2012 DORSET BREEDER EXCELLENCE WINNER DORSETS N' DAYLILIES - KIRSTEN HATFIELD

The 2012 Dorset Breeder Excellence Winner is Dorsets N' Daylilies owned and operated by Jason & Kirsten Hatfield in Zanesville, Ohio. Kirsten has been in the Dorset business since 1980, formerly operating under the Nutty Acres Farm name. Since they have also been raising high quality daylilies since 1986, Kirsten and Jason combined their farming enterprise under one name last year to Dorset N' Daylilies. The Hatfields run about 150 registered Dorset ewes and 25 head of Dorset cross ewes in Southeastern Ohio on strip mine ground. They produce a Dorset that will work for all types of producers, whether they are commercial, production, frame or wether. They strive to have Dorsets that are full of meat, three dimensional, easy keeping, prolific with a good lambing percentage twice a year, hardy and naturally fall lambing. They run a low input system so the brood ewes must keep themselves and



bring in at least 2 lambs a year to the barn or they don't remain in the flock. They have also utilized the Dorsets in their crossbred flock using them on black face crossbred ewes and Dorper cross ewes to produce lambs for the growing commercial sector.

Dorsets N' Daylilies expect their ewes to breed as lambs and lamb for the first time by the time they are 14-16 months old, They are bred the first time to a full blood dorper ram to produce roaster lambs for the ethnic market. Not only does this produce a quality lamb for this market but also assists the virgin lambers in ease of lambing with reduced birth weights. After the first lambing, then they are ex-

posed to a purebred Dorset. All of their lambs are weaned at 50 - 60 days of age and the ewes, both mature and ewe lambs, are then exposed for either spring or fall lambing.


The Dorsets N' Daylilies flock is promoted by a very nice website www.dorsetsdaylilies.com, and they also have a facebook page. They are also involved in the 4-H program as Kirsten serves as a club advisor. They promote the Dorset breed to anyone who will listen and are strong supporters of new sheep producers and will help out anyone who calls 24/7. The Hatfields are strong supporters of the youth through different events and the junior fair livestock sales. Congratulations to Kirsten and her family on this very well deserved recognition!







OHIO DORSET SALE GETS THINGS STARTED

It always feels good to head to Eaton, Ohio in the mid March to start the new year of purebred sheep sales because you know that the long winter season will be coming to an end soon. This year is took a little longer for winter to end but the Ohio Dorset Sale was another pretty successful event.

The sale sold 135 head of Polled Dorsets that averaged \$1020.00 per head and the Horned portion of the sale sold 43 head averaging \$631.40. The Horned Dorsets also had a new breed record broken as the Grand Champion Horned Ram from the Kim Root Family, Carroll OH sold to Houfe Dorsets from Milton, WI for \$3800. Congratulations to them both!

The high selling ram of the Polled Sale was the popular Senior Champion Fall Yearling Ram from Spilde Brothers, Stoughton, WI that sold



to Sidney DeVries, IL for \$7000. The Grand Champion Polled Ram from Riverwood also garnished a great price at \$4600 and five othe rams brought over \$1000. It is becoming more and more apparent that the potential elite stud rams are the ones bringing the good prices at these sales. The better than average rams are just not demanding the good prices at this time. The Polled Dorset ewe division had several females bring well over \$1000. High selling polled dorset ewe was the Junior Champion fall ewe lamb entry from Twin Oaks Dorsets, OH that sold to Johanna DeJoria of Oregon for \$5000. Right behind her price wise, was the Grand Champion Polled Ewe, a fall born yearling ewe from T & T Dorsets, IL that sold for \$4750 to Olivia Waggoner of East Berlin, PA. The fall yearling ewe class sold very well as the class averaged \$1329.17, the highest class average of the sale, and the early fall ewe class also averaged just above \$1000. Spilde Brothers of Stoughton, WI was named the Townsend Best Consignor for the Polled portion of the sale.

