DIVERSIFICATION OF THE AMERICAN DORSETS

For the first time in several years the Dorset registration numbers have increased and this rise can be attributed to the diversification of the American Dorset. Times are a changing in the purebred and commercial sheep industries. In order for a breed to survive and flourish the breed needs to adapt to the demands of these industries to remain competitive. The sheep industry across America is a very diverse in the type and kinds of sheep that work best in the productions systems implemented in the different areas of the country and the Dorset breed offers all the diversifications to fit these needs.

When the Dorset breed standard was revised a decade ago, there was a large size variance implemented when it came to height as it was felt that the genetic base should be varied to allow breeders to go where they need to obtain frame size or lack of, to fit the demands of their individual breeding programs. Very few points on the scorecard was placed on height, instead the emphasis was to be placed more on volume, capacity, body length, muscling, structural correctness and breed character, no matter the height of the animal. It was felt that the most important parts of the Dorset breed is its ability to lamb easily out of season while being a great mothering breed during lambing and still maintaining desirable carcass traits and the white wool that can be marketed very easily.

Today, I get phone calls from potential buyers of Dorset sheep and inevitably the conversation turns to, "What kind of Dorsets are you looking for?". You will be surprised as to how many different answers there are. We have show ring breeding type; show ring wether type; polled or horned, smaller framed animals to produce quality "Easter" lambs; medium frame, thick topped sheep to produce the 120 pound slaughter weight animal that sells well at farmers markets and directly to restaurants; larger framed sheep that produce the heavier 140 lb carcasses for the commercial lamb market; small frame sheep that can thrive on a pasture based nutritional system only due to restrictive concentrate costs and availability; and the list goes on and on. The reason why they want Dorsets is because they are a meat type sheep breed that breeds easily out of season, mothers well and the wool is still a marketable product. To be profitable today you need to market even the 'bleat' to ensure income and the Dorset

breed fills that bill.

With the direct farm to table markets opening up, the challenge of providing a constant stream of product all year long is an issue and the Dorset breed can help with this problem very well. Naturally or with drug induced heat synchronization the Dorset breed reacts the best. They also excel for breeders utilizing the AI and ET reproductive technology, as their results out perform other breeds. Because of this it has allowed a lot of imported semen to come into the United States introducing outside purebred Dorset genetics to be introduced into the American Dorset genetic pool to help the Dorset breed to obtain the diversification needed without going out of breed, which can contaminate the Dorset breed characters that breeders try very hard to maintain.



Over the years the Dorset breed has remained an important part of the American sheep industry and it is because of the commitment of Dorset breeders to produce the type of Dorset that works best for them. The Continental Dorset Club has remained dedicated to promoting all kinds Dorsets. It is very easy to promote the show ring Dorsets as that is where historically the activities have been focused and was the showcase for a breed. It is more of a challenge to promote Dorset breeders who produce superior seed stock that excel in the production oriented aspects of the

sheep industry. Hopefully through supporting ram tests, encouraging NSIP program participation, focusing a part of every Dorset Connection to production issues, identifying Dorset breeders as to which type of Dorsets they emphasize to future buyers in the Dorset Breeders Directory as well as implementing a Dorset Breeder Excellence program that recognizes a breeder's accomplishments, will help the Continental Dorset Club in its endeavors in promoting all aspects of the breed. The CDC does have a production committee that does meet to offer ideas and suggestions to the CDC to assist the association in remaining supportive of all aspects of the Dorset breed.

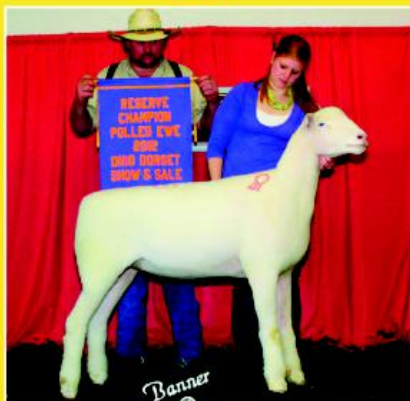

DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

I Pick That One! Sheep Selection Tools

Sheep selection should involve more than just visual selection characteristics. There are a number of tools available for selection, but the key is to combine operation goals with production benchmarks and visual appraisal to select the best sheep for your farm. Plus, producers should take a look at an often overlooked part of the selection process: culling strategies.

Not all sheep are created equal and not all farms are created equal. Before you even walk out to the barn to look at the sheep, the first thing you should do is define your market. Who are you selling to and what does your customer want? You will then be able to define what characteristics are important for your ewe flock to exhibit. Then, step two is to evaluate current characteristics exhibited by your ewes and decide what traits need improved upon. You might take out a tablet and a pencil and write down what you feel are the 5 most important characteristics of your ideal ewe. Compare that to what is most important to your customer.

