LETTER FROM CDC WESTERN DIRECTOR JOHN MONAHAN

Greetings from soggy Petaluma California.

We are currently getting our much needed rain here out west. Pastures are green, sheep are fat, and lambs are joyfully bouncing around with each other. I enjoy this time of the year! The holidays have passed, 4-H & FFA kids in my area have started calling, the days are starting to get longer, and the prospect of our future brood ewe's are upon us. All is well and looking good?

I'd like to start by welcoming our newly elected director from the New England Region, Alan "Hoop" Peterson. Hoop has jumped in with both feet running. I look forward to working with Hoop in the future.

As a board our plate is full. We have begun to layout a new format to follow and implement our breed standards. This alone is a large undertaking that fortunately we have Melanie Barkley as the chair. She brings her leadership skills, past experience, & motivation to the table to lead us in this challenging endeavor. Her committee will be looking for help from the membership in the future. Many of you have expressed concern with our breed standards. I hope that when asked you may step forward and volunteer when needed. Your board has also reviewed and discussed the results from the 2009 CDC Member Survey. At the fall teleconference meeting it was decided to table the survey until our following meeting in Ohio. Look for further information and decisions in the next Connection.

I'd like to talk about the future of our breed and where we have come from. In the overall picture of things I readily admit that I am a new comer to this industry and breed. My wife & I used the tool of breeding and showing sheep to raise our daughters. Oh and how they turned out. I might thump my chest here a minute to say that getting involved with the sheep project was one of the best decisions we have made as a couple. Our daughters, Brianna & Erin have turned out to be well respected & honorable young women!! Along the way breeding and raising top quality Dorset sheep has become a passion of mine. I am a competitive man. Although I always told the kids we learn as much loosing as we do winning. As I look at the registry reports that Debbie hands out to us, and look and the numbers here out west one can't help but notice our registry numbers are falling dramatically. Can we stop it? I think we can!

I have been involved with other breeds and livestock species throughout my life. As a 47 year old man I understand that change is always coming. Most often for the good. Although change is not always easy to accept. We also raise Southdowns and in the Southdown Winter Journal there was one particle article that I have been thinking about a lot recently. I would like to quote the following from Gary Jennings secretary of the American Southdown Breeders Association. I did change the word Southdown to Dorset to make it read correct for our breed. It is as follows:

"One common thread that I sense in other species is that certain breeds are losing numbers, losing market shares and losing identity. This often occurs as breeds focus on single phenotypic traits that are popular. In the mad rush to achieve that end, some are winners and some are losers. It is so important today to keep a breed's identity and to focus on that breed's purpose. When I refer to identity, I am not just talking about breed type, but where the breed fits into the industry. We need to remember that Dorset's have traits particular to the breed and consider what this breed will contribute in the next ten years. It is time for all to decide what the purpose of our breed is and what we want this breed to look like in the future. Are we a maternal breed or a sire breed, or both? Has the breed reached a maximum size or should it continue to increase in size? What are the most important traits that make a Dorset a Dorset, and are we emphasizing those in our breeding programs? I encourage you to think about what this breed should represent and our place in the sheep industry. For if we lose our identity, we lose our purpose and our need to exist!" Thank You Gary well said. NUMBERS UP IN 2009 NATIONAL DORSET SHOWS AT LOUISVILLE

The number of Dorsets entered and shown were up in all four of the 2009 National Dorset Shows in Louisville!For the second year in a row, the Dorset breed enjoyed having the Supreme Champion Ewe in the Junior Show. Trent, Cruz & Olivia Nichols of Harrodsburg, KY won this honor on a home bred yearling ewe. She repeated her Champion Ewe status in the Polled Dorset Open Show later in the week and was also pulled out for final consideration in the Open Show Supreme Champion Ewe drive. Participation in the Best Headed Classes were at an all time high and some excellent headed Dorset sheep were selected. The Open Horned Dorset Show enjoyed record numbers even though a major exhibitor from past shows was doing the judging honors, showing the exceptional dedication of the Horned Dorset breeders to showcase the breed at their National Show. Congratulations to all Dorset exhibitors at Louisville for doing such an excellent job of showcasing the Dorset breed on this national stage!