The Horned Dorset sale not only featured the new record price for a ram but also the Grand Champion Ewe from Cassell Horned Dorsets, Wytheville, VA sold for an impressive \$2000 price to new breeder Steve Vessels from Vine Grove, KY. The yearling ewe class also posted the highest class average at \$712.50 with other quality females being sold. The horned sale had several new breeders purchasing which is a great sign for their continuing growth. Kim Root & Family was named the Townsend Best Horned Dorset Sale consignor with their impressive set of fall lambs they entered, which included both horned champions. The complete sale report and more pictures can be found on pages 15-17 of this newsletter.

Outside of the show and sale ring at the sale, the Dorset breed can be very proud of its continued support of the youth in the Dorset breed. This year at the Ohio Sale the National Junior Dorset Association ran a silent auction to raise funds for their association and scholarship program. There were several items donated for the fundraiser and it brought in \$675 for the NDJA. Thank-you to all the donors and bidders!

Funding also needed to be raised for the upcoming Dorset shows at the All American Junior Show this July in Michigan. Riverwood Farms and Shepherd's View-The Passwaters Family donated 6 straws of "Premium Pickle" Semen, Tad Thompson-Reproduction Specialty Group donated 5 Al services and Patoka Valley Sheep donated the proceeds from the sale of their horned yearling ewe entry at the sale. Junior Dorset breeders, Michael Pope and Sally Squires, also went through the barns soliciting class sponsors for the All American and they did a great job as they handed me completely full sheets of sponsors! Thanks to everyone there was \$2,720 raised for the Dorset sponsorship at the show this summer. The Ohio Dorset Association continues its support of their youth by presenting

their 2013 scholarship to Tyler Myers, Rushsylvania. OH. Congratulations to Tyler!


The Dorset Futurity program had tremendous breeder support as all but one polled ewe lamb was nominated and the majority of the horned ewe lambs were nominated. There were 71 dorset ewe lambs nominated by the breeders and of those 34 of them were purchased by junior breeders, making them eligible for the 2013 Dorset Futurity program. A great start once again to the futurity program! Last year there was a payout of premiums and awards of \$5132.88 to our junior buyers.

It is great to work with a breed that is so committed to their youth. Everyone steps up and helps out, a true testament to a great group of Dorset breeders. Looking forward to another great year in the Dorset breed!



What Are You Doing to **Increase Lamb Consumption?**

While total numbers of sheep and lambs in the United States is declining, so is the average consumption of lamb by consumers. The laws of supply and demand dictate that if supply decreases, then demand should increase. But, if demand for lamb is decreasing as well as the supply of lamb, perhaps as producers we need to take a look at what we are doing to increase the consumption of lamb in the United States.

According to the Ag Marketing Resource Center, per capita lamb consumption in 1990 was 1.6 lbs. and this

declined to 0.88 lbs. in 2011. If we compare this to per capita lamb consumption in Australia and New Zealand, we are looking at 26 lbs. and 25 lbs. respectively. The United States boasts a very large number of meat eating consumers, so what is preventing people from eating lamb? The American Lamb board states "more than one third of consumers have never had the opportunity to taste lamb."

The Ag MRC report also says "Domestically, lamb is not a strong competitor with other animalsourced proteins such as beef, pork, and poultry. Given that most meat consumers never consume lamb, its substitutability with other red meat products is guite limited. However, lamb must compete for retail shelf space with other meat products."

One other challenge that we as sheep producers face is that lamb is consumed mostly during the spring holidays rather than all year. This

creates challenges for processors who try to keep a consistent and constant supply of fresh lamb available all year. What can you

as a producer do to encourage people to enjoy American lamb? Here are a few thoughts that I have for producers to consider:

1. Educational displays at state and local fairs: We all know that the general public is several generations removed from the farm and so have no concept of how their food is produced. Most states have sheep and wool growers' organizations that can develop a display for their state

fair. Members can staff the display and answer questions that the public has about lamb and wool production. The most often asked question that I answered this year at the PA Farm Show (PA's state fair) was "where can I find lamb locally.? The easiest way to answer this question was to pull out a member directory for the PA Sheep and Wool Growers Association and find a producer located near them.

