On the CDC facebook page, we reached out to breeders to send us photos of regional accomplishments at shows and we have never had so many great photos to pass along showcasing the quality of the Dorsets being shown around this country, both in the open and junior shows. When it comes to Supreme drives at these events, Dorsets rise to the final lineup more times than not.

This is a reflection of the quality of breeders we have in the Dorset breed that are committed to producing high quality breeding stock and it also very apparent in junior shows as well. This summer the Dorset breed was show cased at the All American in three divisions: Polled. Horned and Dorset Advantage. The number and quality of animals presented in the show ring was unmatched. NEW ENGLAND REGION DIRECTOR RACHAEL GATELY

I was born and raised in northcentral Connecticut where I started raising Polled Dorsets at 7 years old (1993). It has been a rollercoaster ride growing from 2 brood ewes that year to near 50 in the late 90s. We added a small group of purebred Texels in the late 90s as well. I attended the University of Rhode Island from 2004 to 2008, and I came home virtually every weekend to tend to the sheep. I was avidly showing the Dorsets locally with a few trips to the NAILE junior show during college. We decreased numbers and stopped showing when I headed off to Texas for veterinary school in 2008. I graduated from Texas A&M University with my doctorate in veterinary medicine in 2012 and returned home to Connecticut to join Tufts Veterinary Field Service. I practice generalized large animal medicine, but spend most of my time working with dairy cattle, sheep, and goats. I have a special interest in advanced reproductive techniques in small ruminants and have been working to develop a specialty service at our clinic.

Shortly after returning home from veterinary school and revving up to jump back into the show world with my Polled Dorsets, we were hit hard by copper poisoning in the flock and lost the entire lamb crop plus some of my top brood ewes. I spent 2015 acquiring a small and elite set of Polled Dorsets to rebuild my show flock. We jumped back in to showing

in 2016 and are excited where we are are currently running approximately 15 quality Dorset brood ewes in Connecticut. I am also currently serving as Polled Dorset breed secretary of the New England Regional Dorset Junior Show held annually in conjunction with the North East Youth Sheep Show in Massachusetts.

As I dive back into the world of Dorsets full bore, the opportunity to serve on the board only seems fitting. I would be honored to work with the group only to better the Dorset breed!

CONTINENTAL DORSET CLUB 2018 ANNUAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 PM by President Dick Reece om June 28, 2018 at the State Fair Best Western, Sedalia, MO. Directors Michael Pope, Jerry Gross, Glenn Stunkel, Bob Heuvel and New England Director Elect Rachael Gately were in attendance. Director Mike Wright, was on the telephone. CDC Exec. Sec./Treas. Deb Hopkins was also present.

- <u>-Secretary Minutes:</u> Deb Hopkins presented in writing the minutes from the 2017 CDC Fall-Teleconference Meeting held December 12, 2017. Bob Heuvel moved to accept the minutes as written. Michael Pope seconded. Motion passed.
- -Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal 2017-2018 year to date as of June 18, 2018. Total income is \$74,847.70, total expenses is \$70,896.75, for a current net cash income of \$3,950.95. Account balances - Checking Account: \$47,122.54; Savings Account: \$25.00; CD: \$26,205.01; Money Market: \$10.155.18: Junior Association \$32,587.57 for total cash assets of \$116,095.30. Jerry Gross moved to accept the treasurer's report. Michal Pope seconded. Motion passed. Deb Hopkins also presented a proposed budget for 2018-2019 for the board to review as it goes through the meeting. -CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins presented the 2017-2018 statistics to date. As of June 18, 2018: 3898 head have been registered and 2087 head have been

transferred. The registrations are down 10 head from the same period last year and the transfers are up 244 head from the same period last year. In the Dorset Advantage registry, 466 head have been registered to date and 248 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 94 head from the same time period last year and transfers are up 65 head from the same period as last year.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins reported that the Online Sale Futurity Nomination Forms have been pretty well received and has helped out a lot in keeping track of animals nominated in online sales, and also in the collection of those nomination fees. To date there has been 113 polled ewe lambs nominated, 26 horned ewe lambs. 12 dorset advantage ewe lambs for a total of 151 ewe lambs. 5 yearling ewes have been re-nominated for the yearling ewe division. Of the ewe lambs approximately half of them have been bought by junior buvers. There were 75 ewe lambs nominated in online sales. At the National Dorset Sales in Sedalia. 22 more polled ewe lambs have been nominated, 7 horned ewe lambs and 3 dorset advantage bringing the total number of ewe lambs nominated to 183. It should be a good payout for the participants this year.