In the Leadline Competition the Dorset breed was well represented as nine exhibitors chose to lead Dorsets in the contest. There were two second place finishes by Savannah Stevens of Brandon, MS and Sarah McDonald of Carthage, TN.

The NAILE Junior Market Lamb Show took place on Saturday and 48 Dorset Market lambs were shown once again in two classes. Champion Dorset Market lamb was exhibited by Ashley Nightingale, Nipomo, CA and Reserve Champion was shown by Kyle Rowe, London, OH. Both of the Champions came out of the Lightweight Class and were bred by the same Dorset breeder, Star Dust Sheep Farm, KS. The top two lambs in the Heavyweight class were shown by Logan Watson, Hillsboro, OH and Kailen Urban, Roosevelt. OK.

The National Junior Dorset
Association held its Annual Meeting
Saturday evening. There were several juniors and family members in attendance
that enjoyed the fun icebreaker at the
beginning of the meeting and the pizza
that followed the meeting. A complete set
of meeting happenings are reoptered in
the Youth News section of this newsletter.
The National Junior Association needs to
do some fundraising to accompany the 1%
sales gross support from the National Sale
to keep the scholarship fund healthy. Any
ideas would be greatly appreciated. Just

The National Junior Dorset
Shows took place on Sunday with Larry
Shroyer officiating both the Horned and
Polled Junior Shows. The Dorset breed
showed last in one of the rings so the
show went well into the evening hours but
the Dorset kids were great and enthusiastic no matter the hour! Indiana won the
State Flock class with a high quality flock
even though they were the only participant. This was probably the only class that
suffered due to the late time of the show.

The Open Dorset Shows took place on Wednesday with the Polled Dorset being showed first followed by the Horned show. Even though the shows

were later in the week, the numbers were up in both of the shows. Craig Beckmeier officiated the Polled Show and Paul Cassell judged the Horned Show. "THE FIRST", "THE BIGGEST", "THE BEST"

These phrases are used in advertising the Ohio Dorset Sale each year. In celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Ohio Dorset Sale, I would like to present a history of the sale.

The Ohio Dorset Sale began as an opportunity for the members of the newly formed Ohio Dorset Breeders
Association to sell their sheep at a central-

ized place and grew into the largest Dorset sale in the country. What began as a small regional sale held sporadically in the 1940's and 50's, it has become the destination for many prominent Dorset breeders in the country to buy or sell Dorset sheep.

The first sale was held in Marysville, Ohio in 1945 with 46 head of sheep selling for an average of \$62.50. Sales were held in 1946 and 1947 at Marysville and in 1948 at Mt. Vernon with only 26 head selling. Another sale was held in Washington Court House in 1954 where 54 head sold with a top price of \$97.50 for a ram consigned by James Westhoven of Lancaster.

There is no record of any sales after 1954 until 1961 and beginning that year the sale became an annual affair. At the 1961 sale, both polled and horned Dorsets were sold. Prior to this all of the sheep in the early sales were horned sheep. This sale followed the first Polled Dorset Foundation Sale held in 1959 in Raleigh, North Carolina, home of North Carolina State University where polled Dorsets were developed. The 1961 sale average was \$60.13. The top selling ram from James Westhoven sold for \$125.00 and the top selling ewes were from the Kenneth Young Flock and the Harry McCabe flock with both ewes also selling for \$125.00. The sale manager for this sale was Kenneth Young and the auctioneer was Guy Hilton.

Mt. Gilead was an ideal location for the early sales due to its central location in the state and a core group of breeders that lived in the area including Warren and Marilyn Squires, Chet Galleher, Ed Cooper, and Chuck Coleman. These breeders would prepare the sale area and clean up after the sale. The sale barn was heated with an old coal furnace and the barn where the sheep were penned was heated with large kerosene blower heaters.

After the 1969 sale, it was evident that a new location was needed for the sale due to the growth of the sale and the lack of a heated facility for the sometime cold March weather in Ohio. Again a group of Ohio breeders stepped up to provide a facility that met the needs of the sale. "Syndicated Dorsets", a group of four Dorset breeders from Washington Court House engineered moving the sale to the Fayette County Fairgrounds in 1970. The Syndicate as they were known consisted of Phil Grover, Robert Highfield, Dave Ogan, and Lowell Douce. At the new location, the sale continued to increase in numbers and sale averages, as it grew

from a regional sale with breeders mainly from Ohio and surrounding states to a national sale with the addition of breeders from the Midwest and the West Coast. The sale was expanded to the present format of a show on Friday to determine sale order and the sale on Saturday when the move was made to Washington Court House.

