2011 DORSET BREEDER EXCELLENCE WINNER MAPLE HOLLOW FARM

The 2011 Dorset Breeder Excellence Winner is the Brian & Melanie Barkley Family of Maple Hollow Farm in Manns Choice, PA. Brian and Melanie have been rasing Dorsets for over 30 years on their 230 acre farm in Central Pennsyl-vania. Brian owns and operates Maple Hollow Fencing, so the farm has top notch electric fencing and in recent years they have erected a hoop type barn that primarily houses the ewes and lambs during lactation. Melanie works full time in the Penn State Extension system and has been the contributing editor for the Dorset Commercial articles in this newsletter for many years.

Maple Hollow is a purebred operation that emphasizes fall lambing as well as productive ewes that can lamb on their own without assistance, raise those lambs without assistance and maintain their body condition on pasture. They made the decision four years ago to make some changes to their flock. After family visits to Australia, they imported their first shipment of semen from there to use in their own flock. The purpose in moving in this direction was to increase muscling, improve performance on pasture and improve



breed character. They also wanted to decrease frame size to a more moderate height. Their second shipment of Australian semen arrived last year and they just had the lambs from those genetics this past February. This genetic change has set their flock apart from some of the other flocks because these sheep thrive on forage, pro-

duce a high dollar value lamb carcass, and have improved resistance to internal parasites.

Maple Hollow Farm is a very active promoter of Dorset sheep. They are heavily involved in the Pennsylvania Dorset Association and all three daughters have been in 4-H and will be FFA members. They have exhibited Dorset breeding stock, market lambs, or carcass lambs at the county fair. Melanie, being an extension agent, is very active in the county 4-H program as well as being involved at the state level in developing curriculum to teach

> quality animal management practices to youth involved across the state with livestock projects.

In 2011 their farm hosted three tours that discussed Dorsets as well as sheep promotion in general. These tours included students in the Penn State production class, freshman students interested in agriculture through Penn State and agriculture educators as part of the PA Association of County Agricultural Agents Association.



Maple Hollow has been involved in consigning sheep to shows and sales as they have traveled from New England to Reno consigning to National Dorset Sales as well as selling to surrounding states. In addition, they have showed their flock at many state, regional and national events. They are also supporters of many junior Dorset shows as they have sponsored many awards at these shows.

The farm is very active in the selling and promotion of "Maple Hollow Lamb Snack Sticks". The snack sticks are a summer type lamb sausage that are made typically from yearling ewes who don't meet the criteria to become part of the brood ewe flock. The snack sticks are marketed at two local retail businesses and a number of the sticks are sold at sheep events and have been donated to junior shows to assist in fundraising.

Congratulations to Brain & Melanie, Meghan, Kayla & Heidi! The official presentation of their award will be made at the Dorset Sale Show at the 2012 Midwest Sale, Tuesday, June 26th. Come and give your congratulations on an award very well deserved!



FEATURE ARTICLES ILLINOIS DORSET SALE HOSTS 2012 NATIONAL DORSET SALE & CDC ANNUAL MEETING

The 2012 National Dorset Sale and CDC Annual Meeting were held in conjunction with the Illinois Dorset Sale at the Interstate Center in Bloomington, IL over Easter weekend, April 6-7. The Illinois Dorset Association did an exceptional job in hosting the event! Ring decor, consignor welcome gifts, fundraising silent auction for Dorset juniors, junior judging contest, junior ewe lamb giveaway and a FREE BBQ dinner to all the attendees were among the special touches that they incorporated for this national dorset event. Thank-you to them for all their efforts, as there was months of planning and it all came off very well.

Of course a successful sale starts with a quality consignment and the Dorset breeders sure came through as 124 head of Polled Dorsets sold for an average of \$859.27 and 14 head of Horned Dorsets sold for a \$691.27 average. Sheep were consigned from California to Pennsylvania, and all the local Illinois breeders were very supportive with their consignments also. This is almost double the number of sheep they usually sell at the Illinois Sale and they increased their average by over \$100.00! An excellent feat during these harder economic times.

