After a year full of ups and downs, and ever-changing plans, many sheep breeders from across the country flocked to Louisville in November for the NAILE. While some exhibitors opted to stay home because they felt that was the right decision for their families during COVID-19, I am pleased to report that the Dorset shows still had good numbers and exceptionally high quality! The next CDC membership and board meetings are both scheduled to take place in March in conjunction with the National Polled and Horned Dorset Sale, held at the Ohio Dorset Sale! The National Wether Sires & Dams and National Dorset Advantage Sales are slated for Sedalia in June! Make sure to note Sedalia's new dates that start this year, a week earlier than past years! My hope is that events across the country return to normal this year and that we can all again come together to do what we enjoy, without stringent health protocols being necessary! 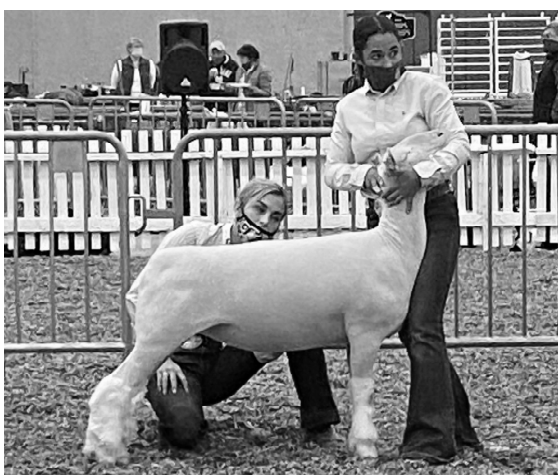

2020 CDC BOARD FALL ZOOM MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Michael Pope at 7:31 PM EST on December 10, 2020. Directors on-line were: Glenn Stunkel, Linda Mastin, Rachael Gately, Jeremy Crouch and Bart Caldwell. CDC Exec. Sec./Treas. Deb Hopkins was also online in attendance to take minutes.

Secretary's Report: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2020 Annual Board Tele-Conference Meeting held March 23, 2020. The minutes have several updates put into them from developments last spring and summer. Glenn Stunkel moved to accept the minutes as printed and updated. Rachael Gately seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2020 to November 30, 2020. It was reported that total income was \$10,863.12; total expenses were \$21,579.59, for a net loss for the period of \$10,716.50. Account balances were: Checking \$70,574.47, Money Market \$10,192.50, CD \$26,373.15, Dexter/Navigant Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$32,799.50 for a total of \$139,964.62 on hand. Linda Mastin moved to accept the treasurer's report. Glenn Stunkel seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2019-2020 fiscal records were going to the accountants for the annual tax from filing and noted that the association's bottom line was \$9,386.63 in the black even though we were slightly down in registrations and transfers, the reduced secretary travel and printed newsletter expenses helped to offset any losses.

CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2020-2021 stats. 650 head have been registered to date (up 93 head from last year) and 372 head transferred (down 32 head from last year). There has also been 65 head of Dorset Advantage sheep registered and 56 head transferred in

that time period. Deb Hopkins also reported the year-end stats for 2019-2020. There were 4933 head registered (down 305 head from the previous year) and transferred 2598 head (down 307 head from the previous year). There were 692 Dorset Advantage Sheep registered (down 98 head from last year) and 464 Dorset Advantage sheep transferred (down 60 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were:

Correspondence: Deb Hopkins reported that she has received thank-you notes from the Collegiate and Junior College Judging contests in Louisville as those were held. The CDC also received a thank you from the Great Lakes Regional Junior Show and Ewe Grant recipients Harlow Cushway and Braxton Young, that gave glowing reports on their successes and positive experiences with their Dorset ewe lambs.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins presented the final futurity standings for the 2020 program. Considering the limited number of in-person shows this past year the futurity had very good

participation both in the breeder nomination support and in juniors turning in point record forms. A total of \$3,500 was paid out to 17 participants. Awards and rosettes were mailed out to regional and national winners for an additional \$655.93. There were 118 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$2900 in nomination fees. The Dorset Advantage division had 27 ewe lambs nominated bringing in \$125 in nomination fees. The yearling ewe program had 12 nominations taking in \$300 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 27 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$600 in nomination fees. Of the total 166 ewe lambs nominated 86 (52%) were purchased by junior buyers and were eligible for futurity participation. Deb also presented the 2021 Futurity Budget for approval and also wanted to remind breeders with online sales to get the filled out Online Futurity Sales Nomination forms into the CDC office before the sale dates.