At this point in the history of the sale, the polled and horned sheep were being shown together. In 1974 the horns were given their own classes and champions were selected for both the horns and the polleds. Champions that year were: Champion Polled Ram, Dale Heidemann, Illinois, Champion Polled Ewe, The Ohio State University; Champion Horned Ram and Ewe, Jack Holland, Kinacardine, Ontario, Canada.

In 1980, the sale had outgrown both the facilities at Washington Court House and the number of motel rooms needed for buvers and consignors. One breeder tells the story of waking up in the middle of a rainy night in a motel with a very leaky roof. The new location selected was the Preble County Fairgrounds in Eaton, OH. The new location had many pluses, a larger area for penning sheep, Bruner Arena for the show and sale, a larger number of motel rooms in close proximity to the fairgrounds, and Interstate 70. According to Phil Grover, the access to Interstate 70 made Eaton a good location for the sale. The Interstate made getting to the sale easier for all areas of the country. The move to Eaton would not or could not have been made without the efforts of Tom Crull. Tom was a Dorset breeder and a member of the Preble County Fairboard. The fairboard was looking for ways to best utilize their facilities on a year-round basis and bringing the Ohio Dorset Sale to Eaton was one of the first steps. Tom later became the fair manager and continued to make coming to the sale easy for out-of state breeders.

Tom saw that pens were bedded and ready for those consignors coming from out-of-state. If there was a need Tom took care of it. Tom also started other activities to make use of the fairgrounds year-round instead of just one week during the county fair. According to Myra, his wife, and also the present secretary/treasurer of the Ohio Dorset Breeders Association, the Ohio Dorset Sale was the first large sheep sale to be held on an annual basis in Eaton. As sheep men from other breeds came to Eaton for the Ohio Dorset Sale, they saw the possibilities for their breeds and now there is a multi-breed sale held on the first week in May as a result of the pioneering efforts of

Tom. Gary Saylor, present sale manager, said that he did not realize how much Tom did for the sale until recently when health reasons prevented Tom from doing those things in background that most people didn't see or always appreciate. Tom was presented an award for his efforts at the 2004 sale.

Youth and education has always been an important part of the sale weekend. In the early days of the sale, a 4-H and FFA judging contest was held on the day of the sale. This activity continued at Washington Court House and for the first few years at Eaton. It was discontinued due to the number of consigned sheep increasing and locating a good source for sheep to be judged in Eaton. Other activities that have included youth participation have been buyers certificates for youth, ODBA scholarship presentations (scholar-



ship monies come from the sale proceeds), and the Ohio Junior Dorset Breeders Association raffle. Anyone who has attended the sale will remember young members of the junior association hawking raffle tickets for their fundraisers. Another educational activity that was held in 1967 at the Mt. Gilead location was a Breed Type Conference.

Through the years, a number of people have served as sale managers including Kenneth Young, Warren and Marilyn Squires, Hobart and Wayne Farthing, Bob Highfield, Doug Gillespie, Dan Schlichter, and Larry Mead. In 1992, Gary Saylor and Dewitt Evans began managing the sale and Gary Saylor has managed the sale since 2006.

In the early years of the sale, Marilyn Squires did not charge a sale management fee in order to encourage more participation from out-of-state consignors. Bob Highfield sent out sale information to all members of the CDC in which helped to change to sale from a regional to a more national sale. Bob was also responsible for the splitting of the horns and polleds in 1974. Gary Saylor has had the longest tenure as sale man-

ager, 19 years. Last year internet bidding became of a part of the sale which gave buyers who could not travel to the sale the opportunity to see and bid on animals as they were being sold.

The number of auctioneers is smaller than the number of sale managers. Earl Wright was the auctioneer for the early sales and Guy Hilton was the auctioneer for the first few years in Mt. Gilead. Hobart Farthing became the auctioneer in 1963 and he and later with his son Wayne called the sale until 1985 when Gary Saylor and Dewitt Evans took over. Saylor and Evans took bids from 1985 to 2005 until health problems caused Dewitt to step down. Saylor and Danny Westlake have called the sale from 2006 to the present.

