

Body Condition: One More Evaluation Tool

Body condition, or fat cover, is one more evaluation tool that sheep producers can use to evaluate their sheep flock and management practices. Producers should evaluate sheep at key times throughout the year such as prior to breeding season, late pregnancy and at weaning. Evaluate body condition at these key times not only for profitability, but also for the health and welfare of the animals.

Body condition is typically evaluated using a scale from 1 to 5 for sheep. The scale allows you to assess the amount of fat covering on the animal. A score of 1 means the animal is extremely thin while a score of 5 means that the animal is extremely fat. Ideally, ewes should have an average body condition score of 3 to 4 at lambing. A score of 3 means that the spinous bones are smoothly covered with fat but can still be felt with some pressure. The loin eye muscle should be full and should be covered with some fat. Females that are thin at breeding are likely to produce fewer lambs than ewes in good body condition. In addition, ewes that are thin at lambing are like to produce smaller and less vigorous lambs. Females that are too fat are more like to have birthing difficulty and may also have problems with pregnancy toxemia. Very thin ewes are more prone to pregnancy toxemia also if they are not receiving adequate nutrition.

As sheep producers, we often take advantage of spring's high quality pastures to get animals to gain weight to increase body condition score. We also take advantage of the high quality nutrition in pasture grasses for milk production. This increased milk production benefits young animals nursing their mother or can benefit ewes that will be rebred shortly after weaning. It can take as long as four to six weeks to make any major changes in an animal's body condition score, so it is important to evaluate body condition throughout the year.

Let's take a look at an example of how this works in a flock. If the average body condition score of a ewe flock is less than the recommended 3 to 4 body condition score, then the producer should evaluate the feed quality as well as feed quantity. If only a few ewes are too thin, then the producer may want to evaluate those ewes individually. The producer can then answer some questions. Is there

some problem other than feed quality or quantity that causes these ewes to carry less condition? Should these ewes be culled or do I need to separate them from the main flock and feed them differently?" In some cases, a young ewe may be thin because she has done a great job raising her lamb or lambs. In this case, the producer may want to see how that ewe performs the next time she lambs and then re-evaluate her at weaning time. Or, are these ewes thin because they are more susceptible to internal parasites?

For those ewes that are too fat, the producer may want to ask why? If the entire flock is overweight, the producer may need to take a look at the feeding program. Feed makes up a major portion of the cost to keep a ewe and therefore warrants some consideration. Most producers balance rations to meet the nutritional requirements of animals. If producers have only a few ewes that are overweight, they may want to look at the lambs that the ewe weaned. Instead of producing milk for the lambs, did the ewe take the nutrients she consumed and convert them into body fat? If last year's lambs weighed less than the average, the producer should consider the option of culling the ewe. If last year's lambs weighed more than the average, then the producer should be thankful to own a ewe that is very efficient and is an "easy keeper."

Whatever the situation, producers should evaluate body condition throughout the year. Body condition can earn producers money if the ewes are in the proper condition, breed quickly, and produce healthy, vigorous twins that are moderate in birth weight. Time lost in breeding will translate into later born lambs that weigh less at weaning time as well as lambs that reach market weights for harvest later in the year.



We can expect ewes to lose weight while nursing lambs, but they should regain this lost weight quickly once the lambs are weaned. The body condition of the ewe in this photo is acceptable for a ewe that recently weaned lambs.

-National Junior Dorset Association Annual Meeting & Pizza Party: Saturday, Nov. 15th, 7:00 PM

-National Junior Dorset Shows: Sunday, Nov. 16th, 8:00 AM. Polled Dorsets followed by Horned Dorsets, will be second in ring three, judge TBA.

-National Open Dorset Shows: Monday, Nov. 17th, 8:00 AM, Horneds first followed by Polleds. Eric Bruns, Powell, OH will be judging the Polleds and Steve Myers, Rushsylvania, OH will be doing the Horneds.

Don't forget that in the Junior and Open Polled Dorset Shows:
There will be separate slick sheared and fitted champions selected that will then compete for the overall Champion Polled Rams and Ewes. Also, note that the junior breeding sheep showmanship classes will be late Friday afternoon. The classes will be divided by age and all breeds will show together. Please make sure you review the special rules in the Dorset section of the premium book for both the open and junior shows as they will be adhered to.

For open show exhibitors: In addition to sending in your entries and entry fees to the NAGLE when entering the show, please don't forget to send in the matching \$10.00 per individual entry in the Open Polled and Horned Dorset shows directly to the CDC Office. This enables the CDC to provide matching funds and to guarantee at least \$10.00 per individual entry in premiums. These matching funds need to be sent to the CDC office ASAP if you haven't done so yet. They need to be paid prior to the show. Please note that junior show sheep do not have to send in matching funds unless they are staying on to be shown in the open shows.

Looking forward to seeing everyone in Louisville this year and to another great set of National Dorset Shows!

2014 DORSET EWE FUTURITY UPDATE

The Dorset Ewe Futurity Program has once again been active this year with point records forms coming into the CDC office. A total of \$3,350 has been raised to pay out to the participants of the Dorset futurity divisions. We had one group nominator this year, Cassell Horned Dorsets, Wytheville, VA. Thank-you to the 47 nominators for supporting this program once again! A complete list of all the breeder nominators are listed on the back cover of this newsletter. 130 ewe lambs have been nominated this year, 84 polled ewe lambs and 46 horned dorsets. Of those, 49 have been designated by their new junior owners for participation in the futurity program. To date the CDC office has received point record forms from 19 of these junior owners. The polled lamb futurity program has participation from 5 out of the 6 regions.

The CDC accepted nominations from online sales this year and a total of 29 nominations were made by breeders in online sales. 16 junior buyers picked up futurity nominated animals. Remember this next year, that even though you can not physically get to a sale, the online sales offer you an great opportunity to get a futurity nominated ewe lamb.

We also had a "Dorset Advantage" ewe lamb division but there was not any participation. Next year at the National Dorset Sale in Sedalia there will be ewe lambs available for this division as well as online sales.

Don't forget that you don't have to show at a regional junior show to be eligible for premiums but exhibitors are still rewarded for attending regional shows as they are awarded double points.

These point record forms need to be received in the CDC office within 21 days of the date of the show or they will not count. They also need to be signed by show management. Also, the deadline to send in Regional Point Record forms into the CDC Office is Nov. 10th.

This allows the office enough time to tabulate final regional placing before Louisville. Those regional points will carry over to your Louisville junior show placing if you are attending that show to compete for the separate Louisville premiums.

The yearling ewe division had 7 yearlings nominated. Keep sending those point record forms in on the yearling ewes. The yearling ewe futurity will also end at the National Junior Dorset Show in Louisville like the ewe lamb program.

All the regional polled ewe lamb winners will be announced and recognized at the National Junior Association Meeting on Saturday, November 15th in Louisville. So, if you are a regional winner please be on hand to receive your special recognition! Immediately after the junior shows on Sunday, November 16th, the final national placings will be announced in the polled ewe lamb, horned ewe lamb and yearling ewe futurities. Rosettes will be given out along with the breeder recognition.

The futurity points are updated on a regular basis on the CDC website to keep everyone appraised of point totals. If you have any questions please feel free to contact the CDC Office. The final update will be posted the week before Louisville.