-Breed Standard Education: Discussion was held on the emergence of black color in the haired portion of the legs on Dorset sheep, as the board has had communication from breeders on the issue. A letter from a breeder was presented to the board. After much discussion Glenn Stunkel moved to create a breed standard review committee to particularly reference the highly objectionable and disqualifying color. The committee is to consist of the board and other regional breeder representatives to make up a committee of 12 people maximum. Michael Pope seconded. Motion carried. The board members will talk to breeders in their regions get names gathered of interested folks to nominate for the committee. This meeting

will take place in August so the actual committee can meet in September so as to get recommendations to the board for the fall teleconference meeting. It was also brought up to do more educational efforts on Online Selling and Buying for breeders and buyers. Mike Wright moved to accept the following names to the CDC Certified Judges List: Kelly Bruns, Joel Parker, Katherine Kuykendall, Alex Wolf and Richard Jacobsen. Michael Pope seconded. Motion carried.

- -Production Committee: It is the recommendation of Bob Heuvel, who attended the NSIP meeting last fall, that the CDC put the Lambplan ID# number on the papers with an explanation of where to go to get the most current up to date performance data on that animal. Deb will talk to Frank Tiffany and get the registry program and registration papers re-designed to provide that information.
- -Dorset Youth Grant Program: The 2018 winners were selected: Junior: Mason Solem, Dawson, MN; Intermediate: Mariah Troutwine, Ansonia, OH and Senior: Shelby

Hagerty, Elbert, CO. They all were notified soon after January 1st of their grant awards. To date, Mason Solem and Mariah Troutwine have purchased animals and have received their grant money.

- -Newsletter and Website: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2018 winter newsletter had strong advertising support and netted an income of \$385.92. This special issue was sent to all buyers of Dorset sheep the previous year whether they were CDC members or not. The 2018 Spring/Summer connection only had 3 paid ads and cost the CDC \$1043.99 to get mailed out. Need to encourage more advertising for this issue to break even, still think it is important to get a spring/summer newsletter out to folks to keep folks tuned into breed happenings.
- -Dorset Hall of Fame: The CDC will recognize Steve Myers at the annual membership meeting tomorrow. The board has also received a nomination for Ron Guenther. Michael Pope moved to honor Ron Guenther this year as part of the 2018 Hall of Fame class at the Ohio State Fair. Glenn Stunkel seconded. Motion passed. The board would like to encourage folks to put in nominations for the 2019 class.
- -All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2018 All-American Junior Show will be June 6-7, 2018 at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, Indianapolis, IN. The Dorset exhibitors and their families will have a meet & greet ice cream social on Saturday sponsored by the Junior Dorset Association. Richard Jacobsen is scheduled to judge the Dorset Advantage show on Saturday night and the Horned & Polled Dorsets on Sunday. Deb would also like to thank Root Family Horned Dorsets for donating a ewe lamb that was sold for the All American, and with all of the classes getting sponsorships and corn hole tourney donation the CDC was able to meet their breed sponsorship commitment. Thanks to the great support of the Dorset breeders in donating semen for the special AAJS semen fundraiser sale, \$1792 of the \$5595 profit came from the Dorset breed. The All American will be in Kansas in

2019 and Michigan in 2020.

-National Junior Association: The junior association is planning on having a meet & greet ice cream social at the 2018 All-American and their 2017 Annual Meeting will be in Louisville in November. The scholarship application has been updated for the 2018 applicants and is posted online.

OLD BUSINESS:

The CDC should also develop an educational informational sheet on the CDC slick shearing policy

and publicize on website/newsletter/facebook page.

2018 DORSET HALL OF FAME CLASS



STEVE MYERS

Steve Myers, Rushsylvania, OH has been associated with the Dorset breed for more than 50 years. His first year in 4-H he showed a pen of 3 lambs which were Horned Dorset ewe lambs. After the fair he purchased those back from the breeder and that was his start in the sheep industry.

From that, Steve transitioned to the Polled Dorsets in 1967. Steve has been breeding, showing and judging sheep from the east to west coast for too many years to remember. In the 1980's and early 1990's Steve's flock was very successful as his show record included 9 National Champions, 2 Supreme Champions at NAILE and 5 Premier Exhibitor Banners at the National Dorset Shows in Louisville.

Over the course of time, Steve decided to move away from the frame sheep and wanted to focus more on the wether type sheep. He always felt if your sheep were good enough they could be slick shorn for show. Many times he found himself showing slicks in fitted classes until shows began offering slick and wether type classes. This past North American he secured the first ever Premier Wether Type Exhibitor Award for the Dorset breed.

Steve has provided leadership to the Dorset Breed through serving on the CDC Board of Directors, serving on the Ohio Dorset Association Board and has received the Ohio Master Shepherd Award from the Ohio Sheep Improvement Association.

Needless to say, Steve has committed his life to sheep, primarily focusing on the Dorset breed.





RON GUENTHER

The name Ron Guenther has always been synonymous with the Dorset breed, and Ron has had a long and successful history.

In 1964, Ron moved from California to Ohio and took the job as Shepherd at The Ohio State University, where he developed a nationally competitive Dorset breeding program. While never exhibiting in large numbers, everyone knew that when Ohio State brought one to the show ring that would be one to contend with at the top of the class. Being a tremendous fitter, Ron would always have the Ohio Dorset Dorsets looking the part. Also while at Ohio State, Ron mentored numerous students who themselves became influential in the purebred sheep industry, and that list is very long. Ron retired from Ohio State in 1990.

Ron helped established a couple of powerhouse Polled Dorset Breeding programs in the late 1980's at Cardinal Creek Farms, Georgetown, OH and later in the early 1990's at Riverwood Farms, Powell, OH, where he worked until 2008. While at CCF, Ron had a hand in developing a ram named CCF "Legacy" who would become arguably the greatest stud ram in the history of the Dorset breed. "Legacy" was acquired by Riverwood Farms and would make an immediate impact there. The "Legacy" gene is carried in a lot of the breed's top individuals today.

Ron's input on both the phenotype and genotype of genetic selection in these two programs was instrumental to the success of the Dorset breed at a time when the breed was reaching an all time high in terms of popularity. He also had input in other successful Ohio Dorset flocks throughout the years, most notably the Paul O. Haynes flock and the Pinewood Stock Farm owned by Walt & Linda Stocker come to mind. Ron has judged numerous shows from coast to coast, and has been a lifelong supporter and promoter of the Dorset breed. Ron has also been a leader for the Dorset breed nationally by serving on the CDC Board of Directors for six years, and as it's President in the early 2000's.

DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

How's Your Forage Quality This Year?

This year has been quite challenging for sheep producers to manage forage quality in pastures and hay. Some areas across the country have seen much higher than normal rainfall and little sunshine. This can really impact forage quality both on pasture and in hay and makes this year's hay especially important to analyze in order to balance rations.

In some cases, forage fiber content limits the ability of animals to eat enough to meet their nutrient requirements. We refer to this as dry matter intake, the completely dry portion of a feed that animals consume. For those of us who live in the Eastern United States, this year has been exceptionally wet. So, instead of fiber limiting dry matter intake, we now see water content in pasture forages limiting intake. Local forage labs have seen a general trend for lower than normal energy and protein levels. Sheep produces will need to account for these deficits when balancing rations this winter.

Most pasture forages contain 75 to 90% moisture, while dry hays usually have less than 15% moisture. We measure moisture content so that we can compare nutrient contents from different feeds on an equal basis. Let's look at an example that compares nutrient contents of grass pasture and grass hay on an as fed basis versus a dry matter basis. The pasture and hay contain the same levels of protein, but we would not be able to determine this without comparing the forages on a dry matter basis.

Whenever we compare the forages on an as fed basis, or in other words as the forage is fed to animals, we see that dry matter is 20% for pasture and 90% for hay. Looking at the protein content of the forages, pasture is 2.2% protein and the hay 9.9% protein as fed. However, these forages actually contain the same percent of protein, 11%, when you remove the water content and consider the forage on a dry matter basis.

The next columns in the table discuss fiber contents expressed as NDF or neutral detergent fiber and ADF or acid detergent fiber. Neutral detergent fiber measures all the fiber components in a forage. These components make up the plant cell walls and include

hemicellulose, cellulose and lignin. As the NDF measurement increases, this tells us that the fiber content increases also. This causes dry matter intake to decrease and the animals chew their cud for longer periods of time. Acid Detergent fiber measures the highly indigestible fibers and as this number increases, digestibility decreases.

To put this into perspective, a legume forage would be considered good quality if the NDF is below 40%. Anything above 50% would be considered poor quality. On the other hand, high quality grass forages should have an NDF below 50%. Low quality grass forages have NDF levels higher than 60%.

The only way to correctly evaluate forages is to have them analyzed. This allows sheep producers to correctly balance rations in order to boost feeding efficiency and profitability. Under feeding nutrients results in slower growth rates, decreased milk production and could even impact lambing percentages. Over feeding nutrients could result in wasted money through feeding more nutrients than the sheep require.

The first step to analyzing forages starts with collecting a representative sample. Forage test results must represent what the animals eat. Samples should be collected from each field and each cutting. Test results vary greatly throughout the year! Use a bale core sampler and insert the sampler to its full depth into the end of each bale you are sampling. Collect at least 20 samples from each field and cutting. Mix samples from each group separately in a clean bucket and place in an airtight plastic bag. Label each bag before sending to your local forage testing laboratory.

Once you receive the forage test results you can then balance rations to make sure sheep receive adequate nutrients throughout different production stages. For more information on forage testing and balancing rations, contact your local Extension Office or a nutritional consultant.



Producers should test forages in order to correctly balance rations to meeting sheep nutritional requirements.

The computer program is getting updated and new papers printed to provide space for these numbers breeders will be providing us. These are long numbers, similar to VIN numbers on a motor vehicle so, we will ask breeders to just provide an excel spreadsheet with those numbers matching up to your private eartag identification on the animals you are registering.

Breeders have been asking for us to do this and now that NSIP has updated their data processing and implemented the Lambplan program, the CDC felt now is the time to provide opportunity for our breeders to get the new ID# actually on the registration papers of NSIP enrolled animals so interested parties can get the most recent data to assist them in their decision making in their breeding programs and making potential purchases of breeding stock.