Another highlight of the sale weekend was the banquets held to hand out champion awards. In the early years the banquets were held at the Derrick Motel near Mt. Gilead with Larry Mead of the Sheep Breeder and Sheepman magazine as the master of ceremonies. Larry would keep the room in stitches telling stories on or about the different breeders at the affair. It was a tradition that continued in Washington Court House. Lamb was usually a featured part of the menu and anyone who attended the banquets at Washington Court House will remember the meatballs and the spread put on by the caterer at Mahan Hall. When the sale was moved to Eaton, then secretary-treasurer of the ODBA, Helen Luster, made sure that there continued to be a banquet. In recent years the meal has moved to be held in Bruner Arena following the show on Friday.

The Ohio Dorset Sale has been designated the National Sale by the Continental Dorset Club in 1978, 1982, 1987, 1990, 1991(horns only), 1994, 1998, 2000(horns only), 2001, 2004, 2005(horns only), 2007, and this year, 2010. Although the National Sale has rotated to different locations since the Continental Dorset Club decided to designate a national sale each year beginning in 1977, most consignors will tell you that they bring their best to Ohio each year.

The Dorset Centennial
Celebration was held in 1998 at the Ohio
Dorset Sale. Many activities were planned
for that weekend including a Centennial
banquet and membership meeting held at
the Holiday Inn in Richmond, Indiana just
across the border from Eaton. The
Centennial Show and Sale resulted in
largest consignment and number of sheep
sold to date. There were so many head
consigned that year that the horned sheep
show was on Thursday evening followed

by a lamb barbeque. 421 head sold that year.

Other Dorset sales have come and gone through the years but the Ohio Dorset Sale continues due to the commitment of the Ohio Dorset Breeders Association and the sale management to present the best sale possible for the Dorset breed. Through the years there have been many people who have made this sale what is it today and if I forgotten to mention anyone I apologize. Many of you probably have many memories and funny stories about what has happened at the Ohio Dorset Sale through the years. Maybe that will be the subject for another article in the future.

When asked what was the highlight of the Ohio Dorset Sale for her, Myra Crull said it best, "This sale is not only a great place to sell and buy sheep, but also it is great place to meet and spend time with fellow breeders from across the country who are interested in Dorset sheep."

2009 FALL CDC BOARD TELE-CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Mike Galleher at 7:35 PM EST on Thursday, December 10, 2009. Others on-line were: Directors Larry Hunter, John Monahan, Alan "Hoop" Peterson and Melanie Barkley. CDC Exec. Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins was also on-line to take minutes. Frank Tiffany joined the teleconference later to report on website and computer program development.

- -Secretary's Report: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2009 Annual Board Meeting held May 27, 2009 in Sparks, NV. John Monahan moved to accept the minutes as printed. Hoop Peterson seconded. Motion carried.
- -Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2009 to December 2, 2009. It was reported that total income was \$13,502.95, total expenses were \$28,512.70 for a net loss for the period of \$15,009.80. Account balances were: Checking \$4,248.50, Money Market \$20.037.82, CD \$24,705.61. Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$9.343.26 for a total of \$58.360.19 on hand. Melanie Barkley moved to accept the treasurer's report. Larry Hunter seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 08-09 fiscal records are at the accountants for the annual report and annual tax from filing but noted that the association will only loose \$409.90 this
- -CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2009-2010 stats and 507 head have been registered to date and 407 head transferred. Deb Hopkins also reported the year-end stats for 2008-2009. There were 7211 head registered (down 223 head from the previous year) and transferred 3,545 head (down 135 head from the previous year). 
COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Mike Galleher and Melanie Barkley presented the final futurity standings for the 2009 program. Melanie complemented the youth for the quality of ewe lambs that were shown at Louisville in the program and Mike congratulated the horned breeders and youth exhibitors for having a successful year. A total of \$4,475 was paid out to 33 participants. Average payout was \$135.60. Awards and rosettes were presented to regional and national winners. There were 192 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$4,400 in nomination fees. 65 polled ewe lambs were tattooed for participation. The yearling ewe program had 9 nominations taking in \$225 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 39 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$850 in nomination fees. 19 horned ewe lambs were tattooed for participation. Discussion on expanding the horned ewe lamb division to include regional competition was discussed but was decided to leave the program as it is for the present time.

-Breed Standard Education: Deb
Hopkins reported that she has contacted
Mike Crowder and Terry Burks to act as
breed type inspectors at the upcoming
National Sale in Ohio and still need conformation from Terry. (Since the meeting
Terry had a conflict and Sam Wiford has
graciously agreed to serve as an inspector.) Melanie Barkley, reported on the committee development of the breed standard
education manual. The committee members consisting of herself, Hoop Peterson,



Deb will also promote this in the newsletter and Frank will post on web site. The juniors have asked to have a junior breeder's directory added to the website and a blog. Deb will get information to Frank for posting the junior directory and will look into possibly doing something on facebook instead of a blog on the website. -Registry Program Update: Frank Tiffany reported on his progress of a computer registry program for the CDC. He will meet with Debbie in January as he is in the development of the forms phase and want to make sure he has everything that Deb wants in the program. Hopefully by March he will have a demo of the program he can present to the board. Cost of the development of this program was discussed and Mike will talk with Frank to work out a financial arrangement for all his efforts. that financial proposal to the board in Mar. -Dorset Breeder Excellence Program:

Mike Galleher reported that the CDC is waiting for entries as the deadline is the end of the year.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2010 All-American will be held in East Lansing, MI at the Michigan State University Arena from July 2-4, 2010. Polled and Horned Dorsets will be included with slick shorn classes offered. Riverwood Farms, Powell, OH will be donating a Polled ewe lamb at the Ohio Sale and a horned ewe lamb is still being finalized. Deb will also have the juniors solicit class donators at Ohio and the raffle tickets will be mailed out again directly to Dorset breeders for their support. A meeting was held at Louisville and Judy Moore is heading up the efforts in Michigan, and they are making special plans including a tour of the MSU campus and agricultural facilities. Jeremy Etzler and Jake Reister are going to be serving as judges for the 2010 show. In 2011 the All-American Junior Show will be held in Delaware at the state fairgrounds in Harrington, DE.

NEW BUSINESS:

The board meeting will be at 3:00 PM Thursday and the Annual Membership Meeting will be after the sale BBQ on Friday evening. Breed inspection will be from 9:00 AM-3:00 PM on Thursday. This will be the 50th Anniversary of the Ohio Dorset Sale so special activities are being planned including the production of clothing commemorating the event.

- NAILE National Dorset Shows: Board members present thought the junior show had an excellent set of sheep as well as the open show including the slick shorn classes. Judge selections to be put on ballot for 2010: Polled Dorsets-Mark Chapman, Steve Taylor, Mike Wright: Horned Dorsets-Tim Fleener, Dick Kuzemchak, Billy Wade. The CDC had been contacted prior to Louisville about the institution of a junior wether dam show but the board felt with its slick shorn classes those kind of sheep have a place to be shown in the junior breeding sheep show, and with the improving quality and numbers in those classes, the CDC will continue their monetary support there at the present time. The CDC would still be willing to send a letter of support if the push for a separate show is pursued but not financially at this time. Deb asked if there was any interest or support for a Dorset Sale at NAILE. There seemed to be no support at this time.



DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

Does Heat Synchronization Fit Into Your Operation?

With the recent announcement from the Food and Drug Administration concerning approval of the EAZI breed cidr for use in sheep and goats, this seems to be a good time to discuss options for heat synchronization in sheep flocks. While this may not fit into the management of every flock, this could be a tool to use either with or without artificial insemination. (Hopefully, research will soon develop a more economical artificial insemination method that producers can use very successfully on their own farm.)

The cidr and sponge administer progesterone vaginally, Synchromate-B (developed for cattle) administers progesterone through an ear implant, and melengestrol acetate (MGA) administers progesterone as a feed additive. After the progesterone source is removed, ewes receive an injection of PMSG or PG-600, particularly for spring breeding. For fall breeding, this injection may not be needed. Another option is to use a prostaglandin product such as Lutalyse or Estrumate. Often, a teaser ram will help to better synchronize the ewes and he will mark the ewes as they come into heat if you are planning to breed artificially. Synchronization protocols will vary depending on the product being used. Consult your local veterinarian or Al technician for more complete instructions. You can also refer to the spring issue of the Dorset Connection for information on using the ram effect for heat synchronization in your flock.

While the beef industry has long had many options for heat synchronization and artificial insemination, the sheep industry is just beginning to see the implications of these management tools. One benefit of heat synchronization is the ability to better manage labor during lambing. Many producers may be handling field work for crop or hay production in the spring during lambing season. By synchronizing ewes, the flock will drop those lambs in a much smaller time frame. Instead of constantly monitoring ewes over a 45 to 60 day period, ewes should drop lambs in a three to four day window. (Keep in mind that not all ewes conform to an average gestation length and will lamb outside this period of time.) This gives producers about two weeks to manage other aspects of their operation before the next wave of lambs arrives. This second wave is obviously those ewes who did not conceive on the first heat cycle.

In addition, lambs will be more uniform in age and allow for better selection of replacement ewe lambs and rams. Even though many operations weigh lambs for performance data, visual selection can be more challenging when lambs range in age over a 60 day period. This is especially true when lambs are very young. For producers who creep feed lambs, ewes can be separated into lamb-

ing groups. This prevents smaller, later born lambs from being pushed away from the creep feeder by those larger, earlier born lambs.

Hopefully, the first group of lambs that are born is the larger sized group. This will translate into more lambs being born earlier in the season which will increase total production of pounds of lambs to sell at weaning. Or, this could mean more pounds of lamb to sell at market weight if you have a targeted marketing date.

I doubt that anything in life comes without a cost. While the benefits listed above are good, there are a few drawbacks to consider before deciding if heat synchronization will fit into your management style.

Two additional costs when using a heat synchronization program will include the cost of the method used to synchronize the heat cycle as well as the labor needed to make the synchronization successful. If all the ewes are synchronized to come into heat at the same time, additional rams will also be needed to cover all the ewes. An approximate number is to use one ram for every ten ewes. This can be extended if the heat synchronization process occurs over a period of several days. Again, you will have added labor for those few days when ewes drop their lambs

A couple things to keep in mind about heat synchronization are that this will not improve the pregnancy rate of the flock over the current rate. It will also not allow sub-fertile or infertile ewes to get bred. Another caution would be to handle any of these products carefully to avoid any human health issues.

It will be interesting to see what the future holds for the use of heat synchronization products and eventually artificial insemination in commercial flocks. 2010 National Dorset Ewe Lamb Futurity Rules & Regulations CONSIGNOR RULES:

- 1. Entries are for all ewe lambs born after September 1, 2009. Ewe lambs will compete in their specific age divisions.
- 2. Nomination fee is \$25.00 per head payable to the Continental Dorset Club. If a breeder would like to be able to nominate all of their ewe lamb consignments during the 2010 sale season then the flat fee would be \$250. Ewe Lambs must be nominated and designated prior to entering the show ring of their class at the futurity sale. Payment of nomination fee is to be made prior to the sale of the ewe lambs. Breeders wanting to take advantage of the group rate must make the CDC aware of their intention by the Ohio Dorset Sale.
- 3. Each ewe lamb must bear the proper identification which corresponds to the registration certificate. After transfer to the futurity participate the registration certificate will be identified that this is a futurity ewe lamb.
- 4. Each ewe lamb must conform and abide by the rules and regulations of each individual sale to which it is consigned. All normal entry fees and commission apply.
- 5. The CDC will not be held responsible for any dispute and/or disagreements between buyers and sellers.
- 6. Lambs will be tattooed for futurity purposes after the sale of the sheep by a CDC director or designated representative. It is suggested that consignors seek out the new owner and have them tattoo the lamb before they leave the sale.

LAMBS NOT TATTOOED ON THE DAY OF THE SALE WILL BECOME INELIGIBLE FOR THE FUTURITY.

7. Sales which are eligible to have nominated ewe lambs are: Ohio Dorset Sale, Illinois Dorset Sale, Reno All-American Sale, Cornbelt Dorset Sale, West Virginia Sale, Virginia Ram & Ewe Sale, Midwest Stud Ram Sale, New England Sale.

