THE IMPORTANCE OF MAINTAINING FALL LAMBING ABILITY IN DORSET SHEEP

The Dorset breed of sheep has one very important characteristic that is imperative the Dorset breeders keep selecting for heavily in their breeding programs: their ability to lamb out of season naturally and easily. The CDC has always encouraged this trait to be maintained in the Dorset breed and as the sheep industry changes in this country it is becoming even more of an important trait to keep strong in the Dorset breed to keep it apart from the other breeds along with their great maternal and carcass traits.

The CDC has stressed for years

the importance of out of season lambing in the breed by keeping track of this trait in its annual statistics as well as even identifying fall lambs on the actual registration papers. New breeders often ask what does the "S" or "F" mean on the papers between the birth date and type of birth. "S" means a spring born lamb which is defined as being born between January 1st and June 30th. The "F" designates those animals born between July 1st and December 31st. The CDC also restructured show and sale classes in the early 2000's by putting more emphasis on the fall and winter classes rather than going later into the spring.

Below is a statistical chart showing a disturbing trend in the Dorset breed. In the past eight years the percentage of fall born animals recorded in the purebred Polled and Horned Dorset registry has dropped by almost 5%. Even though the Dorset breed has changed in its diversity over the recent years, the ability to breed out of season should always be stressed to maintain the

breed's importance in the commercial sheep industry and to set the breed apart from the other breed choices out there for the commercial sheep producer.

Wether type Dorset breeders may not necessarily need them to lamb in the fall for their markets but certainly enjoy it when Dorsets lamb earlier in the spring breeding cycle to get those older lambs for the early online sales. Frame type breeders



enjoy having those fall lambs to merchandise at the early Dorset sales in the spring to start bringing in income earlier in the year, never mind being able to produce sheep for those heavily emphasized fall classes in the shows for fellow Dorset breeders to buy.

With supplementary breeding aids available to cycle ewes out of season to produce fall lambs, many breeders haven't paid as much emphasis on the natural fall lambing ability. Dorsets respond very well to these hormonal aids, performing far way above other breeds. It then becomes an issue whether one is

masking their natural ability to lamb out of season thus making it hard to select for the trait. But the time may come when those aids are no longer commercially affordable or available, and with the ever increasing consumer request for "hormone" free meat product we might be forced more heavily to rely on the animal's natural ability.

The commercial producer really needs to provide lamb product on a year round basis to maximize profits and to meet the year round demand for lamb. Direct marketers really feel this pressure and many have turned to Dorset genetics to obtain the goal of a quality, year round carcass product for consumers. Commercial producers also have such a low profit margin they can not afford the more costly supplemental breeding aids so they really need the innate ability that is built into the Dorset breed to lamb out of season.

If the Dorset breed does not keep vigilant in selecting for

the out of season breeding trait they will just become another meat breed, of which there are plenty of, even more so now with the emergence of hair sheep. The Dorset breed has the versatility with is size, mothering ability, milking ability, carcass traits and quality wool production; it still needs the very most important out of season lambing ability to keep it a step above the other breeds in both the commercial and purebred seedstock sheep industries.

DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

Use Flock Records to Set Goals and Make Selection Decisions

Where are you going? In the sheep business, many of us might be headed to the barn, headed to a sale, or heading out to the pastures to check on sheep. Yes, that tells where we are going at that point in time, but where are you headed in the future? Do you have any production goals for your flock?

Developing goals starts with a good set of records so that you can determine where you are at right now. You have to know where you are at in terms of production levels in order to set your goals. Production records can be used to look at a variety of traits including lambing and weaning percentages, weaning weights, post weaning weights and even carcass data. Progressive producers may even have records on the average ewe age or even the average weaning weight across the flock. So, where do you start?

The National Sheep Improvement Program, NSIP, produced a Ram Buying Guide in 2015 that has some excellent examples of performance traits. Again, the key is knowing where you are at and then forming goals for where you want to go. Let's consider an example of Dee Dee's Dorsets.

Dee Dee bred 50 ewes last fall. She did a fair job of flushing the ewes, but was running short of time and cash so she just borrowed her neighbor's ram so that she would have lambs born in March. She knew very little about this ram's pedigree or performance background. But, she's learning about how to improve her flock and so took the time to analyze some of her records. Here is what she has so far:

Flock Improvement Worksheet from NSIP Ram Buying Guide

Dee Dee took the Penn State Extension Sheep Home Study Course a couple years ago and was encouraged to strive for twins that weigh at least 45 to 60 lbs. or more by 60 days of age. Dee Dee notes that not only is she behind in the lambing percentage, but she feels she is losing too many lambs between birth and weaning. She is happy that her lambs weigh more than 60 lbs., but she feels she could do better. She sets goals for both of these traits and then needs to consider how to reach those goals. Her first chore will be to select a higher quality ram to breed to her ewes this fall. How will she identify the superior traits in a ram so that she is more confident that these traits will carry over to her replacement ewe lambs?

Dee Dee decides to look for a ram with performance data. So, she locates a producer within a few hours drive who keeps performance records, and also has EBV data from NSIP. She knows that her buyers prefer heavily muscled lambs and that her income depends greatly on both the number of lambs she has to sell as well as their weight. (In other words, Dee Dee is very interested in both terminal and maternal characteristics.) Here is some of the data that the ram owner has on the rams he has for sale:

Hmm, Dee Dee thinks all the rams look good, but then she isn't quite sure how to evaluate the data. She would prefer a ram born as a twin, but when she questions the seller he tells her that ram 4 was produced by a yearling ewe. To make this data more clear, Dee Dee needs to either adjust the weaning weights or she needs EBV data. (For information on how to adjust weaning weights, check out the Sheep Production Handbook produced by the American Sheep Industry Association.) Luckily, Dee Dee has some EBV data to look at:

Now, Dee Dee is better able to make her selection. She chooses ram 4 for several reasons. She would expect his lambs to have higher weaning weights and have more muscle. The fat thickness may be a little higher than she would prefer, but she likes to run her ewes on grass so she feels this could help maintain good body condition for this ram's daughters. And, the higher number lambs born could help increase lambing percentages from his daughters. Dee Dee also realizes that she could be wrong in her assumptions because she doesn't currently have data on her ewes. But, she has more confidence in selecting a ram with performance data as compared to choosing a ram with no data at all. And, this gives her a good start to developing EBV data for her flock.

For more information about NSIP, check out their website at http://nsip.org/. Even if you don't enroll your flock, remember that you can still utilize performance data by purchasing rams and replacements ewes that have EBV data. Another bonus is that NSIP waives the enrollment fee for first time participants. So, take the guesswork out of your selection decisions and choose sheep with data!

This enables the CDC to provide matching funds and to guarantee at least \$10.00 per individual entry in premiums. **These matching** funds need to be sent to the CDC office **ASAP if you haven't done so yet.** Please note that junior show sheep do not

Please note that junior show sheep do not have to send in matching funds unless they are staying on to be shown in the open shows.

There have also been new specific wether sire and dam classes added to the Open Polled and Horned Dorset Shows. Since, Dorsets are being shown on Wednesday and they have shortened the Open Show by one day, so exhibitors showing only Dorsets in the Open Show, will not be allowed into the barn until Monday, November 13 at 8:00 AM. Please be aware of this and make plans accordingly.

For those of you unable to attend the shows in person, all shows can be viewed live streamed by going to the North American International Livestock Show website.

2016 DORSET EWE FUTURITY UPDATE

The Dorset Ewe Futurity Program has once again been active this year with point records forms coming into the CDC office. A total of \$4,175 has been raised to pay out to the participants of the Dorset futurity divisions.

We had two group nominators this year, Cassell Horned Dorsets, VA and Casey Sidwell, CO. Thank-you to the 59 nominators for supporting this program once again! A complete list of all the breeder nominators are listed on the back cover of this newsletter. 162 ewe lambs have been nominated this year, 114 polled ewe lambs, 12 Dorset Advantage and 36 horned dorsets. Of those, 70 have been designated by their new junior owners for participation in the futurity program. To date the CDC office has received point record forms from 29 of these junior owners.

The CDC accepted nominations from online sales this year and a total of 32 nominations were made by breeders in on line sales. 13 junior buyers picked up futurity nominated animals. Remember this next year, that even though you can not physically get to a sale, the online sales offer you an great opportunity to get a futurity nominated ewe lamb.

The Dorset Advantage ewe lamb division had more nominations this year and two juniors are participating for premiums. As breeders of "Dorset Advantage" ewe lambs we really need to get this word out to the junior buyers about this opportunity to earn premiums to help offset the cost of their animals. Some are concerned since they don't have specific Dorset Advantage classes at shows they can't get enough points but it is relative and shows are getting classes put in.

Don't forget that you don't have to show at a regional junior show to be eligible for premiums but exhibitors are still rewarded for attending regional shows as they are awarded double points.

These point record forms need to be received in the CDC office within 21 days of the date of the show or they will not count. They also need to be signed by show management. Deadline to send in Regional Point Record forms into the CDC Office is Nov. 7, 2016.

This allows the office enough time to tabulate final regional placing before Louisville. Those regional points will carry over to your Louisville junior show placing if you are attending that show to compete for the separate Louisville premiums.

The yearling ewe division had 12 yearlings nominated. Keep sending those point record forms in on the yearling ewes. The yearling ewe futurity will also end at the National Junior Dorset Show in Louisville like the ewe lamb program.

Since the Annual NJDA Meeting is now post junior show, the regional polled ewe lamb winners and all the final placings for the Polled Ewe Lamb, Horned Ewe Lamb, Dorset Advantage Ewe Lamb and Yearling Ewe divisions will be announced and awards presented at the meeting. The meeting is scheduled for 7:00 PM Saturday November 12, 2016 in meeting room C105. The awards will be given out along with the breeder recognition. Please make plans to be on hand to receive your awards.

The futurity points are updated on a regular basis on the CDC website to keep everyone appraised of point totals. If you have any questions please feel free to contact the CDC Office. The final update will be posted the week before Louisville.



The purchase does not need to be done through a public consignment sale as on farm purchases are also eligible. The program is open to youth in three age divisions: Junior 8-10 years; Intermediate 11-14 years and Senior 15-18 years. An individual may win each division only one time. The applications are due December 1st of the current year. The winning applicants will receive their grant money upon the completed transfer of the ewe purchased into their names. Ewes purchased may be of any age or type of registered Dorset, but may not