A complete sale report appears on pages 24-26 of this newsletter. Congratulations to Olivia Waggoner-Pine Ridge Dorsets of East Berlin, PA for being named the Townsend Best Consignor. High selling polled ram was the Reserve Grand Champion and Best Headed Ram from Riverwood Farms, Powell, OH that was sold for \$6500 to Tyler & Shane Lobdell, Lena, IL. The high selling polled ewe was the Champion Ewe from Maureen Lien & Daughters, Cambridge,

WI. This exceptional ewe was sold to Kurt, Kyle & Kaden Gutormson of Brookings, SD. The Horned Dorsets had a very good day also as the highlight of their sale was that the Champion and Reserve Champion Ewes from Cassell Horned Dorsets commanded top dollar as they sold for \$1850 and \$1200 respectively to Tom Walsh, North Berwick, ME and to Britton Francis, Paris, MO.

The CDC Annual Meeting was held Friday night, April 6th following the dinner and silent auction. Thank-you to all the donators of the silent auction items and to all the bidders and purchasers of these items. A great deal of money was made for Illinois and National Junior Dorset activities. Following are the minutes from the CDC Annual Meeting and the CDC Annual Board meeting that was held the night before:

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Johnnie Johnson at 7:20, April 6, 2012 PM in conjunction with the BBQ dinner sponsored by the Illinois Dorset Breeders Association. Thank-you to them for a great dinner and for being such gracious hosts. Johnnie Johnson introduced the directors and Great Lakes director-elect Mark lunghuhn.

Executive Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins presented the minutes from the 2011 Annual Membership Meeting that was held at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale, Sedalia, MO on Friday, June 24, 2011. Lee Donald Olson moved to accept the minutes as written. Eric Hodel seconded. Motion Carried.

Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal 2011-2012 year to date as of March 28, 2012. Total income is \$36,905.80, total expenses is \$45,491.16

\$7,264.04; Savings Account: \$22.01; CD: \$25,524.60; Money Market: \$10,060.40; Junior Association \$34,946.42 for total cash assets of \$77,817.47. Eric Bruns moved to accept the treasurer report as presented. Sarah Gehring seconded. Motion carried.

Deb Hopkins presented the 2011-2012 statistics to date. As of March 31, 2012, 2317 head have been registered and 1115 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 489 head from the same period last year and the transfers are up 317 head from last year. Deb Hopkins also read the final stats for 2010-2011. There were 6045 head registered (down 195 from last year) and 2912 head transferred (down 245 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were: 1)Pennsylvania-596 head; 2)Indiana-546; 3)Ohio-542; 4)Iowa-537; 5)Ilinois-475; 6)Minnesota-408; 7)California-291: 8)Oklahoma-238: 9)Wisconsin-217; 10)Oregon-213; 11)Virginia-212; 12)Washington-180; 13)Missouri-151; 14)New York-129 and 15)Massachusetts-126. -Futurity: Hoop Peterson reported that the

Cassell Horned Dorsets, Wytheville, VA 2011 Ewe Lamb Futurity, both polled & horned, had 155 lambs nominated and 51 lambs were tattooed for participation, and there were 8 yearling ewes nominated for the Yearling Ewe Futurity Program. A total of \$5,656.80 was collected and actual payout was \$3,642.15 as the polled ewe lamb futurity was down just a bit in participation. Already this year, from the Ohio and Illinois sales, 129 lambs have been nominated and of those 60 have been bought by individual junior buyers making them eligible to participate in the ewe lamb program. Tattooing is no longer required as the CDC will use the scrapie tags as official identification for the program. Junior buyers need to identify the CDC office if a scrapie tag is lost and replaced with the new numbers immediately to remain eligible for premium payout.

-Breed Standard Education/Certified Judges List: Mike Galleher reported that Casey Sidwell and Larry Hunter did the breed type inspections yesterday and thanked them for their assistance. They did find a few scratchy mouths and hoof color especially in the heels of the animals. It was also noted there was not much mouth color or any other serious defects or highly objectionable traits observed. Travis Hoffman was added to the Dorset certified judges list and Mike asked for more names of judges to be nominated for the list. Mike also made a request for more photos that are needed for Melanie Barkley, who is working on the completion of the breed standard judges manual.

