ONLINE SALE SELLER & BUYER PROFESSIONAL ETIQUETTE

With the ever growing popularity of online sales to market and purchase livestock, and with all of the conveniences it brings to both buyers and sellers, there are some issues that need to be addressed and brought out. Professional etiquette and buyer awareness needs to be spotlighted to make sure the online buying and selling experience provides a positive and successful experience for all of those involved. Online Sales are proving to be a great marketing tool for many producers and one wants to make sure this venue remains to provide a worthy and valid means of buying and selling livestock.

Professional etiquette is of utmost importance. What exactly does this mean? Etiquette has many definitions but the one that can be applied to the online sale scenario is that "it is a code of behavior regarding professional practice or interaction among the members of a profession in their business dealings with each other." It begins by showing respect for others, being honest and trust worthy, and showing courtesy to others. It creates a professional, mutually respectful atmosphere and improves communication. This behavior goes for both buyers and sellers. I know one can't always control what other people do but you can control what you do and following are some tips to assist you in your particular online sale role.

SELLERS:

-Be prompt in your dealings with your online Sale Management team. They are in the business of providing you with the platform and means for selling your animals. They work on a timeline and that timeline needs to be adhered to get your sale promoted in a proper manner that will be most beneficial for you. Once your sale date and sales banner have been posted, make sure you get the all of the sale information to them in a timely manner to get

posted for your actual sale. This includes quality photos a/o videos, lot information, sale terms, special comments, delivery options, and seller contact information. Obviously, the photos and videos of the animals are of the utmost importance. You want to make sure you put up the best representation of your animals as possible without any fake enhancements to mislead buyers. Photos should never be photo-shopped to change the actual look of the animals. Often producers hire professional livestock photographers to get the best quality possible but one personally can take

good photos. If you are posing animals, one should work with the animals prior to photo sessions to get them accustomed to being set-up. I am sure folks have lots of opinions on when lots should be posted for a sale, just remember to give your sale management team enough lead time to get the information posted and be considerate of their work hours. Also, keep in mind to post your lots soon enough to give your potential buyers plenty of time to get ahold of you in case they would like additional information about your consignment.

-Make sure your lot details are accurate. I know this sounds simple

enough but one should never be surprised on how people interpret information, so accuracy and detail is very important. Breed descriptions is a particular area that definitely needs clarification. By just listing "Dorset" it can mean a variety of things to different buyers. Does it mean that they are registered and adheres to the breed standard, or does it mean they could classify as a Dorset at a jackpot wether or ewe lamb show, or does it mean the animal is majority Dorset blood and is white? Please be specific in your listing. If one lists the breed as "Dorset Advantage" it should mean that it can be registered as such which means one of its parents is a registered, purebred Dorset. If the animal can't be registered as a

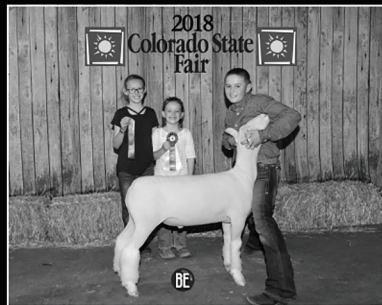

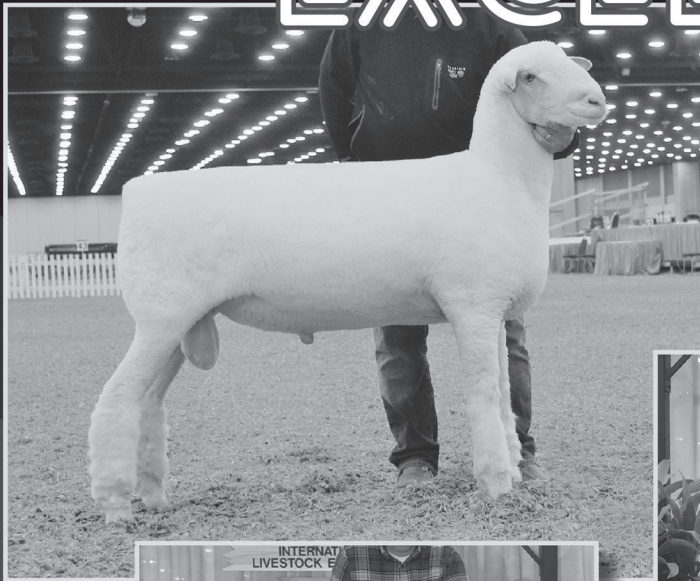

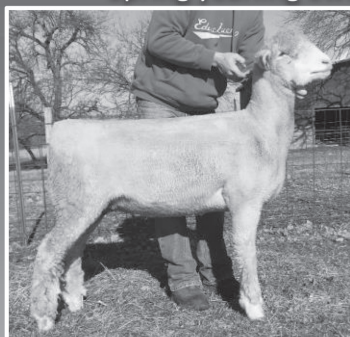

Dorset Advantage please don't use that term in the breed description. Also, pedigree information sometimes seems vague and confusing. Make sure you list it accurately, and actually use flock names and numbers as listed on registration certificates, if you are selling registered stock. Also, don't use stud ram "names" for purebred, registered stock unless they are actually officially christened by the breed association with that particular name. Make sure genetic codon information is accurate and backed up with actual genetic blood testing results, and you can provide that to your buyers. Accurate birth dates are also very important for buyers who are looking for a particular age for class breaks or lambs for certain show dates.

-Include Futurity nominations as part of your individual lot descriptions. Futurity nominations must be made known before sale date to be fair to all junior buyers interested in purchasing that animal for futurity participation. The Dorset breed now has an online futurity nomination form that needs to be filled out by the seller and sent into the CDC office before sale date for ewe lambs to be eligible for the futurity. This includes all Polled, Horned and Dorset Advantage ewe lambs. Last year the online sales accounted for 41% of total ewe lambs nominated for the Dorset futurity program, and almost half of them were actually bought by junior buyers.

-Provide registration paperwork to your new buyers in a timely manner. Online sale management does not do this for you so it is your sole responsibility to see that it gets done, not your buyers. Sale management will provide you with information on your buyers and will let you know when the money has been collected. The problem that does arise is that the information on a buyer according to the sale management team may not be how the new buyers actually want it listed on their registration papers. You may need to contact them to get that specific information and papers should be in the hands of new buyers within 30 days of the sale date. You need to have the papers into the breed office for processing to give the registrar ample time to get papers back to the new owners. Buyers calling breed association offices looking for paperwork does not reflect well upon you as a seller, and could cost you potential future sales because if a buyer has a hard time getting their paperwork from a seller, they tend not to go back.

-Make personal contacts after the sale and develop rapport with your buyers. This step is of utmost importance. First thank them for support of your breeding program. Then of course you will need to

finalize delivery details and any other details you had listed with your lots. This is also that time to get the proper "new owner" information for registration paperwork. This reach out should be done within a couple of days of your sale, no matter what and no matter the price! This timely contact makes the buyer feel that it does matter to you that they bought your animal and you can take the opportunity to get to know your buyer better, and may even have the opportunity to develop future sales.

-BUYERS:

-Search out sales that have the kind of animals you are looking for. The number of sales online can be overwhelming so you need to search out sales that specifically meet your animal purchasing needs and wants. Sale banners and sale dates are posted early on so you can go through and set-up online reminders of certain sales that really interest you. This also gives you lead time to see who has sales scheduled in case you may want to make farm visits to actually check out the animals in person, or can arrange for someone you trust to do so for you.

-Contact sellers if you have any questions and be responsible in getting those questions answered. An online sale is a venue where buyers really need to assertive in their information gathering. Because you are not seeing this animal in person, you need to gather additional information to make sure you really know what you are bidding on. You may need to know more information from the seller or want videos rather than just photos, so contact them directly. You may need to get an opinion from a disinterested party, so have them visit the farm to see animals in person for you. The degree to which a buyer goes to feel comfortable in knowing what they are bidding on depends on the personality of that buyer, on the kind of animal you are bidding on (ie. stud ram versus replacement ewe) and the amount of money you spending. If one is buying an animal of high value, you should make every attempt to make sure you get the all the information you need to bid on that animal responsibly and makes you feel comfortable in doing so.

-Be cognizant of the sale terms on the animals you purchase. Please make sure you are aware of any special stipulations as outlined in lot descriptions. Sometimes they are in lot details, notes, comments, and/or special sale terms. Buyers really need to read all of the fine print. Online sales seem to be void of any kind of written sale guarantees. If as a buyer you want any guarantee on reproductive

performance, you had better talk with the seller prior to bidding to see if they are willing to do any such guarantee and find out the terms of such guarantee. That is strictly something that should be arranged between seller and buyer pre-sale, not after the fact. It also should probably be in writing for both the seller and buyer so no misunderstandings occur. If anything happens to your animal, please let the seller know immediately. Do not wait for a long period until way after the fact as that is not fair to the seller, especially if they were willing to work with you on some sort of reproductive guarantee on breeding animals. Remember that you as the buyer have a lot of responsibility for the performance of your newly purchased animal, not everything is controlled genetically as many outside environmental factors also contribute to the success of your animals.

-Pay for your purchases in a timely manner. Once the sale management contacts you that you were a winning bidder, please pay for your animals as soon as possible. Make sure they know how you want the animal transferred if buying a registered animal, especially if you used a different name to set up your buyers' profile. If you provide this information upon payment then hopefully it will speed up the process in getting registration papers, if the buyers said they would be provided. Contact the buyer letting them know of your need to have papers and if need be call and remind them again if papers are not received in a timely manner. Calling the breed associations doesn't always help because their hands are tied as they have no idea of the animal identifications and they need breeder permission to proceed anyhow but in desperate situations they may be able to assist in your communication with the seller.

-Arrange transportation with the seller. It was previously suggested that sellers reach out to buyers post sale, but that also goes for buyers to reach out to sellers, especially to arrange transportation. It is also important to pick up your purchase in a timely manner. Due to the physical localities involved it might take some time to get this task accomplished. Some sellers are now charging new owners a daily cost to keep animals for a longer than normal time of pick-up, please be aware of this new practice.

If we as buyers and sellers try to enact professional etiquette in our roles in the online livestock sale process then hopefully it will assist in having continued positive online sales transactions and utilize the advantages of the online sale tool in marketing livestock to its maximum.

2018 CDC BOARD FALL TELE-CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Dick Reece at 7:30 PM EST on December 6, 2018. Directors on-line were: Michael Pope, Glenn Stunkel, Bob Heuvel, Rachael Gately and Jerry Gross. CDC Exec. Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins was also on-line to take minutes.

Secretary's Report: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2018 Annual Board Meeting held June 28, 2018 in Sedalia, MO. Jerry Gross moved to accept the minutes as printed. Bob Heuvel seconded. Motion carried. Deb also presented in writing the minutes from the Special Board Tele-Conferences held August 29, 2018 and October 15, 2018. Glenn Stunkel moved to accept the minutes as written. Michael Pope seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2018 to November 27, 2018. It was reported that total income was \$13,974.02; total expenses were \$17,553.14, for a net loss for the period of \$3,579.12. Account balances were: Checking \$58,676.38, Money Market \$10,161.57, CD \$26,237.40, Dexter/Navigant Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$30,415.28 for a total of \$125,515.63 on hand. Michael Pope moved to accept the treasurer's report. Jerry Gross seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2017-2018 fiscal records were going to the accountants for the annual tax from filing and noted that the association's bottom line was \$13,681.48 in the black for a comfortable income for the fourth year in a row making the association very stable.

CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2018-2019 stats. 528 head have been registered to date (down 92 head from last year) and 342 head transferred (down 77 head from last year). There has also been 27 head of Dorset Advantage sheep registered and 38 head transferred in that time period. Deb Hopkins also reported the year-end stats for 2017-2018. There were 5782 head registered (up 197 head from the previous year) and transferred 3074 head (up 427 head from the previous year). There were 677 Dorset Advantage Sheep registered (up 223 head from last year) and 382 Dorset Advantage sheep transferred (up 97 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were: 1)Indiana 933 head; 2)Iowa 698; 3)Ohio 568; 4)Illinois 497; 5)Pennsylvania

362; 6)Minnesota 345; 7)Oklahoma 300; 8)Nebraska 275; 9)Kansas 230; 10)South Dakota 227; 11)Wisconsin 226; 12)Virginia 218; 13)Missouri 217; 14)California 213; and 15)Oregon 146. The top 15 individual registrars were: 1)U.S. Meat Animal Research, NE (Production) 141 head; 2) Thomas J. Dagel, SD (Frame, Wether & Production) 115; 3)Robert VanderSchaaf, IA (Production) 86; 4)Jeffrey A. Hunter, IN (Production) 84; 5) Kelli & Brett Slack, IN (Wether) 68; 6)Tim & Stacey Gadsby, OH (Horned) 64; 7)Tie-Snowy Creek, WV (Production) 60; 7)Tie-Steve Swenka Family, IA (Production & Wether) 60; 8) Chad Heisdorffer, IA (Wether) 58; 9)Virginia Tech, VA (Production & Wether) 54; 10)Tie-Arndt Acres, MN (Frame) 51; 10)Tie-Meeuwse Farm LLC, MI (Production) 51; 11) Paul R. Cassell, VA (Horned) 50; 12)Huntrods Dorsets, IA (Wether & Production) 48; 13)Bradley Daniels & Family, IN (Wether) 46; 14)Kirsten Sass Hatfield, OH (Wether) 45; 15)Tie-Fisher Club Lambs, ID (Wether) 42; and 15)Tie-H.F. Sanford & Sons, MN (Frame) 42.

Correspondence: Deb Hopkins reported that she has received many thank-you notes and letters from participants in the Louisville judging contests including the 4-H Skil-athon Contest as the CDC sponsors awards in all of the judging events in Louisville and from the contest organizers themselves. The CDC also received thank-you's from many All American participants and the Great Lakes Regional Junior Show.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Breed Standard Education: Jerry Gross presented three different options to rewording Highly Objectionable Traits on color. After much discussion and post meeting emails the following changes were instituted into the Dorset Breed Standard of Excellence:

***Head-25 points:** A black spot on the nose, septum or mouth and/or ear is acceptable not exceeding the size of an eraser head on a standard sized pencil (0.25 inches). However, solid pink noses and lips, and solid white haired ears are preferred.

***Feet-Legs-Pasterns 20 points:** There should be no shading off to dark color on the legs or dark colored spots on the legs. These are considered highly objectionable traits, and if present on two or more anatomical regions with hair is a disqualification.

***Highly Objectionable Traits:**

5. Any color other than pink on the nose, septum or mouth (Head 25 pts) Exception: A black spot on the nose, septum or mouth equal to or smaller than the

size of an eraser head on a standard sized pencil (0.25 inches) is acceptable.

6. Any dark colored spots in the haired portion of sheep (Head 25 pts and Feet-Legs-Pasterns 20 pts)

Exception: A black spot on an ear equal to or smaller than the size of an eraser head on a standard sized pencil (0.25 inches) is acceptable.

Highly objectionable dark color on the haired portion of two or more anatomical regions of the sheep (on two or more legs OR on one or more legs and head) will result in a disqualification. See Disqualification #3.

***Disqualifications:**

3. The presence of highly objectionable dark color (as defined in Highly Objectionable Traits #6) on the haired portion of two or more anatomical regions. The head (nose, face and ears) is considered one anatomical region and each individual leg is considered an anatomical region. (ie: Highly objectionable dark color on two or more legs OR on one or more legs and head will result in a disqualification.)

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins presented the final futurity standings for the 2018 program. A total of \$4,035 was paid out to 30 participants. Awards and rosettes were presented to regional and national winners for an additional \$485.41. There were 136 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$3,150 in nomination fees. 59 polled ewe lambs were purchased by juniors and eligible for participation. The Dorset Advantage division had 16 ewe lambs nominated bringing in \$375 in nomination fees and 9 lambs were purchased by juniors and 5 of them submitted point record forms. The yearling ewe program had a 5 nominations taking in \$125 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 33 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$825 in nomination fees. 13 horned ewe lambs were purchased by juniors and eligible for participation. This year all of the futurity final awards were presented at the National Junior Dorset Association meeting in Louisville because the meeting was post-show and the presentations were very well attended. Deb also presented the 2019 Futurity Budget for approval and also wanted to remind breeders with online sales to get the filled out Online Futurity Sales Nomination forms into the CDC office before the sale dates.

-Newsletter/Webpage: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2018 Fall Online Edition of the newsletter was a well received issue with more advertising and a lot of show and sales results, all in color. The online newsletter had 10 ads in it and netted

\$698.50 in income. Plans are underway for the 2019 Winter Issue and has over 10 pages of advertising has already been committed.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2019 All American will be at the Kansas State Fairgrounds in Hutchinson, KS from July 4-7. The Kansas committee is working hard and getting organized to host a great event. There is a major schedule change in the show this year as it will start a half day earlier to allow for more ring time and more time for the extra events associated with the All American. The CDC needs to raise funding for the breed sponsorship. A horned ewe lamb has already been donated by Cassell Horned Dorsets to be sold at Ohio and Casey Sidwell has already offered to donate an amount equivalent to a Polled Ewe Lamb sale. The AAJS Class Sponsorship list will need to get printed and publicized to get all the class sponsorships to make up the Dorset breed commitment. Deb will take to Ohio and Illinois, and will get publicized at that time on Facebook also to get all of the sponsorships needed.

-National Junior Dorset Association: Dick Reese, Michael Pope and Rachael Gately sat in on the NJDA Annual meeting in Louisville, Saturday, November 10, 2018, which was very well attended by Dorset juniors and their families. The association awarded four \$1000 College Scholarships to Katie Muir, IN, Emily Ellison, TN, Megan Myerscough, IL and Riley Donkers, MN. Megan was not able to attend in person due to judging team conflicts but sent a very nice letter that was read before the group. The new 2018-2019 Officers are: President & At-Large Director: Katie Muir; Vice President & New England Director: Evan Syme, CT; Sec/Treas. & Great Lakes Director: Keegan Padgett, IN; Great Plains Director: Allison Smith, KS; Western Director: Johanna DeJoria, OR; North Central Director: Mclayn Musick, IL and Eastern Director: Olivia Waggoner, PA. The CDC first time Dorset showman mementos were also handed out at the meeting to the first time NAILE exhibitors and all of the Dorset futurity awards were announced and presented.

-Production Committee: Deb Hopkins reported that computer programmer Frank Tiffany was working on getting the registry program adapted for the new listing of LPN# and Deb will be ordering new registration papers that will allow of this new information as soon as current supply is used up.

-Dorset Youth Ewe Purchase Grant: Deb reported that there were 41 applications received for the three age divisions. She will get them scanned and emailed out to

the committee for their evaluation. Since there were so many applications received and the budget allows, it was decided for the committee to award a fourth grant in 2019. Winners will be notified by early January.

-Dorset Hall of Fame: Deb Hopkins reported that she needs names submitted for the Dorset Hall of Fame. Nominations need to be in by February 15, 2019. She will announce deadline on the CDC Facebook page to get more nominations submitted for this year's selection.

-OLD BUSINESS:

-2019 Western & Great Plains Director Elections: Deb Hopkins reported that the committee chairmen and committees were announced in the fall newsletter. The committees have received all of their directions from the CDC office as nominees need to be sent into the office January 15th for voting in February.

-NEW BUSINESS:

-2019 National Sale & Annual Meeting: The National Sale for Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding Sheep will be at the Illinois Dorset Sale and the 2019 Dorset Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage will be at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale in Sedalia, MO on June 26-28. The CDC Annual Membership Meeting and Hall of Fame Induction will be at the Illinois Dorset Sale. Final details are still being ironed out but it was decided to have the CDC Board meeting on Friday afternoon after the sale show Friday morning. (*Post meeting note:* The site for the sale will be the Illinois State Fairgrounds, Springfield, IL on March 29-30, 2019.)

-NAILE National Dorset Shows: Deb Hopkins reported that things very smoothly this year at NAILE. Alex Wolf was hired to enforce and educate exhibitors on the CDC slick shearing policy during the Junior Show. Numbers were up in all shows except the Open Polled Dorset show, which was down only slightly by 5 head. There were 217 head entered in the Open Polled Show, 262 head in the Junior Polled Dorset Show & Junior Dorset Advantage Show, 95 head in the Open Horned Dorset Show and 57 head in the Junior Horned Dorset Show. There are a couple of classes that need re-working but Deb found out you can put in your general breed show rules that classes can be split after a certain number but warns that the CDC would be responsible for the premiums for that class and pre-printed ribbons would not be available for any splits done at the show. Also, NAILE management is working on a fairer way of financial support from NAILE across the board on all breeds so our financial commitment will change for our shows.

2019 Judge Nominations were

selected for the ballots as follows: Polled Dorsets: Mark Johnson, Steve Reid, Jeff Repasky; and Horned Dorsets: Dick Kuzemchak, John Mrozinski, Dan Spilde. These names will be put on the ballots send out to NAILE exhibitors for preference ranking submitted to NAILE. Deb also asked the board for some Junior Show judge suggestions as there will need to be several new judges required and the names of Katherine Kuykendall and Tom Willwerth were presented.

-Secretary's Travel: The board moved that the executive secretary personally attend the 2019 National Sale at the Illinois Dorset Sale, Ohio Dorset Sale, All American Junior Show in Kansas and NAILE. Deb said since the NAILE Sheep Meeting is the same week as Ohio Dorset Sale she will be calling in on that meeting via phone. She also asked if the board would mind if she could get someone to take ring shot photos, to be posted on the CDC facebook page, and get someone to present awards during Sedalia show day at the National Dorset Wether Sire & Dam and National Dorset Advantage Sales. The All American is at Kansas this year and with the new extended schedule at AAJS she will hardly have time to get back and forth, never mind keep up with registration work required during that time. The CDC board gave Deb permission to get other arrangements worked out this year for Sedalia.

Michael Pope moved to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by Rachael Gately. Meeting was adjourned at 9:34 PM.

Do You Have A Plan For Marketing Your Lambs?

All sheep operations need to market products in order to generate income. To be successful and prosperous in your sheep enterprise, you should understand basic marketing concepts for selling sheep and their products. This includes specific business models of marketing lamb for the holidays, marketing lambs at other times of the year, marketing breeding stock, and marketing wool and woolen products. As a sheep producer, what sort of plan do you have for marketing your lambs?

One of the first steps to consider when starting any business is to develop a detailed marketing plan. This plan will serve as a blueprint for your business and covers everything from how you will go about targeting your customers, to calculating profitable prices.

Simply put, a marketing plan lays out your strategy to achieve your business goals and objectives. More precisely, it is a clear and detailed "map" for how you will sell your lambs or their products to your customer. Your marketing plan specifies how you will handle certain tasks such as: getting your lambs to market, building a market niche, identifying your customer base, maintaining sales growth, or dealing with future changes to your operation.

Your plan also serves as a useful means of accumulating valuable data and gauging day-to-day tasks and events. For instance, you might use your plan as a template for marketing tasks that occur throughout the

year. In addition, the marketing plan might note when you need to attend to specific activities, such as registering sheep, sending performance data to the National Sheep Improvement Program (NSIP), or setting up a processing schedule so that you have adequate inventory of lamb for festival markets.

To prepare your marketing plan, you will need to start with a basic concept for the plan: position.

Positioning involves influencing how your customers perceive your business and your product. It creates your unique farm identity or puts your lambs or lamb products in people's minds. In turn, when con-

sumers are interested in buying sheep or lamb products, they will think specifically of your farm or unique brand.

A brand or branding is the marketing practice of creating a name, symbol, or design that identifies and differentiates a product from other products. For this reason, your brand is important—it is what distinguishes your products or services from those of your competitors. It also helps keep your customers focused on your image and helps maintain and grow your sales.

As a sheep producer, there are some strategies that you can employ that will help ensure good positioning and branding, or that "customer allure", to entice sales. For instance, you could:

- Develop a farm name and logo that serves to identify your product or products
- Sell pasture-raised, or grass-fed, lamb for a unique taste and quality
- Offer organic lamb
- Highlight your production practices as a selling point
- Identify genetic and/or visual characteristics that appeal to buyers interested in breeding stock
- Highlight wool characteristics that appeal to hand spinners

Identify the unique aspects that differentiate your

product from other sheep or lamb products. For instance, you might want to identify genetic merits of your sheep through NSIP to identify outstanding estimated breeding values (EBVs) in order to sell breeding stock. Alternatively, if you elect to market lamb, you could use any unique attributes to distinguish your product from your competitors' lamb products. Remember, your buyers want to feel confident that your

product is superior and consistent, and you will have an excellent market position.

Spending a few minutes developing a marketing plan can keep you on track to develop sheep that best meet your customers needs and that also best use resources available on your farm. By keeping your standards high and offering a quality product, you're sure to have loyal buyers who will spread the word about your farm and the products you offer for sale.

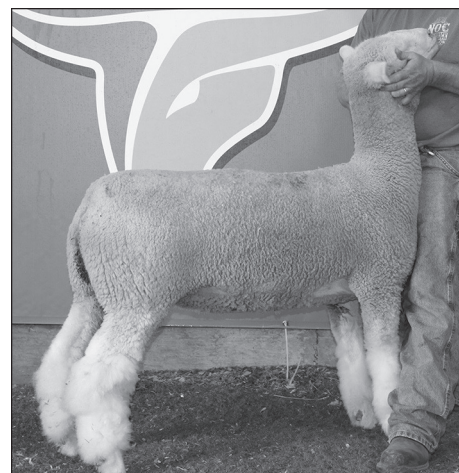

ANNOUNCEMENTS

UPDATED DORSET BREED STANDARD APPROVED

Last year the CDC Board of Directors appointed a breed standard committee to review and make suggestions on improving and updating the Dorset breed standard when it comes to the definition of color and how much is too much. After many meetings and re-writes the CDC board approved the following changes to the Dorset Breed Standard:

***Head-25 points:** A black spot on the nose, septum or mouth and/or ear is acceptable not exceeding the size of an eraser head on a standard sized pencil (0.25 inches). However, solid pink noses and lips, and solid white haired ears are preferred.

***Feet-Legs-Pasterns 20 points:** There should be no shading off to dark color on the legs or dark colored spots on the legs. These are considered highly objectionable traits, and if present on two or more anatomical regions with hair is a disqualification.

***Highly Objectionable Traits:**

5. Any color other than pink on the nose, septum or mouth (Head 25 pts)
Exception: A black spot on the nose, septum or mouth equal to or smaller than the size of an eraser head on a standard sized pencil (0.25 inches) is acceptable.

6. Any dark colored spots in the haired portion of sheep (Head 25 pts and Feet-Legs-Pasterns 20 pts)
Exception: A black spot on an ear equal to or smaller than the size of an eraser head on a standard sized pencil (0.25 inches) is acceptable.

Highly objectionable dark color on the haired portion of two or more anatomical regions of the sheep (on two or more legs OR on one or more legs and head) will result in a disqualification. See Disqualification #3.

***Disqualifications:**

3. The presence of highly objectionable dark color (as defined in Highly Objectionable Traits #6) on the haired portion of two or more anatomical regions. The head (nose, face and ears) is considered one anatomical region and each individual leg is considered an anatomical region. (ie: Highly objectionable dark color on two or more legs OR on one or more legs and head will result in a disqualification.)

The Dorset Breed Standard of Excellence has been updated with these changes and will be published from this point forward with the updated changes.

LAMBPLAN ID# TO BE PRINTED ON REG CERTIFICATES

Now that NSIP/Lambplan has a new updated searchable database that gives a breeder access to the most up to date performance data on an animal, the CDC has re-designed the registration certificates to list that number instead of printing the data given at time of registry on an animal. This will enable a owner to just go to the Lambplan database anytime, enter that animal's ID # and get the most current performance numbers to make more accurate selection decisions.

So, if you are enrolled in NSIP/Lambplan just provide the CDC with that animal's Lambplan ID # at time of registration and we will print that number on your registration papers from this point forward.

Abby Donkers is the summer intern for Rice County 4-H. There are 87 counties in the state of Minnesota. What were the odds that Abby would get to be a 4-H summer intern at her home county's Extension office? Not as likely as you'd think!

Building leadership and career skills 4-H partners with counties across Minnesota to provide college students with summer internships alongside local program coordinators. Responsibilities vary by county, but Abby's role has her attending 4-H camps and helping coordinate activities and programs throughout the summer. She is also engaged in planning and preparing all 4-H aspects of the Rice County Fair.

Abby grew up in 4-H. Beginning as a 5-year-old Cloverbud, she explored everything from sewing, crafts and foods, to sports and raising sheep and goats. In eighth grade she joined the Rice County 4-H ambassadors, a group of youth volunteers who assist with county events and work with youth to promote the skills 4-H helps grow. During her senior year, Abby attended 4-H's national citizenship experience called Citizenship Washington Focus. She spent a week in Washington D.C. to learn about the federal government and meet with members of congress to advocate for youth development and Minnesota 4-H.

Abby's been a go-getter from the start. Being born with Spina Bifida, she has never let anything slow her down. Despite requiring a wheelchair to get around, she's always taking on new tasks and finding ways to grow and develop her skills and strengths.

Abby credits 4-H with providing her opportunities to overcome obstacles and do what she loves. "I'm really happy and thankful to be in a role now that allows me to give back and help others."

Growing a career in an organiza-


tion that built her Abby is studying agricultural leadership at South Dakota State University and aspires to have a career with 4-H. Summer internships provide Abby and other college students with insight on the day-to-day work of youth development professionals.