EXHIBITORS RULES:

- 1. ALL juniors who meet the requirements for the Junior Show at the North American International Livestock Exposition are eligible. Rules for the NAILE are:
- -Junior exhibitors 21 years old and under as of January 1, 2010 are eligible, no lower age limit but must be physically capable of showing their own sheep.
- -Junior members must be present to show their own sheep unless physically impaired.
- -Animals ownership registered with the CDC office by August 1, 2010. Ownerships must be in the youth's name. Youth partnerships, farm names or family ownerships are not acceptable.
- -Up to date youth or lifetime membership in the CDC.
- 2. Ewe lambs are to be registered in the **INDIVIDUAL NAME ONLY**. No partnerships, farm, family, 4-H club or FFA Chapter names accepted in the futurity program.
- 3. The purchasing junior can not be an immediate family member of the breeder or employee of the breeder as listed on the ewe's registration paper. Immediate family members would be described as any first generation child, grandchild, sister, brother, niece or nephew.
- 4. Ewe lambs and points earned in the futurity are not transferable to any other person other than the original owner, nor are points transferable from one lamb to another.
- 5. No futurity entrant may earn premiums on no more than two ewe lambs. Total points earned by two ewe lambs can not be combined.
- 6. If registration papers are not received by the first show, it is the exhibitors responsibility to show the lamb in the proper age category and have sales receipt to prove ownership to the show management.
- 7. If the exhibitor has more than one ewe lamb in the same class, another junior member may exhibit the ewe lamb as long as the exhibitor is showing the other ewe lamb.
- 8. **Premiums:** A minimum of \$2810 will be awarded to be divided up among the six districts and the NAILE Junior Show. The guaranteed money total will be given as follows:

If total nomination fees of ewe lambs and donations are greater than the \$2,810 total, premiums will be increased accordingly. It should be noted that the actual futurity pay out has been well over the guaranteed premiums since its inception. Futurity ewe lambs can either compete on a district level and at NAILE <u>OR</u> they can compete on just the district level if they can not get to the NAILE Junior Show in November.

POINT SCORING

1. A point record form has to be filled out for each showing and forwarded to the CDC Office with in 21 days of the show. The form must be signed by the superintendent of the appropriate show so, it is best to get them filled out while you are still at the show. These forms along with the rules and regulations will be sent to futurity participants upon purchase of the futurity ewe lamb.

- 2. At each individual show the ewe lamb may earn futurity points from both the open division and/or junior division except at the NAILE where only the Junior Show placing will determine points earned.
- 3. Ewe lambs can compete at an unlimited number of shows with only the top 5 point awards going towards your District total. ONE NATIONAL REGIONAL JUNIOR SHOW WILL COUNT DOUBLE POINTS. IF YOU SHOW AT MORE THAN ONE NATIONAL REGIONAL, THE HIGHEST POINT TOTAL WILL BE DOUBLED. IT IS NO LONGER REQUIRED THAT YOU MUST SHOW AT A NATIONAL REGIONAL. District premiums will be awarded on these totals. If you continue to participate at the NAILE Junior Show, the District point total plus the points earned in the NAILE Junior Show will determine the final placing for the NAILE Premiums and a special award will be presented to this overall placing.
- 4. The period for eligible shows will be from the Ohio Dorset Sale in March until the NAILE in November of the current year.
- 5. Even though both fall and spring ewe lambs are eligible for the futurity only one set of premiums will be paid in each district and one set of premiums at the NAILE. The lambs will be shown in their proper age division at the shows and then the point totals will be combined together for the futurity placing.
- 6. District futurity awards will be announced in the newsletter and premiums sent to the winners. The NAILE Futurity Awards will be figured and announced in Louisville after the Dorset Junior Show.
- 7. Below is the futurity point scale from which points will be determined:

2010 HORNED DORSET EWE LAMB FUTURITY DIVISION SPECIAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The Horned Ewe Lamb Futurity will be run exactly the same as the Polled Ewe Lamb Futurity with the following exceptions:

- 1) There will only be **ONE** national premium scale payout. The final show eligible will be the National Junior Horned Dorset Show at NAILE, Louisville, KY. The guaranteed premium scale is: First:\$200, Second:\$150, Third:\$100, Fourth:\$85, Fifth:\$65. Final placing will be announced during the Horned Dorset Junior Show in Louisville.
- 2) Junior participants can only collect premiums on **ONE** ewe lamb though you can participant with an unlimited number of ewe lambs.
- 3)Points turned in can only be from other horned dorset ewe lamb competition. You can submit points when the horned ewe lambs are shown with polled dorsets or in AOB competition but you can only base your class totals and placings on horned dorsets **ONLY**. For example: You are showing in an AOB class of 10 head and five are horned dorsets. Your lamb placed second among the horned dorsets. Your point form will read that you placed second out of five no matter where you placed in the whole class. When you are showing in a horned dorset class only then the whole class total number will count.