-Production Dorset Committee: Jeff Poynter reported that the CDC is trying to get breeders to identify themselves on the type of Dorsets raised on the registration applications so breeders can be so identified in the next years breeders directory for ease of buyers finding the breeders that raise the kind of Dorsets they are looking for: horned, polled, frame, production, wether type. The CDC office is also working on getting the data fields identified

-Junior Dorset Ewe Purchase Grants: Johnnie Johnson announced a new program being started by the CDC and NJDA. Two \$500 grants will be awarded each year to junior members towards the purchase of a Dorset ewe. Applications will need to filled out by December 1st and winners announced on January 1st so the junior can make purchasing plans. Money will be awarded when the ewe is transferred into the new junior owner name. There will also be two age categories, 8-14 years of age and 15-18 years of age. Ewes may not be purchased from a family member and must be transferred to a single junior member. Ewe may be purchased at a sale or off the farm, and the ewe may be of any age. An application form is being designed and will be put up on the CDC webpage.

-National Junior Dorset Association: Junior Association directors Michael Pope and Tyler Myers were present. Michael Pope updated the meeting attendees about the upcoming All American Junior Show, Mid-West Junior Preview Show, Summer Regional Junior Shows, and the Junior Dorset Scholarship program. Michael also thanked the basket donators and purchasers for their support of the NJDA.

-Newsletter and Website: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2012 winter newsletter had great advertising support and it netted an income of \$1263.26. The 2012 spring/summer newsletter deadline is coming up fast, April 15th and encouraged advertising support. The website seems to be going well also, keep checking in for up to date news and information. -All-American Junior Show: Coulter Passwaters reported that the 2012 All-American Junior Show will be July 6-8, 2012 at the Iowa State Fairgrounds, Des Moines, IA. CONTINENTAL DORSET CLUB 2012 ANNUAL BOARD MEETING APRIL 5, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by President Casey Sidwell. Directors Mike Galleher, Coulter Passwaters, Johnnie Johnson, Hoop Peterson, Jeff Poynter were in attendance. Director-elect for the Great Lakes Region Mark lunghuhn, and CDC Exec. Sec./Treas. Deb Hopkins were also present. Mike Wright, director-elect from New England sent his regrets in not being able to attend.

-Secretary Minutes: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the minutes from the 2011 CDC Fall-Teleconference Meeting held December 8, 2011. Coulter Passwaters moved to accept the minutes as written. Hoop Peterson seconded. Motion passed.

-Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal 2011-2012 year to date as of March 28, 2012. Total income is \$36,905.80, total expenses is \$45,491.16 for a current net cash loss of \$8,585.36. Account balances - Checking Account: \$7,264.04; Savings Account: \$22.01; CD: \$25,524.60; Money Market: \$10,060.40; Junior Association \$34,946.42 for total cash assets of \$77,817.47. Jeff Poynter moved to accept the treasurer's report. Mike Galleher seconded. Motion passed. Deb Hopkins also presented a proposed budget for 2012-2013 for the board to review as it goes through the meeting.

-CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins presented the 2011-2012 statistics to date. As of March 31, 2012, 2,317 head have been registered and 1,115 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 489 head from the same period last year and the transfers are up 317 head from the same period last year.

-Correspondence: Deb Hopkins presented an email from Ted McQuinley asking if the board of directors are considering what can be shown and sold as Dorset sheep as many wether type sheep sales don't require registration papers on sheep being sold as Dorsets, thus why should other breeders be required to register them to sell or show. 

James J. Meno

Jim, originally from Carlinville, IL, bred Dorset sheep from 1950 to 1979. He was on the CDC Board of Directors for 7 years and served as President from 1963-1964. Jim went to college at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, IL where he graduated in Animal Science and as a student there Jim managed the university farms. When Jim and Marion relocated to Hudson, IA in 1972, he served as the Area Extension Livestock Specialist for Iowa State University. Jim loved agriculture, livestock and teaching, which he did expertly for many years. He took pride in teaching young boys into becoming farming men.

Jim's Dorset breeding program produced the champion ewe "Lady Bird", at the Chicago show in 1963 and had many other numerous champions at other state fairs, shows and sales including the Illinois Dorset Sale, the Ohio Dorset Sale, the Oklahoma Black & White Sale and the Midwest Stud Ram Sale.

He was also a judge at numerous major livestock shows across the United States. He was dedicated to the Dorset breed and sheep were a big part of his life. He was a perfectionist that set high standards for all that he knew.

Accepting the honor for Jim was his wife Marion and daughters Peg Stanczak and Barb Henry, who made the trip from California.

Donald A. Grant

Don was the person most responsible for the development and long life of the University of Connecticut's Dorset flock. Don was a native of Wethersfield and graduated from the University of Connecticut around 1950. He was employed as Livestock Superintendent, overseeing the Morgan Horses, Yorkshire Swine and Hereford and Angus cattle as well as the Dorset, Shropshire and Southdown sheep. While he enjoyed working with all the species, the sheep were his favorite.

Don developed the Polled Dorset flock from a homed base using polled rams from North Carolina State and Oklahoma State. The most influential early stud ram however, was Mills 155, purchased from the Taunton Hill flock. Don purchased a Warren Brannon ram at the 1969 Eastern Stud Ram Sale and later Steve Myers and Stony Point rams were used to maintain the quality of the flock. The UConn Dorset sheep were always successful in competition in New England and in the late 60's and through the 70's won multiple championships at the Eastern Stud Ram Sale, Keystone and New England Sales as well as the Midwest Sale. They were also the sheep to beat at Eastern States and the Keystone International and when the North American Livestock Exposition opened they showed there competitively through the 80's. Later, after Don's retirement, the emphasis on purebred sheep was greatly reduced at UConn and valuable genetics

were lost to the breed.

Don Grant was by nature a teacher and many people of various ages learned from him and benefited from his knowledge. He was open minded, patient and allowed other people to follow their own ideas. While Don's job was to oversee the herds and flocks of livestock at UConn he was actively involved in sheep extension and was instrumental in the development of Friday night extension meetings that drew people from four New England states and ran for a number of years.

Don worked closely with the New England Sale for years. He also was President of the New England Sheep and Wool Producers and developed a yearly market lamb sale held each fall in the Stock Pavilion at UConn to allow youth to sell their lambs at a fair price. Don and his wife, Jayne, were also long term leaders of a very active 4-H Sheep Club. In addition, Don served as a director and president of the Continental Dorset Club from 1986-1987.

Don Grant was a unique individual who could breed, develop and show purebred sheep successfully and who earned the respect of many people with his ability to teach and lead people and associations.

Accepting the honor for Don was his wife Jayne, who came with their daughter Deb Hopkins, from Storrs, CT.

J.B. Henderson

J.B. Henderson, Burgettstown, PA was a member of the founding executive committee of the Continental Dorset Club. He was very instrumental in the establishment of the CDC and served as its President for three different terms in three different decades as his terms were from 1906-1907, 1911-1912, 1921-1922.

Funded by his father, a civil war veteran, he traveled to Europe to secure cattle. The Dorsets caught his eye so 6 head were bought and brought to America. The Henderson Family imported 300 head from England and the Isle of Wight from 1887-1891 and was an impact flock in the Dorset breed in America. J.B. Henderson organized the breed book, incorporated the bible verse "Feed My Lambs" into the corporate seal and led the organization the remainder of his life. A true pioneer.

J.R. Henderson

J.R. "Raymond" Henderson, Hickory, PA was the Secretary of the Continental Dorset Club from 1923-1974, over 50 years. He saw and served 39

different Presidents of the CDC, a feat probably unmatched in any other purebred livestock breed registry in the United States. With this stability in the Dorset association, it was made into a very strong breed registry. It was during his tenure that the Polled Dorsets were accepted into the breed records, a transition greater than some that have almost destroyed other breed associations.

