & Sons, MN (Frame) 54; 13)Devon Wolkow, SD (Frame) 48; 14)Spilde Brothers-Kent & Dan, WI (Frame) 47 and 15)Vermazen Dorsets, IA (Production & Wether) 46.

-Correspondence: Deb Hopkins reported that she has received many thank-you notes and letters from participants in the Louisville judging contests including the 4-H Skil-athon Contest. The CDC also received thank-you's from many All American participants, the Midwest Preview Show Junior Show and CDC special rosette participants.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins presented the final futurity standings for the 2015 program. A total of \$3,360 was paid out to 17 participants. Average payout was \$197.65. Awards and rosettes were presented to regional and national winners for an additional \$479.02. There were 102 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$2,525 in nomination fees. 45 polled ewe lambs were purchased by juniors and eligible for participation. The yearling ewe program had 11 nominations taking in \$275 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 47 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$925 in nomination fees. 16 horned ewe lambs were purchased by juniors and eligible for participation. Deb did note that there were still no participants in the Dorset Advantage Ewe Lamb division. The board suggested putting the complete set of Dorset futurity & regulations in the Winter Newsletter to remind juniors of all the potential premiums to be earned.

-Breed Standard Education: Casey Sidwell moved to include more specific language in all National Sales and Shows to state that "slick shorn sheep are to carry uniform length of wool growth that was shorn within 7 days of show, with the ONLY exceptions being on the poll, front legs below the knees and rear legs below the hocks." Coulter Passwaters seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion was raised on the development of a Dorset Advantage breed standard and scorecard for those fairs that

see them as grade sheep and should be shown as such. After comment it was decided to not address at this time. There were no new names submitted for the certified judges list. Deb asked board members to send in names of those they have seen judging that were not on the list so we could send them information to get certified.

-Newsletter/Webpage: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2015 Fall Online Edition of the newsletter was a larger issue than normal as she was able to include all 6 regional junior shows results and photos. The online newsletter had 3 ads in it and netted \$220.76 in income. Plans are underway for the 2016 Winter Issue.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2015 Massachusetts show went very well. The Polled & Horned Dorset shows were well participated in but the Dorset Advantage did suffer from the location but expect it will be up again next year in Michigan. Deb reported that the 2016 All-American will be held in East Lansing, MI at the MSU Livestock Pavilion from July 1-3, 2016. Polled Breeding Sheep, Dorset Wether Sire & Dams, Dorset Advantage and Horned Dorsets will be included. We need to get ewe lamb donators to help with the support of the show as soon as possible. Deb will once again have the sponsorship list available at the Ohio Sale and the National Sale in Illinois, publicize it directly to the breeders and send notes to donators last year for the Dorset Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage classes. 2017 All American site is still up in the air, possibly Wisconsin and 2018 will be the 25th year Anniversary of the show and it will be in Indiana.

-National Junior Dorset Association: Deb Hopkins reported they had a great meeting and it was very well attended in Louisville. The association awarded three \$1000 College Scholarships to Lauren Rizzitano, MA; Kirstie Childress, TN and Tyler Myers, OH. They also voted to financially support a third Youth Ewe Purchase Grant. The new 2015-2016 Officers are: Pres. & Western Director: Johanna DeJoria, OR; Vice Pres. & Great Lakes Director: Tyler Myers, OH; Sec/ Treas. & Eastern Director: Olivia Waggoner, PA; New England Director: Lauren Rizzitano, MA; Great Plains Director: Allison Smith, KS; North Central Director: Thomas Crome, IL and Director At-Large: Alexandra Ruwe, IL.

-Production Committee: Casey Sidwell moved to offer a volume discount of \$2.50 per head to those breeders transferring 15 or more head in one job request. Mike

Wright seconded. Motion carried. That will make it cost \$7.50 per head on a transfer under 60 days and \$12.50 per head on a transfer over 60 days.

-Dorset Youth Ewe Purchase Grant:

Casey Sidwell presented a revised 2017 application form and a scoring rubric to encourage consistent evaluation for the grant applications. The changes will include breaking it down into three age divisions and increasing the number of grants awarded to three. After review, Casey Sidwell moved to accept the revised grant application expanding it to three grants awarded as well as the proposed scoring rubric. Coulter Passwaters seconded. Motion carried. Casey Sidwell, Michael Pope and Coulter Passwaters will review this year's 17 applications and use the scoring rubric to evaluate.

-Dorset Hall of Fame: Deb Hopkins reported that she has two names already submitted. Nominations need to be in by February 1, 2016. She will re-announce deadline on the CDC Facebook page to get more nominations submitted for this year's selection.

OLD BUSINESS:

-2016 Western & Great Plains Director Elections: Deb Hopkins reported that the committee chairmen were announced in the fall newsletter. The committees have received all of their directions from the CDC office as nominees need to be sent into the office January 1st for voting in February.

-Registry Program and/or Registry Service: Deb Hopkins reported that the registry program has been sold to the Shropshire Association as their program went down this past summer. There have been other breeds interested in purchasing the program. Deb still has not come up a proposal on providing just registry service to other breeds at this time.