Does your operation have any goals and production benchmarks? What type of selection principles do you need to employ in order to reach those goals? Where are you at currently with production and how do you reach your benchmarks? After you answer those questions, add one more question into the mix. Do you remember the typical job interview question “where do you want to be in 10 years?” This is a good time to sit down and think about what your sheep and your sheep operation should look like 10 years from now.

Let's take a look at an example flock. This flock produces lambs for breeding stock. Buyers are looking for moderate sized sheep with good muscling, structural correctness and the ability to perform well on pasture. The producer also wants to increase the lambing percentage so there are more lambs to sell. So, where does this producer start when selecting replacement ewes and rams to breed to the flock?

When the sheep are lambing, the producer should be tracking data such as birth weight, birth type and weaning weight. The producer can also record body condition scores at certain times throughout the year to assess a ewe's ability to maintain body condition on pasture. Because the buyers want heavy muscling, the producer can use ultrasound scanning to assess loin eye size and back-fat thickness. Lighter muscled animals that don't meet a minimum production benchmark can be sent to the sale barn. The data collected by the scanner is also useful as a marketing tool to show buyers the amount of muscling in the animals. All the performance data mentioned so far can also be evaluated through NSIP/Lambplan to develop genetic breeding values that are a more accurate measure of performance.

Because the producer wants to increase lambing percentage, he or she may focus on selecting replacements that were born as twins. But, the producer also needs to be aware of other factors that affect twinning besides genetics. Nutrition is a very important part of the equation, so evaluation of feeds and feed quality will be important.

The last step is for the producer to visually appraise the animals for structural correctness: level top, level dock, correct set to legs, strong pasterns. You might also consider body capacity and muscle shape and design. Short hipped, round muscled animals tend to walk with a short stride and can have problems at lambing time. If your sheep have many hills in their pasture, freedom of movement can be very important. Purebred Dorsets should also exhibit certain breed characteristics. Refer to the breed standards for more information on what a Dorset should look like.

Once the sheep has passed all these selection parameters it is now ready for marketing. Think about what characteristics of your sheep and farm set you apart from others so that your customer prefers what you produce? Focus on those characteristics in your marketing efforts.

Let's throw in a couple points on culling strategies. If there are families of ewes within your flock who never produce twins, perhaps it is time for them to hit the road. Young ewes will often produce just one lamb in their first pregnancy. However, they should have the ability to produce twins once they are more mature. Or is there some other reason why this ewe doesn't produce twins? Is she normally too thin? Is she prone to internal parasites? A yes answer to either of these questions is certainly reason to cull this ewe and remove her genetics from the flock.

Sheep selection is an important part of building the genetics in your flock to meet your production goals. Set some production benchmarks that you want to achieve this year, in two years and even ten years down the road.

Don't forget that for the second year in the Junior and Open Polled Dorset Shows:

There will be separate slick sheared and fitted champions selected that will then compete for the overall Champion Polled Rams and Ewes. Also, note that the junior breeding sheep showmanship classes will be late Friday afternoon. The classes will be divided by age and all breeds will show together. Please make sure you review the special rules in the Dorset section of the premium book for both the open and junior shows as they will be adhered to. **For open show**

exhibitors: In addition to sending in your entries and entry fees to the NAILE when entering the show, please don't forget to send in the matching \$10.00 per individual entry in the Open Polled and Horned Dorset shows directly to the CDC Office. This enables the CDC to provide matching funds and to guarantee at least \$10.00 per individual entry in premiums. **These matching funds need to be sent to the CDC office ASAP if you haven't done so yet. They need to be paid prior to the show.** Please note that junior show sheep do not have to send in matching funds unless they are staying on to be shown in the open shows.

Looking forward to seeing everyone in Louisville this year and to another great set of National Dorset Shows!

2012 DORSET EWE FUTURITY UPDATE

The Dorset Ewe Futurity Program has once again been active this year with point records forms coming into the CDC office. A total of \$4,375 has been raised to pay out to the participants of the Dorset futurity divisions. Following this article is a list of all the nominators. We were fortunate to have three group nominators this year. Spilde Brothers, Olivia Waggoner and the Cas-sell Family were group nominators at the 2012 sales. Thank-you to all the nominators for sup-

porting this program once again! A complete list of all the breeder nominators are listed on the back cover of this newsletter.

181 ewe lambs have been nominated this year, 148 polled ewe lambs and 33 horned dorsets. Of those, 81 have been designated by their new junior owners for participation in the futurity program. To date the CDC office has received point record forms from 31 of these junior owners. All these figures are up from a year ago! In the polled dorset futurity program there has been participation from 5 out of the 6 regions.

Don't forget that you don't have to show at a regional junior show to be eligible for premiums but exhibitors are still rewarded for attending regional shows as they are awarded double points. **These point record forms need to be received in the CDC office within 21 days of the date of the show or they will not count. They also need to be signed by show management. Also, the deadline to send in Regional Point Record forms into the CDC Office is Nov. 5th.** This allows the office enough time to tabulate final regional placing before Louisville. Those regional points will carry over to your Louisville junior show placing if you are attending that show to compete for the separate Louisville premiums.

The yearling ewe division had 5 yearlings nominated. Keep sending those point record forms in on the yearling ewes. The yearling ewe futurity will also end at the National Junior Dorset Show in Louisville like the ewe lamb program.

All the regional polled ewe lamb winners will be announced and recognized at the National Junior Association Meeting on Saturday, November 10th in Louisville. So, if you are a regional winner please be on hand to receive your special recognition! Immediately after the junior shows on Sunday, November 11th, the final national placings will be announced in the polled ewe lamb, horned ewe lamb and yearling ewe futurities. Rosettes will be given out along with the breeder recognition.

The futurity points are updated on a regular basis on the CDC website to keep everyone apprised of point totals. We do this so you can make sure that the CDC office has received all your point record forms. If you have any questions please feel free to contact the CDC Office. The final update will be posted the week before Louisville after I have received everyone's point record forms by the deadline of November 5th. Good luck to all of the participants!

If you have sheep over 2 years of age, at the time of application, then the cost is only 50% at \$3.50 per head for CDC adult and youth members.

To date there have only been a few breeders taking advantage of this opportunity. It is only offered once every few years and it is so important to keep the registrations up on your purebred Dorsets so PLEASE send in those registrations today! The CDC remains committed to providing our members with special programs to enable you to keep your sheep papered for all your marketability needs.

2012 PENNSYLVANIA RAM TEST RESULTS

In the 2012 Pennsylvania Ram test sale held in early August there were 8 Polled Dorset rams offered for sale averaging \$544.00. Five area Dorset breeders had rams on test. The high selling ram was consigned by Sunny Valley Farm-Brian & Cerrita Reed, Manheim, PA. This fall born Dorset sold for \$900 to Rockin' R Farm, Paxinos, PA. Conemaugh Valley Dorsets-Gary Kwisnek, Clarksburg, PA had the highest indexing Dorset ram on test with a 173 ADG ratio. This spring born ram sold for \$800 also to Rockin' R Farms, Paxinos, PA. The Dorset ram with the highest weight per day of age ratio was a spring born lamb consigned by Hollystone Farm, Paoli, PA. This ram sold for \$600 to John Jacob Waltz, Smithsburg, MD.

The Dorset breed remains one of the largest breeds on test at the Pennsylvania Ram test. Congratulations to all of the consignors and buyers.

REMINDER

~Dorset Excellence Program~

Program is open to ALL breeders of REGISTERED Dorset Sheep. All types of registered sheep i.e. wether type, commercial, traditional or show breeding stock Dorset sheep are eligible. The program will include both Dorset Horns and Polled Dorsets with each competing separately.

The Dorset Excellence Program will be conducted annually from January 1st through December 31st. Each entry submission will be judged strictly on an anonymous basis. At no time will judges know which breeder corresponds with submission materials.

NEW: Nominations may be made by outside individuals but the breeder themselves will need to fill out the actual questionnaire and provide supportive materials. To make an outside nomination please just fill out the cover sheet of the application and submit to the CDC Office. Please do this ASAP to enable time for the nominee to get the application together. The CDC Office will notify the nominee of his/her nomination.

The judging criterion for the program is based upon a guidelines system at the discretion of the judging committee. Each submission will be judged against the Dorset Breed Standard. Entries will not be judged against each other. Winner(s) will be announced the year at appropriate events for the winners.

ENTRY INFORMATION:

Breeders will be asked to fill out a short questionnaire, provide any photos of your operation and Dorset sheep (as many or few pictures may be submitted with the application) and furnish a short statement about their flock's purposes and goals.

-Submission Requirements:

1. Provide photos of your operation and Dorset sheep. As few or as many photos may be submitted. Either black & white or color photos are acceptable. High clarity/pixel size is best. Photos can be submitted electronically or in hard copy. Please be aware that these photos may be used by the CDC for promotional purposes. Examples of possible photos to be submitted are: brood ewe flock, stud ram, replacement females, young lambs, head shots of any animal, farmstead photo, barn facilities, etc.
2. Fill out the Questionnaire and your Flock Purposes & Goals Statement by requesting an entry be mailed to you by the Continental Dorset Club or enter online.

You should be able to submit all requirements for this program via email. In case you have difficulties doing so, please request the entry form be mailed to you and submit all pictures and questionnaire in hard copy via the US mail.