2. Serve lamb when friends come to dinner: Yes, this is certainly a "no-brainer." But, what if you also give your friends the recipe? Or better yet, order some recipe brochures from the American Lamb Board and share these with friends and family. It seems that so many people not only don't take time to cook these days, but they also don't know how to cook. Supplying folks with a recipe certainly encourages them to try lamb at home.

3. Get youth involved in promoting lamb: Our local

fair's lamb show continues to grow each year and that means the number of lambs sold through the Youth can help with promotion by giving out recipes and cooking instructions to potential buyers. The also get youth involved in serving ing samples safely!)

4. Post your farm information on foodie type websites: The local foods movement is very strong in certain areas across the country. Posting your farm information and availability of lamb for sale is a great way to increase the availability of lamb to consumers. Our local grocery stores don't always carry lamb, but consumers may be looking to buy lamb during those times of the year when lamb isn't avail-

USING TECHNOLOGY TO REACH PRODUCERS

A recent series of educational workshops held online by Ohio State University (OSU) Extension experts geared toward sheep and goat farmers has drawn more than 1,300 views so far from farmers in Ohio, Indiana and West Virginia, OSU Extension educator, Jeff McCutcheon, says.

The 2013 Sheep and Goat WebEx Program Series was presented over four days at 18 sites statewide in February using a WebEx online format as part of an ongoing effort to reach as many producers as possible on issues relevant to growing and enhancing their operations.

"The need is there for this kind of programing, and based on feedback that we've gotten thus far, the program is a success," McCutcheon said. "A majority of participants, 93 percent, said they gained knowledge from viewing the program; and 63 percent said they planned to make a change to their operation based on the information learned through the program."

Topics for the series included:

- Vaccination Programs for Sheep and Goat Operations;
- Artificial Insemination Techniques of Sheep and Goats;

- Managing Pastures and Hay Fields after a Drought;
- Use of EAZI-BREED CIDR for Sheep and Goat Operations.

Valuable insights to agri-marketers include:


*Americans crave more information about food production: 69 percent of consumers think it's important to understand how their food is produced.

*When you can't bring consumers to the


farm, bring the farm to consumers: 19 percent of people who visit farms feel better about the safety and quality of the food they eat.



also knew that June's first love were her Dorsets.





REGIONAL JUNIOR SHOW ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Following are the eligibility reguirements for the Regional Junior Dorset Shows for your information:

- 1) Exhibitor must be a current member of the CDC whether in the youth enrollment program or as a lifetime member.
- 2) Exhibitor needs to be 21 years old or younger as of January 1st of the current year. There is no lower age limit but the exhibitor must be able to lead

and/or control the head of his/her animal in the show ring.

- 3) Exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless physically impaired. The junior owner will need to be at the head of the animal controlling it in the show ring, unless of course they have more than one entry in a class in which case another junior exhibitor showing their second animal is acceptable.
- 4) Sheep must be registered in the youth's name. Youth partnerships are acceptable except for futurity animals which must be in the individual youth owner's name ONLY. Farm names or

family" ownerships are not acceptable.

5) Exhibitor can show at an unlimited number of regional junior shows per year, the CDC does prefer they at least show at the regional show in which they reside if possible.

7) EWE FUTURITY PROGRAM:

Your futurity ewe can earn double points at a regional junior show for the futurity ewe program. If you show at more than one regional show only your top point total will be doubled.

Regional junior shows are sometimes held in conjunction with existing shows so there definitely may be other show specific rules and regulations that apply. Please be aware of these additional requirements when making out your entries to these special shows.

2013 SCHOLARSHIP **APPLICATION** AVAILABLE ON-LINE

The National Junior Dorset Association annually presents up to three \$1000 scholarships. To qualify, a student must be completing at least half of his or her college or technical school studies the year in which the application is made or be enrolled in graduate school.

These awards are available to current and previous members of the Continental Dorset Club Youth Enrollment Program or current lifetime members of the Continental Dorset Club. Applicants may be majoring or specializing in any type of field as these awards are not limited to agricultural majors.

The application must be postmarked September 1, 2013. Two letters of recommendation must be enclosed with the application. The individual completing the recommendation may return it to you in a sealed envelope, which has been signed over the flap. Send applications to:







