2008 DORSET EXCELLENCE AWARD WINNERS

POLLED DORSETS

K Bar K Farm owned by Ken, Kathy & Nathan Soder of Petersburg, Pennsylvania was selected as the 2008 Polled Dorset Gregg & Marlene Bell of Ewephoric! Dorsets from Shafter, Excellence Award Winner. The Soders have been raising purebred California. The Bells have been raising Dorsets for over 20 years. Dorsets for 12 years and currently run a 125 head brood ewe flock. The Soder flock would be categorized as a production oriented polled Dorset flock. Their major emphasis has been to develop an animal that excels in a forage based nutritional system



to produce hothouse and freezer lambs with minimal labor and feed costs. The flock goes through a very aggressive selection process in which production through a national genetic database, to date they have over 1,000 individuals recorded.

Kathy writes, "Our flock goal is to produce high-quality Dorset rams and ewes using state-of-art objective evaluation combined with traditional selection tools. Our emphases include out of season breeding; ewes with strong mothering and milking ability that have good udders; prolificacy; growth; and carcass traits. We raise our Dorsets in a low-input, forage based system. We use a combination of selection tools, including objective genetic selection through expected breeding values (EBVs) including ultra sounding loin eye depth."

The Soders have imported genetics from other countries that emphasize the production traits they are looking for. Through their aggressive selection program they have been able to increase their weaning weights by 160%, post weaning weight by 340%, loin eye depth by 230% and maternal weaning weight by 20%. The majority of their brood ewe flock lambs in the fall and January, and raise multiple birth lambs. They have been able to breed a Dorset female that not only survives on a forage only based diet but have thrived on the program producing fast-growing lambs and breeding back in a timely continued on page 5

HORNED DORSETS

The 2008 Horned Dorset Excellence Award Winner is They started out raising Polled Dorsets and then converted over to Dorset Horneds just a few years ago. They currently run approximately 50 Horned Dorsets and are building up their flock as they maintain about 60% of their lamb crop to go back into their breeding program. The rest of their lambs are sold off the farm and at consignment sales for replacement breeding stock, and ethnic lamb sales. The Bells expose all of their flock for fall and January lambing, and about 85% of the ewes actually lamb during that period.

Marlene states that their breeding program goals are. "Our flock strives to make Dorset Horns better not necessarily bigger. We are geared to supporting the natural traits of the breed like fall lambing, mothering, milking, production and natural muscling. traits are evaluated By preserving these traits we hope to move more of this to the Dorset Horns of the show ring today. We not only like sheep, we

> feel a tremendous calling to raising the breed right. Keeping them as pure as possible is our goal with the Dorset Horns so that those coming after us will have fantastic experiences as we have had with the Dorset breed."

With the flock being located in California, the



sheep forage on pasture most of the time and are supplemented with alfalfa hay, protein blocks and concentrates are added just prior to lambing and through lactation. The average age of their breeding females is relatively young at 3 years of age, as they converted over to Horneds recently, and their lambing percentage is running about 170% with these young ewes. Their Horned Dorset ewes run 31" tall and 32" long and continued on page 7





manner. Winter born lambs have access to a creep feeder that has high quality alfalfa hay and a limited amount of concentrate, but that is about the only concentrate that is fed on the Soder farm. Their Dorsets run 28-30 inches tall and 32-34 inches long making them ideal to thrive in their management program and to meet their production goals. 30% of the lambs are sold as hothouse lambs. The Soders have also developed a strong registered breeding stock sale base as another 30% of the lambs go

K Bar K Farm has been a Pennsylvania Ram Test consignor for 10 years and even has had a booth at the event promoting their Dorsets. K Bar K rams have repeatedly been top performing Dorsets finishing in the top five, as well as having the largest adjusted loin eyes four out of the last five years. The farm advertises in various sheep related publications, including the Dorset Connection, as well as on the inter-

net through sheep related listservs and message boards. Kathy was the person who established the listserv for production Dorset breeders on the web. It currently has over 300 members with the purpose of discussing and promoting Dorset sheep. Kathy is also a cur-



rent member of the CDC Production Dorset Committee. K Bar K has a website and you can visit them at www.kbarkfarm.com to learn more about their Dorset sheep.

Kathy & Ken Soder summarize, "Our primary goal has been to produce a Dorset that works for the buyer, not the other way around. It has taken time and experimentation, but with our objective genetic selection program, we feel we are now producing an animal that can excel in forage-based systems to produce hothouse and freezer lambs with minimal labor inputs and reduced feed inputs. With proper selection, the Dorset sheep breed has a distinct advantage over other meat-producing live-stock species to produce a high-quality meat product with fewer inputs, thereby improving profitability in an era of escalating input prices."

The CDC will be presenting Ken, Kathy and Nathan with their award at the upcoming Pennsylvania Ram Test Sale in early August. Congratulations to the Soder Family for this achievement!

the rams are 34" tall and 361/2" long. They emphasize breeding the complete Horned Dorset that exemplifies breed character and maintains all the production traits that the Horned Dorset breed is known for.

Gregg & Marlene are great promoters of the Dorset breed. They promote their own flock by maintaining a farm website, advertising in major sheep magazines and through direct



Every spring when March rolls around and the Dorset breeders merge onto Eaton, Ohio for the Ohio Dorset Sale, expectations are always apprehensive, more so than any other sale because it is the first of the new sale season and all breeds look upon this sale as a barometer of things to come. Well, they won't be disappointed this year as the Ohio Dorset Sale was a strong one even in these not so promising economic times. It is the quality of Dorset sheep that are offered at the Ohio Sale that make it a strong one. The liudge commented that it was the best set of females that he has ever judged in any breed. A true testament to the Dorset breed and its breeders!