-Breed Standard Education & Promotion:

There were no new names to add to the Certified Judges List. Deb Hopkins reported that she will get the newly approved Dorset Wether Incentive plan in place for 2021 as it was not implemented last year due to all of the unsettlement in the livestock show world due to COVID. Michael Pope also reported that he did not make much progress on getting the photos together for the CDC Slick Shearing Policy educational presentation on the CDC web site and newsletter. Rachael Gately has some photos and will get to Michael and he will get put together for the spring, prior to summer show season.

-Newsletter/Webpage: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2020 Fall Edition went over to be an online presentation only due to lack of advertising support. We were hoping that since we could never print a Spring/Summer edition due to the ever changing news during the year that for the fall one we would offer it as a hard print copy but it went to be an online version when the ads did not come in. The online newsletter had 3 ads in it and netted \$241.25 in gross income. Plans are underway for

the 2021 Winter Issue and good advertising support has been committed for that issue.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2021 All American will be at the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield, IL from July 1-4. The Illinois committee is working hard and getting organized to host a great event. The CDC already has sponsorships of the classes and partial payments, Deb will bill out for the rest. Also, thanks to Kendrick Dorsets, a Horned Dorset ewe lamb has already been sold to benefit the show. The CDC still needs to get one more commitment of a polled dorset/DA ewe lamb to sell or the monetary value equal to that, to complete our breed commitment for the 2021 show. Deb also reported that \$600 worth of raffle ticket sales have already been sold for the general fund support of the AAJS so she will not be re-sending raffle tickets out with first work this year. The AAJS will be doing the Ram Semen Benefit Online auction once again this spring and we need some lots of Dorset semen offered to help support the ever growing All American.

-National Junior Dorset

Association: Deb Hopkins reported that the Annual Junior Association Meeting was not held in Louisville this year but the board will be meeting soon via Zoom to make 2021 plans. The association awarded two \$1000 College Scholarships to Ethan Hodel, IL and Heidi Barkley, PA. Both recipients were recognized in the Fall Dorset Connection. Allison Smith will once again be organizing a NJDA Benefit Online Auction. It will be March 8, 2021 on Show Circuit Online Sales. Allison is looking for animals, semen, or anything sheep related for the sale. Consignors can donate all or a percentage of their sales. Last year the sale generated over \$4000 for the association so they could carry out their scholarship and ewe purchase grant programming for the youth.

-Production Committee: Nothing to report at this time.

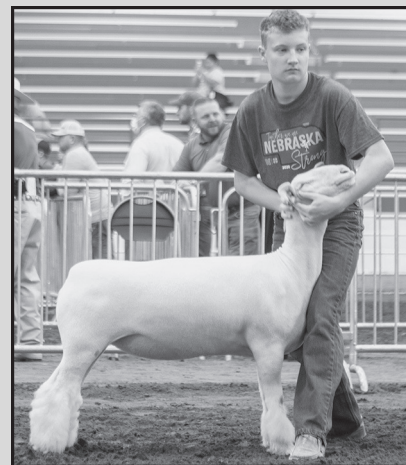
-Dorset Youth Ewe Purchase Grant: Deb Hopkins reported that there were 85 applications received for the three age divisions with the Intermediate



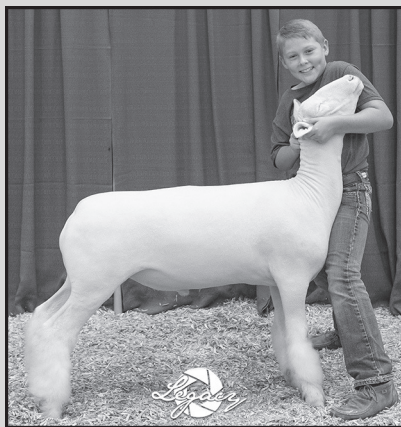

Division having twice as many as the other age divisions. She will get them scanned and emailed out to the committee for their evaluation. Winners will be notified by early January. Linda Mastin moved to split the Intermediate Division into two age groups and award 2 grants in that division due to the large number of applications in that particular age group. Bart Cardwell seconded. Motion carried.

-Dorset Hall of Fame: Deb Hopkins reported that the CDC will be moving

forward in recognizing the two inductees slated for 2020 at the 2021 National Dorset Sale in Ohio. Unfortunately we did lose one of the inductees, Skip Heeg, but he did know he was going to be inducted and was very honored, so Deb will contact the family to see if we can get them to attend this year's induction ceremony. We do need more nominations to be made for upcoming inductions and anyone can make the nomination by filling out the hall of fame nomination form available on the CDC website.

Director Elections: Deb Hopkins reported that the committee chairmen and committees were announced in the fall newsletter and the committees have received all of their directions from the CDC office as nominees need to be sent into the office Jan. 1st.

-2021 National Sale & Annual

Meeting: The National Sale for Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding Sheep will be at the Ohio Dorset Sale, Eaton, OH on March 19 & 20 and the 2021 Dorset Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage will be at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale in Sedalia, MO on June 16-18. The CDC Annual Membership Meeting and Hall of Fame Induction will be at the Ohio Dorset Sale on Friday, March 19 soon after the sale show. The CDC Board meeting will be Thursday evening at 6:00 PM, Deb will get a meeting room at the sale headquarters. Sale management will be providing sale day online bidding and the CDC will work on getting a live stream of the sale show in some manner.

-NAILE National Dorset Shows: Deb Hopkins did not attend the show this year and had Kasey Gordon cover for her in all shows. Racheal Gately also assisted during the Junior Shows. Thank you to both. Rachael Gately moved to send Kasey Gordon \$300 for

her coverage of all the Dorset Shows at NAILE. Bart Cardwell seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion followed by directors attending the show, Rachael Gately, Bart Cardwell and Jeremy Crouch on the three divisions and how it does not work well anymore with NAILE now allowing a fitted and slick shorn representative in the Supreme drives, as it caused a lot of confusion and inhibited the flow of the show. After much discussion on all of the pros and cons, Bart Cardwell moved to have the NAILE Polled Dorset Shows in both the Open and Junior events move to just two divisions, fitted and slick shorn; and have two completely separate shows, groups and premier exhibitors included, with the exception of the State Flock in the NAILE Junior Polled Dorset Show. This would also be applied to the All American Junior Show. Jeremy Crouch seconded. Motion carried. This was not a normal year in NAILE but the CDC board will hire a slick shearing educator for next year's show since we are dealing with so many new exhibitors every year.

2021 Judge Nominations were selected for the ballots as follows: Polled Fitted/Horned Dorsets: Skip Anderson, Joel Parker, Richard Jacobsen; and Polled Slick Shorn: Evan Snyder, Terry Burkes, Brent Jennings. These names will be put on

the ballots send out to NAILE exhibitors for preference ranking submitted to NAILE. Deb also asked the board for some Junior Show judge suggestions and the names of Tim Gadsby and Tim Hall were presented.

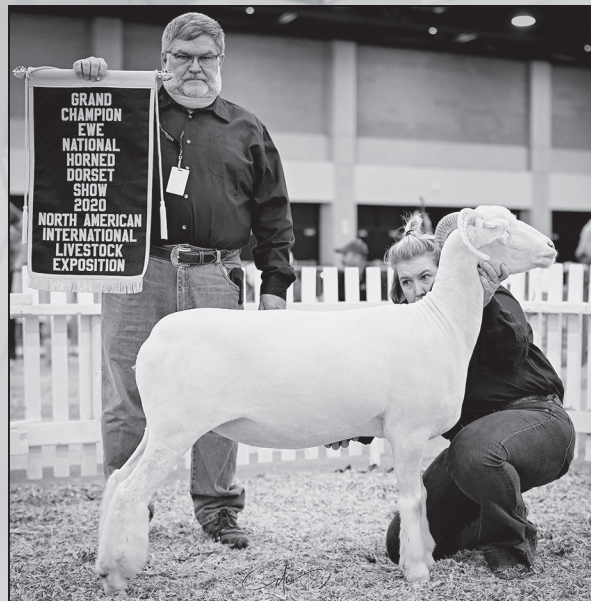

Tackle Routine Management Tasks With A Well Designed Mgm't System

A well-designed sheep-handling facility where animals can be restrained is very useful for routine management practices such as parasite control, vaccinations, pregnancy checking or sorting. A handling facility can be simple or elaborate; the key is sheep should willingly move through the system in a quiet and efficient manner. Another important point is that the handling system should save greatly on labor requirements when working sheep. Each handling facility will differ based on the needs of the operation, location of the facility, and size of the flock. A basic handling facility should include a holding pen with a working chute. Panels with dropdown sides provide easier access while restraining sheep for vaccinations, drenching, or pregnancy checking. Other components that are very useful in a handling system are access gates, a scale, a sorting gate, and a loading area. Producers with larger flocks may also want to include a turntable for trimming feet.

The first component of a handling system is a holding pen to gather the sheep. The holding pen should be large enough to comfortably hold all the sheep in one group. The holding pen should also include an area that funnels sheep into the working chute.

Solid sided panels in the working chute allow sheep to move through a system more readily because they don't get distracted by activities taking place outside the chute system. Curved panels can also be used to take advantage of an animal's natural tendency to move in a circle.

Gates placed within the system can be used to prevent sheep from backing up while performing routine health care tasks. Sorting gates are also useful for sorting one group of sheep into two or more groups. There are a number of different types of gates.

The scales is a critical piece of equipment for sheep producers who wish to track sheep performance. There are a number of different scales from small hanging scales with a sling used to weigh newborns or small lambs to larger scales designed to weigh weaned lambs on up to mature sheep. Scales that are designed for livestock generally use a dial scale, a balance beam, or a digital readout.

Another useful component in a handling system is a turntable for trimming feet on large numbers of sheep. The turntable squeezes a sheep to restrain it and then the sheep is laid onto its side. The feet are easily accessible for the producer to trim feet or treat for problems. Another option for foot trimming is a sheep deck chair, however this piece of equipment is not easily incorporated into a handling, but rather may be used as sheep walk out of the system. The chair hangs on a gate and then the sheep is backed up to the edge of the cradle and flipped back into the netting. This allows the producer to trim feet without having to balance the sheep on his or her legs to hold the sheep upright while sitting on its rear.

Foot rot and foot scald are major issues that many shepherds have to deal with. In order to treat groups of sheep, a footbath can be incorporated into a handling system. The footbath

is filled most commonly with a zinc sulfate solution to kill the bacteria that causes these diseases.

A final component of the handling system could be a loading area. The loading area can be set up for loading sheep onto a truck or onto a trailer. A ramp would be needed for loading onto trucks. Or, the chute system can be extended to the door of a trailer.

Handling Facility Guidelines: A handling facility is no good to a producer if the sheep do not willingly walk through the system. Understanding how sheep think and how they see can help you plan a well-designed system. Here are a few tips to keep in mind when setting up a handling system:

1. The system should be located somewhere that is easily accessible by sheep, and by trucks and trailers. The system should also be in an area with good drainage to avoid working in the mud during wet times of the year. Level areas are preferred; if that is not an option, sheep will move more readily on a slight uphill grade.
2. Sheep are more willing to move toward a lighted area than toward a dark area. However, they also do not like direct sunlight in their faces, so locate chutes so that they face either north or south. If locating the handling system inside, install good lighting.
3. Walk through the chute system to look for areas that might spook the sheep. Animals do not like changes in lighting within the system such as shadows or bright sunlight shining on the floor. Animals will also balk if objects, such as a coat or halter, are lying across the chute panels.
4. Take advantage of an animal's natural tendency to circle by constructing the chute with curves. This also prevents animals from seeing what is happening further down the chute system.
5. Construct the chute system with solid sides to prevent sheep from becoming distracted by sights outside of the handling system. The system should be both tall enough and strong enough to prevent animals from escaping.
6. Check the system for any corners or places where an animal could become bruised. Check all bolts to make sure that none are exposed because they could cause bruises or cuts on the animal.
7. Consider ways to minimize the amount of noise created by working animals through the system. Sheep will tend to balk at loud or unusual noises.

These considerations for a handling system can save producers time as well as decrease the amount of manual labor required for routine management tasks. A well designed system is a very useful and cost effective tool for any size sheep operation.

CDC RE-INTRODUCES NEW DORSET MARKET LAMB INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Last year the CDC board of directors approved a new program to recognize purebred registered Dorset wethers at major livestock shows, but due to the craziness of last year and all of the cancellations of live shows the program never got officially implemented. In 2021 the new recognition program will be implemented.

In the past, sponsorship of \$500 was awarded to purebred registered Dorset market lambs if they were named Overall Grand Champions at the live Junior Market Lambs Shows. The CDC has not paid out on that sponsorship in several years even though it was offered at many shows across the country. Hence the new program has been developed.

Continental Dorset Club members of junior exhibitor status, can earn \$500 if their registered Dorset wether is named Champion of the Dorset Breed Division or the White Face Division at a major show designated by the CDC. The 2021 designated shows are as follows:

- Aksarben Stock Show
- All American Junior Show
- Keystone Int'l Livestock Expo
- National Western Stock Show
- North American International Livestock Expo

The qualifying show must have a minimum of 10 head in the Dorset Breed Division or the

White Face Division to be eligible for the incentive.

- Registered Dorset ewe lambs and Registered Dorset advantage lambs are not eligible for the incentive.
- AOB and AOP Division Champions are not eligible for incentives.

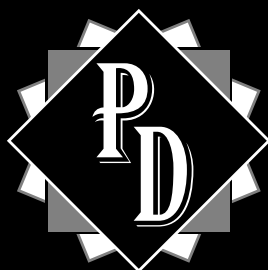

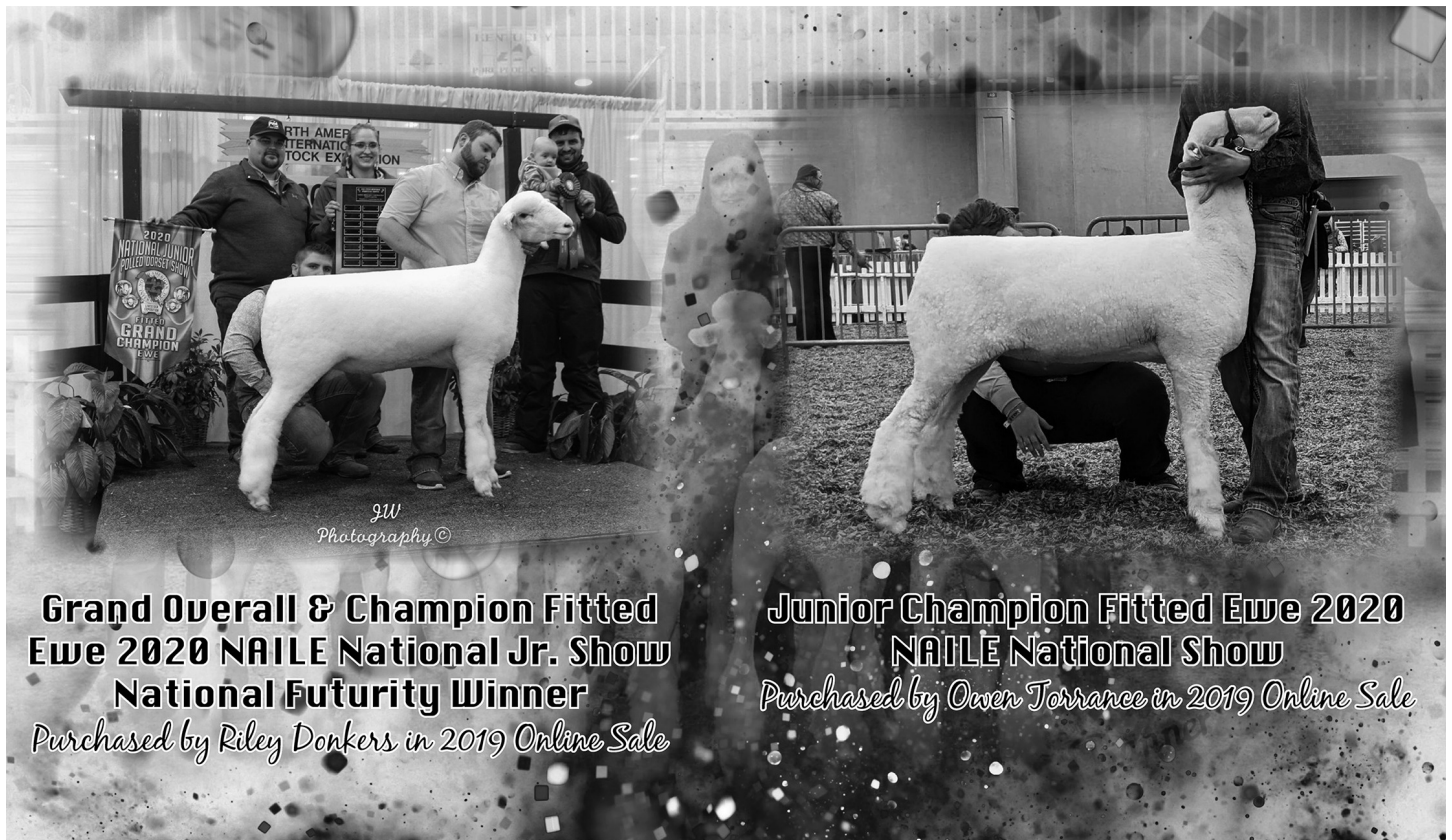

She plans to get involved with Agricultural Policy and Law where she would like to work in government to be an advocate for animal agriculture. She currently shows Polled Dorsets and Border Leicesters, and has also shown goats in the past.