-Canada Scrapie Guidelines: Coulter Passwaters did just approach this topic with the USDA Under Secretary and was told that the U.S. was not doing anything different at this time.

NEW BUSINESS:

-2016 National Sale & Annual Meeting:

The National Sale for Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding Sheep will be at the Illinois Sale, Bloomington, IL on April 1-2, 2016. Dick Reece reported that the Illinois group will be hosting a barn dinner with a junior support auction Friday night and the CDC Annual Meeting and Hall of Fame Induction will be held at that time. The board of directors meeting will be Thursday evening and Deb will contact the hotel headquarters to set-up a meeting room. Matt Scramlin will be judging the event.

-2016 Midwest Stud Ram Sale: Deb Hopkins reported that she has notified sale

management that the class split for yearling ewe classes in the Dorset breed, if need be, will be based on fall born and spring born, rather than odd and even. She also has notified them that the sale will be designated as the National Dorset Wether Sire & Dam Sale and National DA Sale.

-NAILE National Dorset Shows:

Attending board members, Dick Reece, Casey Sidwell and Michael Pope commented on the shows and things went very well for the Dorset breed. There was a great junior Polled Dorset show with 140 head entered by 60 different exhibitors, and the horned junior show had 29 head entered by 10 exhibitors but we need to make sure we keep that number steady. Entries were 183 head in the Open Polled Dorset Show and 80 head in the Horned Dorset Show, both numbers up from the previous year. 2016 Judge Nominations were selected for the ballots as follows: Polled Dorsets: Skip Anderson, Steve Reid, Jeremy Bradford and Horned Dorsets: Judy Moore, Kyle Thayer, Billy Wade. These names will be put on the ballots send out to NAILE exhibitors for preference ranking submitted to NAILE.

Deb Hopkins reported that she will once again present the changes wanted by the CDC for its National Shows to include Dorset Advantage classes in the junior show and to include specific wether sire & dam classes for both open and junior shows.

Using EBV Data to Promote Parasite Resistance

Internal parasites have been an issue in sheep production for a long time. As producers, we all strive to prevent parasite infections as much as possible, but one avenue that many of us have overlooked is the opportunity to utilize EBV data generated through NSIP, the National Sheep Improvement Program, to help promote genetic resistance to parasites.

EBVs are calculated by making comparisons, or rather genetic linkages, between not only related animals in one flock, but also by looking at those genetic linkages with related animals in other flocks.

Through these linkages, producers can then make selection decisions for a number of different traits. This multi-trait selection can often include traits that may or may not be visually evaluated. Certainly, parasite resistance would be one of those traits that would incorporate both visual and non-visual appraisal.

For producers who practice FAMACHA, they can visually evaluate the anemia level in an animal and then use that to make deworming decisions. Animals that appear anemic get dewormed, while those that appear normal do not get dewormed. If an animal is borderline in the evaluation for anemia, then an assessment of body condition may come into play. But, if parasites are present that do not cause anemia, then the FAMACHA tool is no longer effective. So, this can be a great opportunity to utilize a genetic selection tool, such as an EBV for worm egg count to help improve genetic resistance to internal parasites.

When selecting breeding animals, a

producer's goal is to select those genetics he or she wants passed on to the next generation of the sheep flock. When you only select on phenotypic traits, those you can visually assess, you are not able sort out the difference between how much of this trait is affected by genetics compared to how much of this trait is affected by the environment. So, EBVs can take the guesswork out of the visual appraisal.

The EBV for parasite resistance is based on worm egg counts (WEC) that are recorded at weaning, early post-weaning or late post-weaning time-frames. Animals that have a low or negative WEC EBV can be expected to have more resistance to parasites than animals with higher EBVs for WEC. So, if you want to choose between a ram with an EBV of -20 and one with an EBV of 2 for worm egg count, you should consider the ram with the -20 EBV over

the other ram. Producers who raise sheep in temperate climates where internal parasites have a large effect on growth and performance can find this EBV very beneficial. According to NSIP's fact sheet "NSIP EBV Notebook" research suggests that post-weaning WEC EBVs are the most useful genetic indicator of parasite resistance, although studies with Katahdin sheep show that weaning worm eggs counts provide useful information on parasite resistance in young lambs. Weaning and post-weaning WEC EBVs are strongly, but not perfectly, correlated.

Now is a great time to sign up for NSIP. The first year flock enrollment fee is waived so you only pay the

analysis fee for the sheep that will be kept as breeding stock. For more information about NSIP, check out their website at <http://nsip.org/>. Even if you don't enroll your flock, remember that you can still utilize performance data by purchasing rams and replacements ewes that have EBV data. So, take the guesswork out of your selection decisions and choose Dorsets with data!



The most accurate method to assess parasite resistance in an individual sheep is through the use of an EBV for worm egg count.

Don't forget, you don't have to be just involved in the purebred show ring to purchase registered Dorsets as they also play a significant role in the commercial sheep industry, if that is where you interest lies. All quality registered purebred Dorset breeding stock is eligible for purchase with these grants.

The CDC has received nearly 20 applications from well deserving youth. Due to the popularity of the program the NDJA has voted to pay for the third grant