Champion Horned Ram - Late Fall Ram Lamb Spring Hill Farm, Westmoreland, NH Sold to Keegan Padgett, Kirklin, IN

The Polled Dorset sale sold featured 193 head that sold for an average of \$1,023.19, a top five average. Rams were fewer in numbers than 2008 but averaged \$1,354 on the 43 head sold. Breeders brought only their very best and those they considered to be potential stud rams. The strongest ewe classes were the early fall ewe lambs as they sold for an average of \$1059.38 with the late fall ewes not far behind at a \$964.29 class average. The Polled Dorset breeders should be commended on their support of the futurity program. Almost 100% of the ewe lambs were nominated for the futurity program as 63 head were nominated and almost half of then were tattooed by their new junior owners. The strength of the futurity program has been a real attribute to the breed. The yearling ewes were very deep in quality and the top end held up very well. If there was a soft spot in the sale it was in the random draw portion of the yearling classes as some very good quality ewes went for a little less money than warranted. On the whole, where there weren't any extreme high dollar individuals skewing the average, it was one of the good ones!

What can you say about the Horned portion of the sale, records were broken once again! The sale not only sold more Horned Dorsets that it ever has, it broke the sale average record also. The 56 head sold averaged \$685.71. The Horned Dorset Ewe record was broken as the Champion Ewe from Cassell Horned Dorsets of Wytheville, VA sold for \$3000 to Ridge Betts of Felton, DE. Congratulations to both! The fall yearling ewe class and late fall ewe lamb classes were the powerful averaging classes of the sale. The yearling class had a \$966.67 average and the ewe lamb class had a \$887.50 class average. This is the second year for the Horned Dorset ewe lamb futurity program and 22 ewe lambs were nominated, of those 12 were tattooed for participation and 7 came

out of that strong late fall ewe lamb class. Should be an interesting summer!



DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

USING THE RAM EFFECT TO YOUR ADVANTAGE

A very simple principle for sheep producers to use to increase their lambing rate as well as decrease the length of lambing season is to use the ram effect. There are a few key points to keep in mind to take advantage of this simple procedure.

The ram effect occurs when the ram secretes pheromones, which are basically chemical substances, that induce ewes to come into heat. The smell of these pheromones stimulates non-cycling ewes to ovulate. This hormonal substance is secreted in the wool wax. These pheromones give rams their distinctive odor during breeding season.

In order for the ram effect to work, rams need to be housed

away from the ewes for at least a month. This housing must be located far enough away that ewes are not able to smell the rams: a pen in the barn next door will NOT work. Rams may need to be housed as far as a mile away from the ewe flock. Once the ram has been introduced, ewes should come into heat about 17 to 18 days after their introduction or 24 to 25 days after their introduction to the ewes, according to Pipestone veterinarian J.D. Bobb.

Dr. Bobb also states in his International Sheep Letter (Vol. 19, No. 5, July 1999) that ewes will show a silent heat about 2 to 3 days after the ram has been introduced to the ewes. This "jump starts" the reproductive cycle so that the next ovulation (17 or 24 days later) should be a fertile heat period. If a ewe doesn't settle on the first breeding, she should

come back into heat in 17 days on the normal cycling period in the fall of the year. When breeding during the spring, she may or may not continue to cycle due to increasing day lengths.

Another advantage to using the ram effect is that ewes will tend to come into heat in a group rather than scattered over a period of time. This will then result in a larger portion of the ewes lambing in a shorter amount of time. Because the ewes are coming into heat in more of a group, it is also important to have enough rams to cover the ewes in this shorter period of time. A good rule of thumb is to have 4 to 5 mature rams available to breed 100 ewes.

Another point to stress with the ram effect is that because it stimulates non-cycling ewes to ovulate, this effect works best during July and August when most of the ewes are not currently cycling. A teaser ram can be a very useful addition to the flock prior to the breeding season because he can start bringing ewes into heat. A teaser ram is a ram that was vasectomized as a lamb. A fertile ram can be turned in with the ewes two weeks later and thus the ewes will get bred earlier in the year. This may or may not be to your advantage as a sheep producer, depending on the marketing situation for your lambs.

From a management standpoint, using the ram effect can certainly be to your advantage. It can save you hours in the barn during a shorter lambing season and your lambs will be more uniform in age and size for marketing after weaning. In addition, it can start ewes cycling earlier so that lambs are born earlier in the season.



Ewes can be encouraged to start cycling earlier in the fall when a teaser ram is introduced about two week prior to the start of the breeding season.







REGIONAL JUNIOR SHOW ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Following are the eligibility requirements for the Regional Junior Dorset Shows for your information:

- 1) Exhibitor must be a current member of the CDC whether in the youth enrollment program or as a lifetime member.
- 2) Exhibitor needs to be 21 years old or younger as of January 1st of the current year. There is no lower age limit but the exhibitor must be able to lead and/or control the head of his/her animal in the show ring.
- 3) Exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless physically impaired. The junior owner will need to be at the head of the animal controlling it in the show ring, unless of course they have more than one entry in a class in which case another junior exhibitor showing their second animal is acceptable.
- 4) Sheep must be registered in the youth's name. Youth partnerships are acceptable except for futurity animals which must be in the individual youth owner's name ONLY. Farm names or "family" ownerships are not acceptable.
- 5) Exhibitor can show at an unlimited number of regional junior shows per year, the CDC does prefer they at least show at the regional show in which they reside if possible.

7) EWE FUTURITY PROGRAM: Your futurity ewe can earn double points

at a regional junior show for the futurity ewe program. If you show at more than one regional show only your top point total will be doubled.

Regional junior shows are sometimes held in conjunction with existing shows so there definitely may be other show specific rules and regulations that apply. Please be aware of these additional requirements when making out your entries to these special shows.