4)ALL OTHER POLLED EWE LAMB FUTURITY RULES APPLY.

2010 SPECIAL DORSET YEARLING EWE FUTURITY DIVISION RULES & REGULATIONS

(ALL RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE DORSET EWE LAMB FUTURITY THAT ARE RELEVANT TO THE YEARLING EWE DIVISION APPLY, POLLED & HORNED EWES ARE ELIGIBLE)

- 1) Any yearling ewe that was nominated, purchased by a junior breeder and tattooed for participation in the futurity program as a ewe lamb in 2009 is eligible. The ewe is still eligible for the yearling ewe division even if there were no point record forms turned into the CDC office or futurity premiums paid out on the ewe as a lamb.
- 2) The current junior owner has to forward a renomination fee of \$25.00 and a completed nomination form to the CDC Office by **May 1, 2010.**
- 3) The ewe must still be in the junior exhibitors individual name that originally purchased the ewe at the designated futurity sale. No transfer of ownership can have taken place since the original purchase.
- 4) Junior participants can only collect premiums on **ONE** yearling ewe even though you can nominate up to two ewes.
- 5) **PREMIUMS:** A minimum of \$600 will be awarded as follows: First \$200; Second \$150; Third \$100; Fourth \$85; Fifth \$65. There will be one set of premiums paid out.
- 6) The points will be totaled at the end of the 2010 show season. The show season will be from date of nomination through the National Junior Show at NAILE in Louisville. One does not have to show at the NAILE Junior Dorset Show to collect premiums but that will be the last show you can collect points at. The Yearling Ewe Futurity Awards will be figured and announced in Louisville after the Dorset Junior Show. Premiums will be mailed out shortly after that.
- 7) Yearling ewes can be shown at a unlimited number of shows and forms submitted but only the highest 5 point totals will count. ONE NATIONAL REGIONAL JUNIOR SHOW WILL COUNT DOUBLE POINTS. IF YOU SHOW AT MORE THAN ONE NATIONAL REGIONAL, THE HIGHEST POINT TOTAL WILL BE DOUBLED. IT IS NO LONGER REQUIRED THAT YOU MUST SHOW AT A NATIONAL REGIONAL. Points will be awarded using the same scale as in the ewe lamb division. You can use the same point record form as with the ewe lambs and point record forms must be mailed or faxed to the CDC Office within 21 days of the show date.





calendar year. Also, the upper age limit has changed to where junior exhibitors 21 years old and under as of January 1st of the current year are eligible to show.

To avoid any confusion, following are the eligibility requirements for these shows as outlined by the CDC:

- 1) Exhibitor must be a current member of the CDC whether in the youth enrollment program or a lifetime member.
- 2) Exhibitor 21 years old and under as of January 1, 2010 is eligible. There is no lower age limit but the exhibitor must be able to lead and/or control the head of his/her animal in the show ring.
- 3) Exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless physically impaired. The junior owner will need to be at the head of the animal controlling it in the show ring, unless of course they have more than one entry in a class in which case another junior exhibitor showing their second animal is acceptable.
- 4) Sheep must be registered in the youth's name. Youth partnerships are acceptable except for futurity animals which must be in the individual youth owner's name ONLY. Farm names or "family" ownerships are not acceptable.
- 5) Exhibitor can show at more than one regional junior dorset show per calendar year, the CDC strongly encourages juniors to at least show at the regional show in the region in which they reside
- 6) **EWE FUTURITY PROGRAM:** Your futurity ewe can earn double points at a regional junior show for the futurity ewe program, only the highest regional showing will be doubled, any others will count as a regular show.

Regional junior shows are sometimes held in conjunction with existing shows so there definitely may be other show specific rules and regulations that apply. Please be aware of these requirements when making out your entries.
