



I felt the quality ran deep in both the junior and open shows! The Junior Association had their annual meeting at the NAILE which was well

attended. I truly feel that we have some amazing youth members representing our breed!

As winter lambing continues, we turn the page to 2020 and the upcoming National Polled and Horned Dorset sales in March! The CDC Board will be hosting our annual board and memberships meetings during the sale. Please feel free to reach out to your board representatives ahead of the meetings with any questions or thoughts you would like to share. I look forward to seeing everyone at the sale and membership meeting!

Lastly, as 2020 progresses I would like to challenge Dorset breeders of all types to think about breed character in regards to your own flocks and ask yourself some questions... *How well do I know Dorset breed characteristics and how do I view my own flocks breed character? If I see areas to improve them in my flock, how do I? How do I personally value breed characteristics over other traits?* This is an important topic for breeders to contemplate that sometimes gets overlooked when it shouldn't. The Dorset breed's vast differences in type and kind helps the breed excel by providing breeders an opportunity to raise a type of sheep that they enjoy. However, at the end of the day all Dorsets should still strive to carry the same breed characteristics! Color related characteristics have been the hot topic lately, but it's important for breeders to not overlook other traits. Things like a moderately broad muzzle of medium length, ears that are small to medium in length/size, ears that have mostly a hair based covering with only a little wool, and bold eyes that are bright and prominent are all important breed identifying traits that all varieties of Dorsets should share! Remember, the complete breed standards are always available on the CDC website for you to review.

-Any purebred ewe lamb that was nominated and purchased by a junior breeder for participation in the futurity program as a ewe lamb in 2019 is eligible for the 2020 Dorset Yearling Ewe Futurity. The ewe is still eligible even if there were no point record forms turned into the CDC office or futurity premiums paid out on the ewe as a lamb.

-The current junior owner has to forward a renomination fee of \$25.00 and a completed nomination form (*see below*) to the CDC Office by May 1, 2020. The ewe must still be in the junior exhibitors individual name that originally purchased the ewe at the designated futurity sale. No transfer of ownership can have taken place since the original purchase.

2019 CDC BOARD FALL TELE-CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Michael Pope at 7:31 PM EST on December 3, 2019. Directors on-line were: Glenn Stunkel, Linda Mastin, Rachael Gately, Dick Reece and Bart Caldwell. CDC Exec/ Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins was also on-line to take minutes. -Secretary's Report: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2019 Annual Board Meeting held March 29, 2019 in Springfield, IL. Dick Reece moved to accept the minutes as printed. Glenn Stunkel seconded. Motion carried. Deb also presented in writing the minutes from the Special Board Tele-Conferences held October 30, 2019. Glenn Stunkel moved to accept the minutes as written. Dick Reece seconded. Motion carried. -Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2019 to November 26, 2019. It was reported that total income was \$11,180.74; total expenses were \$17,829.34, for a net loss for the period of \$6,648.60. Account balances were: Checking \$65,193.76, Money Market \$10,176.82, CD \$26,305.18, Dexter/Navigant Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$28,043.12 for a total of \$129,743.88 on hand. Dick Reece moved to accept the treasurer's report. Rachael Gately seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2018-2019 fiscal records were going to the accountants for the annual tax from filing and noted that the association's bottom line was \$9,026.10 in the black for a comfortable income for the fifth year in a row making the association very stable. -CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2019-2020 stats. 558 head have been registered to date (up 22 head from last year) and 129 head transferred (down 265 head from last year). There has also been 50 head of Dorset Advantage sheep registered and 20 head transferred in that time period. Deb Hopkins also reported the

year-end stats for 2018-2019. There were 5,238 head registered (down 544 head from the previous year) and transferred 2905 head (down 169 head from the previous year). There were 1,314 Dorset Advantage Sheep registered (up 637 head from last year) and 524 Dorset Advantage sheep transferred (up 142 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were: 1)lowa 805 head; 2)Indiana 802; 3)Ohio 625; 4)Oklahoma 471; 5)Illinois 455; 6)Pennsylvania 319; 7)Kansas 239; 8)Virginia 234; 9)Minnesota 227; 10)South Dakota 200; 11)Wisconsin 192; 12)Missouri 189; 13)Oregon 164; 14)Idaho 150; and 15)California 141. The top ten individual registrars were: 1)Vermazen Dorsets, IA (Production) 90 head; 2)Robert Vander Schaaf, IA (Production) 81; 3)Paul R. Cassell, VA (Horned) 72; 4)Chad Heisdorffer, IA (Wether) 69; 5) Meeuwse Farms, LLC, MI (Production) 55; 6) Jeffrey A. Hunter, IN (Production) 53; 7)Kelli & Brett Slack, IN (Wether) 49; 8)Tie-Cal Enfield & Family, IA (Wether) 47; 8)Tie-Kirsten Sass Hatfield, OH (Wether) 47; 10)Allison Smith, KS (Wether) 45; 11)Thomas Dagel, SD (Frame, Production & Wether) 44; 12) Virginia Tech, VA (Production & Wether) 43; 13)Devon Wolkow, SD (Frame) 41; 14)Tim & Stacey Gadsby, OH (Horned) 40; 15)Tie-Christina Shotts, OH (Horned) 39; and 15)Tie-Snowy Creek, VA (Production) 39. -Correspondence: Deb Hopkins reported that she has received many thank-you notes and letters from participants in the Louisville judging contests including the 4-H Skil-athon Contest as the CDC sponsors awards in all of the judging events in Louisville and from the contest organizers themselves. The CDC also received thank-you's from many All American participants, the Great Lakes Regional Junior Show, the Great Plains Reg. Junior Dorset Show, the ASI and special junior award recipients Annie Nichols and Linsey Eddy.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins presented the final futurity standings for the 2019 program. A total of \$4,245 was paid out to 22 participants. Awards and rosettes were presented to regional and national winners for an additional \$710.06. There were 142 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$3,875 in nomination fees. The Dorset Advantage division had 15 ewe lambs nominated bringing in \$250 in nomination fees. The yearling ewe program had 12 nominations taking in \$300 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 26 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$700 in nomination fees. Of the total 183 ewe lambs nominated 98 (54%) were purchased by junior buyers and were eligible for futurity participation. This year all of the futurity final awards were presented at the National Junior Dorset Association meeting in Louisville because the meeting was post-show and the presentations were very well attended. Deb also presented the 2020 Futurity Budget for approval and also wanted to remind breeders with online sales to get the filled out Online Futurity Sales Nomination forms into the CDC office before the sale dates. The subject of breaking ties was also discussed. Rachael Gately moved that the Regional Junior Show placing will break a tie and in the event that a tie remains then both will be honored and the tie placing be awarded that placing monies and awards. Linda Mastin seconded. Motion carried.

-Breed Standard Education & Promotion: Bart Caldwell moved to accept Cruz Nichol's application to the certified judges list. Rachael Gately seconded. Motion carried.

Jerry Gross was online to present the proposal for the Continental Dorset Club Wether Incentive Program. This program will recognize registered purebred Dorset wethers if they are named Champion Dorset Wether or Champion Whiteface Wether at the five major shows that are open to any junior exhibitor no matter where they live, by awarding them a \$500 premium. The proposed list of shows are: Aksarben Stock Show, All American Junior Show, Keystone International Livestock Exposition, National Western Stock Show and North American International Livestock Exposition. There are specific breeder and exhibitor rules that apply. After presentation and discussion, Bart Caldwell moved to accept the proposal as presented. Dick Reece seconded. Motion carried. -Newsletter/Webpage: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2019 Fall Online Edition of the newsletter was well received with minimal advertising and had a lot of show and sales results, all in color. The online newsletter had 4 ads in it and netted \$401.55 in income. The 2019 Spring/Summer issue had the same issue with little advertising support and was decided to go with an online version only and no charges were presented to the 2 advertisers. Discussion on whether to continue having the Spring/Summer issue as hard copy was discussed and the board felt to try one more time since it will not be competing against the printed Breeders Directory next spring. If it encounters poor advertising support at that time, then the decision can be made to go with an online version once again if needed. Plans are underway for the 2020 Winter Issue and some advertising support have been coming in.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2020 All American will be at the Michigan State University in East Lansing, MI from July 2-5. The Michigan committee is working hard and getting organized to host a great event. The CDC needs to raise funding for the breed sponsorship. A horned and polled ewe lamb need to be donated, and the class sponsorship list will be made up and circulated next spring. Between all of those activities that should raise our \$3150 three breed sponsorship. Due to ever increasing facility rental costs the AAJS will be doing the Semen Online once again and will be looking for Dorset breeder donations of 2-5 straw lots. The CDC office will also send out AAJS raffle tickets with breeder's first registration next year work to assist in the AAJS general fund for the show.

-National Junior Dorset Association: Michael Pope and Rachael Gately sat in on the NJDA Annual meeting in Louisville, Saturday,

-Dorset Hall of Fame: Deb Hopkins reported that she needs names submitted for the Dorset Hall of Fame. Nominations need to be in by January 2020.

Director Elections: Deb Hopkins reported that the committee chairmen and committees were announced in the fall newsletter. The committees have received all of their directions from the CDC office as nominees need to be sent into the office Jan. 1st. -NEW BUSINESS:

Meeting: The National Sale for Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding Sheep will be at the Ohio Dorset Sale, Eaton, OH on March 20 & 21 and the 2020 Dorset Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage will be at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale in Sedalia, MO on June 24-26. The CDC Annual Membership Meeting and Hall of Fame Induction will be at the Ohio Dorset Sale on Friday, March 20 soon after the sale show. The Ohio Dorset Sale is under new management as the sale will be managed by Select Livestock Services. The CDC Board meeting will be Thursday evening at 6:00 PM, Deb will get a meeting room at the sale headquarters. The CDC had passed that future National Sales need to be online with show viewing and online bidding sale day. Sale management and the CDC are working on getting some online presence for the sale.

-NAILE National Dorset Shows:

Mike Fox was hired to enforce and educate exhibitors on the CDC slick shearing policy during the shows at NAILE. It was reported that he did have about 20 bellies that need to be re-sheared before entering the ring. Discussion was also held on the leg wool issues and it was decided that more education needs to be done in this area. Dick Reece moved that the CDC get pictures/diagrams of what is acceptable for slick shearing, present at March board meeting for approval, and get posted on CDC website and promoted to breeders/exhibitors for their information prior to next summer shows/sales. Glenn Stunkel seconded. Motion carried. Amount of color was also discussed and it was decided to re-emphasize the importance of absence of color to our judges as it is their final responsibility to discriminate against it as it is part of the Dorset breed standard.

The board also discussed the confusion on the junior exhibitor part especially of the difference between slick shorn and wether type classes. After much discussion, Linda Mastin moved to change the description to "Slick Shorn Frame Breeding Sheep" and "Slick Shorn Wether Sire/Dam". Dick Reece seconded. Motion carried. Deb will make sure wording gets changed at the All American and NAILE, and for regional shows that have both divisions to use the new wording. This way it will be easier for the exhibitor to know which class to enter and for the judge to evaluate accordingly.

Numbers were up or at least steady in all NAILE shows except the Open Horned Dorset show, which was down significantly and were under the minimum for a breed but Deb had already talked to the Horned breeders to make sure those numbers were above the minimum next year.

2020 Judge Nominations were selected for the ballots as follows: Polled Dorsets: Mark Johnson, Steve Reid, Dustin Cruit; and Horned Dorsets: Dick Kuzemchak, John Mrozinski, and Richard Jacobsen. These names will be put on the ballots send out to NAILE exhibitors for preference ranking submitted to NAILE. Deb also asked the board for some Junior Show judge suggestions as there will need to be new judges required and the names of Aaron Crome and Neal Knapp were presented.

Are You Feeding Your Ewes For Lamb Production?

Many sheep producers have already started lambing while others still anxiously await the first lamb to arrive. Regardless of when the lambs arrive or how you manage your sheep, supplying ewes with adequate nutrition throughout the year can greatly impact lamb survival and growth rates. Good nutrition not only helps to ensure vigorous lambs at birth, but also promotes high quality colostrum and leads to adequate amounts of colostrum and milk.

We know from research studies that good nutrition plays an important role for ewes to produce healthy and vigorous lambs. According to the United States Lamb Resource Center's fact sheet "Increasing Your Lamb Crop Series: Reduce Lamb Loss" as much as 80% of lamb mortalities occur in the first two weeks after birth. This can often be associated with starvation and hypothermia. Adequate nutrition helps to reduce issues from starvation and hypothermia by promoting appropriate lamb birth weights and adequate fat reserves at birth. Both aspects contribute to healthy and vigorous lambs that guickly stand and nurse on their own. Lambs with good vigor generally are born with fat reserves, known as brown fat, that helps to provide them with energy during the first several hours after birth. This gives lambs the energy to quickly get up and nurse as well as to help keep them warm until they nurse. Lambs with poor vigor often lack these fat reserves and are more likely to suffer from hypothermia, which can lead to starvation.

To prevent hypothermia and starvation, lambs should receive adequate amounts of colostrum as soon as possible after birth. Colostrum, the nutrient rich first milk, contains antibodies that help a lamb's immune system to function properly as well as protect lambs from diseases. It is extremely important that lambs consume colostrum within 12 hours after birth. After this timeframe, the ability of the lamb's digestive system to absorb these antibodies decreases greatly. Shepherds can assess if lambs have received adequate amounts of colostrum using a few different techniques. A lamb's belly should feel like a full balloon when the lamb is picked up with your hand under its chest. Lambs that cry or constantly nurse exhibit signs they are not receiving enough to eat. A good rule of thumb is that a lamb should receive about 10% of their weight in colostrum within 24 hours after birth. Or in other words, a 10 lb, lamb should consume at least one pound (16 ounces) of colostrum within 24 hours after birth. Even though you can't measure colostrum intake in nursing lambs, you can assess other characteristics. Well fed lambs will appear alert, stretch when they first stand up and should be quiet.

In order for a ewe to produce both adequate amounts and quality of colostrum for her lambs she needs to consume adequate nutrients in her diet. Once a ewe reaches late gestation (pregnancy) her nutritional needs greatly increase. According to the National Research Council's "Nutrient Requirements for Small Ruminants", a 200 lb. ewe carrying a single lamb requires 1.65 lbs. of TDN (energy) during maintenance. This increases to 2.51 lbs. during late gestation and then to 2.69 lbs. during lactation. If that ewe is carrying twins, her late gestation TDN requirement jumps to 3.13 lbs. and then 3.39 lbs. for lactation. Protein requirements for that 200 lb. ewe also increase from 0.24 lb. at maintenance to 0.41 lb. in late gestation with a single lamb and 0.53 lb. in late gestation if carrying twins. The requirement in early lactation increases to 0.59 lb. protein for a ewe nursing a single lamb and 0.78 lb. protein for a ewe nursing twins. While the actual numbers may not have much meaning unless you are balancing a ration, the importance is that nutrient density in a diet must increase as well as the amount of feed consumed.

One of the keys with providing adequate nutrition is to realize that ewes who don't receive adequate nutrients often produce lower quality and quantity colostrum. Remember that statement above about most lamb mortalities occurring shortly after birth? Well, the moral of that story is that underfed ewes often don't produce enough colostrum to feed their lambs while ewes that receive adequate nutrition often produce as much or more than their lambs need. In addition, ewes that consume adequate nutrients produce colostrum with higher immunoglobulin (antibody) concentrations.

Another important consideration for feeding ewes throughout gestation is that they should achieve a body condition score of 3 to slightly better than 3. This give them adequate fat reserves to draw upon during lactation. Most ewes lose weight while nursing lambs, so a little extra body condition can help support those high producing ewes who are nursing twins or triplets. However, high quality protein as well as adequate levels of protein and energy must be provided in the ration to additionally support high milk production.

Overall, nutrition is an extremely important component for flock production. Nutrition not only promotes twinning, but also enables ewes to produce healthy and vigorous lambs at birth. Ewes receiving good nutrition should be able to produce a high quality and quantity of colostrum should lead to high milk production. Paying close attention to nutritional needs of the sheep flock should result in high lamb survivability, fast growth rates and high-quality lambs to sell at weaning.

-Aksarben Stock Show -All American Jr. Show -Keystone International Livestock Expo -National Western Stock Show -North American International Livestock Expo


The qualifying show must have a minimum of 10 head in the Dorset Breed Division or the White Face Division to be eligible for the incentive.

Happy New Year everyone! I hope this finds you all healthy and ready to jump headfirst into this new decade. Lambing is underway, and as we prepare for the coming sales, breeding, and shows, it must be said that the Dorset breed is strong and growing.

With the options of different styles to raise, we've expanded the market to include practically anyone interested in sheep. If you want the most beautiful profiling and eye-appealing sheep, a fitted, framed Dorset is the way to go, providing you or someone who excels in the art of fitting can enhance its good traits and perhaps camouflage any less desirable points. If you're interested in the framed Dorset, but the trimming isn't in your skill set or checkbook range, then a slick-shorn sheep sounds like the right fit for you. The wether style Dorsets offer the opportunity to showcase the muscle and marketability of the breed. After all, the carcass under that hide is where the value is unless you're keeping them for stud rams and ewes. Along that line is the Dorset Advantage, which has opened our breed to allow us to promote purebred Dorset genetics in the specks. There are some awfully good sheep, both rams and ewes, in all of these divisions.

The divisions are good. But they can be confusing and unclear to many outside the ring as well as inside. As a junior Dorset breeder, I, along with many other juniors, are asked repeatedly what is showing in the ring because it's "all over the place". To the observer, the slick shorn and wether classes are mixed and inconsistent. It's been overheard that market lambs belong on the other side of the wall. It may be true. The Dorset breed has come a long way in producing competitive market lambs. I'd personally LOVE to see a Dorset market lamb climb to the top! It's difficult even as a breeder to compare your framed slick Dorset in the correct class, to a heavily muscled "groundpounder" next to you, knowing full well that it's probably a better sheep. Just in the wrong division. The CDC Board has just taken action to re-name the slick shorn division at our major shows to "Slick Shorn Frame Breeding Sheep" so, it will be less confusing for exhibitors in which sheared division to enter. Hopefully this clarification will clearly more define the kind of slick shorn sheep that is being evaluated in the ring and for the exhibitor to select the correct class to enter.

Let us work together with our ideas, knowledge, and experience to find a way to continue building our breed, that fairly and successfully includes all of us and the sheep we love. Here's to a year of good shows, good sales,good friends, and GREAT sheep!