The Henderson Dorset flocks, Locust Grove/Valley View existed for a period of 93 years. The Valley View flock was instrumental in supplying breeding stock and outstanding rams to many other breeders. J.R. Henderson showed the flocks at many major shows, traveling by rail car, all over the country including Chicago Internationals and World Fairs. One of the last shows for the flock was the World's Fair at Treasure Island, San Francisco in 1939. J.R. showed both Champions and Flying Horse Farm, of Maine had both reserve champions. The champions received trophies and the reserves received \$100 in cash, J.R said he could have used that \$200.00.

J.R Henderson was a man of high character and rigorously promoted the Dorset breed. He always took time and talent to help youth across the country. Certainly, a man not to forget.

Marion Henderson Meno

Marion Meno, Hudson, IA served as the Continental Dorset Club's Secretary from 1974-1998. A great limb on the family tree, Marion grew up in the Dorset office making Marion a natural to continue the family tradition of being a great Dorset breed secretary and promoter.

The job became bigger and tougher with ever increasing registrations and transfers as they topped out during her tenure in 1990 with 19,531 head registered and 12,620 transferred. She managed with the same integrity and attention to detail that was demanded.

Marion carried the association through its very special 100th Year Centennial Celebration during 1998 and assisted with the development of the "History of the Continental Dorset Club and Dorset Sheep" book, which remains an important part of the Dorset sheep story here in the United States.

Marion's attendance at shows and sales across the country was always a bright spot. It was great to see Marion at Illinois, as this was the first time we have seen her since her retirement 14 years ago. A true Dorset icon.

DORSET HALL of FAME PROGRAM

The Dorset Hall of Fame inducted its first class this year in Illinois with five exceptional individuals. The CDC will be inducting nominees every year at the CDC Annual Meeting that is held in conjunction with the National Dorset Sale. In 2013, we will be having the National Sale in Reno so please make your nominations by December 31st as there are many deserving Dorset pioneers that deserve to be recognized. The CDC already has two honorary directors that will automatically be included into the Hall of Fame. In the 1960's, two men were given these honorary directorships who were leaders in the foundation and subsequent acceptance of the Polled Dorsets:

-Dr. Lemuel Goode: Professor of Animal Science at North Carolina State College, Raleigh, NC was a major force of the development of the Polled Dorset Flock at NCSC. The first "hornless" ram was born in 1954, they registered him as NCS402. For the next four years studies and breeding programs were conducted so by 1958, 150 "hornless" Dorsets were in the NC State Flock and nearby farms. Fifteen Polled Dorset rams were released to outside flocks around the country and the breed was truly born in America.

-Alex McKenzie: a veteran shepherd at the Oklahoma State University, Stillwater, OK, CDC Director and well-known sheep judge, was a leader in the expansion of the Polled Dorsets in America. He was truly a "flockmaster" and had use with great skill all the talents it takes to breed, rear, fit, exhibit and judge sheep. He was a born teacher and mentor to many individual students that went on to be great livestock men.

What If....Lambs Were Priced on a Grid?

Here come the lambs! Fat ones, skinny ones, tall ones, short ones. The restaurant owner wants lamb chops all the same size, but what's a packer to do? They now come in all different sizes. What if...lambs were priced on a grid to reward producers for carcasses, and lamb chop, sizes that the retail market wants?

Beef. It comes in a box. Why does it fit in that box? It fits in the box because carcasses are more uniform in size in that industry as compared to the lamb industry. How did the beef industry get to that point? Well, one way was by dictating price premiums based on quality and carcass size. Granted, the beef industry is much larger than the lamb industry and so they have more carcasses to choose from, but the key is that they have goals for end weights on the cattle and thus are able to package more uniform sized cuts of beef.

If the lamb industry wanted to move forward so that lean, heavy muscled lambs were afforded a premium, then we would need to develop a pricing grid. Let's take a look at what that might mean. Dr. Dave Notter gave a presentation to the students in the Howard Wyman Sheep Leadership School a few years ago and in that presentation, he gave an example of what a pricing grid might look like.

In this pricing grid, lamb carcass weights of 55 to 85 pounds at a yield grade 1 or lamb carcass weights at 75 to 85 pounds and a yield grade 2 or 3 would denote the base price. All other weights and yield grades would have prices adjusted up or down. To receive a premium on this grid, shepherds would need to produce lamb carcasses that weighed between 55 and 75 pounds with a yield grade of 2 or 3. This would give the shepherd a price premium of \$12 per hundred pounds (cwt) above the base price. Lambs that did not meet the base specifications would be docked in price from \$5 to \$50/cwt. Keep in mind that the packer will also want adequately muscled lambs that meet the weight and fat thickness specifications. The deepest discount for lambs would be those that are very heavy and very fat, while the smallest discount would be seen for small thin lambs. If this grid were to go into effect with your lamb market, how would your lambs rate? If most of your lambs don't typically fall into that premium market grid, how will you make changes to meet that market?

Changes in flocks will most likely come from changes in genetics. So, sire selection becomes even more important in flocks that define their products and markets for meat. A great way to take the guesswork out of sire selection is to choose rams that not only meet visual appraisal characteristics, but also meet performance data criteria through genetic selection tools. EPD's such as loin eye area, body weight, and fat thickness are all useful for selecting rams that are more likely to produce lambs that meet carcass specifications. You can also use ultrasound measurements for carcass data to make decisions regarding selecting rams or replacement ewe lambs if you don't have access to EPD information.

So, where will your next ram come from and what tools will you use to make your selection? And, how will you use these tools to position your flock above the average flock? To answer these questions, know your own lamb market and what defines value in that market. Then, you can look to the future to meet market demands for higher quality lamb carcasses.




2012 DORSET BREEDER EXCELLENCE AWARD APPLICATION REVISED

NEW JUNIOR EWE PURCHASE GRANT PROGRAM SET-UP

The CDC and NJDA (*National Junior Dorset Association*) will be providing two \$500 purchase grants to junior Dorset breeders to put towards the purchase of a Dorset ewe for their breeding programs. These grants will be awarded annually and in two age divisions: Jr. 8-13 years fo age and Sr. 14 to 18 years of age. An individual may win each division only one time. 1st so the grants can be announced by January 1st enabling the grant winners to make plans for their ewe purchases. 

REGIONAL JUNIOR SHOW ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Following are the eligibility requirements for the Regional Junior Dorset Shows for your information:

1) Exhibitor must be a current member of the CDC whether in the youth enrollment program or as a lifetime member.

2) Exhibitor needs to be 21 years old or younger as of January 1st of the current year. There is no lower age limit but the exhibitor must be able to lead

and/or control the head of his/her animal in the show ring.

3) Exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless physically impaired. The junior owner will need to be at the head of the animal controlling it in the show ring, unless of course they have more than one entry in a class in which case another junior exhibitor showing their second animal is acceptable.

4) Sheep must be registered in the youth's name. Youth partnerships are acceptable except for futurity animals which must be in the individual youth owner's name ONLY. Farm names or continued on page 20

"family" ownerships are not acceptable.

5) Exhibitor can show at an unlimited number of regional junior shows per year, the CDC does prefer they at least show at the regional show in which they reside if possible.

7) **EWE FUTURITY PROGRAM:** Your futurity ewe can earn double points at a regional junior show for the futurity ewe program. If you show at more than one regional show only your top point total will be doubled.

Regional junior shows are sometimes held in conjunction with existing shows so there definitely may be other show specific rules and regulations that apply. Please be aware of these additional requirements when making out your entries to these special shows.

2012 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION AVAILABLE ON-LINE

The National Junior Dorset Association annually presents up to three \$1000 scholarships. To qualify, a student must be completing at least half of his or her college or technical school studies the year in which the application is made or be enrolled in graduate school.

These awards are available to current and previous members of the Continental Dorset Club Youth Enrollment Program or current lifetime members of the Continental Dorset Club. Applicants may be majoring or specializing in any type of field as these awards are not limited to agricultural majors.

The application must be postmarked **September 1, 2012**. Two letters of recommendation must be enclosed with the application. The individual completing the recommendation may return it to you in a sealed envelope, which has been signed over the flap. Send applications to:
