
The Dorset breed enjoyed some very strong Dorset shows at the 2021 All American Junior Show held in July at the Illinois State Fairgrounds. There were record numbers in the Polled Dorset, Horned Dorset and Dorset Advantage shows. We are getting a lot of new folks involved in all sectors of the breed! It is a pleasure welcoming them to breed and encouraging thier new Dorset sheep projects. The show had 110 Polled Dorset, 18 Horned Dorset and 28 Dorset Advantage exhibitors entered for a total of 156 different kids participating the shows!

The Louisville entries are in and we are seeing the same trend in that junior show. There is 109 Polled juniors, 24 Horned juniors and 92 Dorset Advantage exhiblational Sale Ch. Dorset Wether Damitors participating for a total of 223 kids. This is truly a great sign for the Dorset breed moving forward!

The Open Shows are also up in numbers this year compared to the last unimpeded NAILE show in 2019. Certainly looking forward to hosting these two National Dorset Shows that will be named in honor of past CDC Secretary Marion Meno, as we lost her in 2020. Here's to having the Dorset breed going out in 2021 on a high note!

CONTINENTAL DORSET CLUB NEWS

2021 CDC ANNUAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 PM by President Michael Pope. Directors Rachael Gately, Jeremy Crouch, Linda Mastin and Glenn Stunkel were in attendance. Great Lakes Director-Elect Bob Schembs was also in attendance as well as CDC Exec. Sec./Treas. Deb Hopkins. Great Plains Director Bart Cardwell was not in attendance due to a conflict with the OYE Show in Oklahoma.

Secretary Minutes: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the minutes from the 2020 CDC Fall Zoom Meeting held December 10, 2020. Jeremy Crouch moved to accept the minutes as written. Rachael Gately seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal 2020-2021 year to date as of March 8, 2021. Total income is \$26,653.97, total expenses are \$41,798.05, for a current net cash loss of \$15,144.10. Account balances -Checking Account: \$66,123.05; Savings Account: \$25.00; CD: \$26,389.22; Money Market: \$10,195.86; Junior Association \$30,803.43 for total cash assets of \$133,536.56. Glenn Stunkel moved to accept the treasurer's report. Linda Mastin seconded. Motion passed. Deb also stated that the CDC had a net income of \$9,386.63 the previous fiscal year and the non-profit taxes have been filed. Deb Hopkins also presented a proposed budget for 2021-2022 for the board to review as it goes through the meeting.

CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins presented the 2020-2021 statistics to date. As of February 28, 2021: 1499 head have been registered and 603 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 103 head from the same period last year and the transfers are down 177 head from the same period last year. In the Dorset Advantage registry, 131 head have been registered to date and 105 head have been transferred. The registrations are

up 61 head from the same time period last year and transfers are down 2 head from the same period as last year. Deb also stated that in the last fiscal year 2019-2020 the CDC registered 4933 head (down 305 head from the previous year) and transferred 2598 head (down 307 head from the previous year). In the Dorset Advantage registry, last year 692 head were papered (down 98 head from the previous year) and 464 head were transferred (down 60 head from the prior year). Due to COVID these numbers were definitely off dues to lacks of in person sales and shows.

Correspondence: Deb read a thank you note from NDJA College Scholarship recipient Heidi Barkley thanking the associations.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins reported that the futurity nominations have been doing very well on the online sales once again. To date there has been 50 polled ewe lambs nominated, 16 horned ewe lambs, 16 Dorset Advantage ewe lambs for a total of 82 ewe lambs. Yearling ewe deadline to be re-nominated has not occurred yet and will be coming up on May 1st. There has been a record of 6 breeders doing the group nomination option. Expecting a lot more nomination's coming up at the in person and online sales this spring/summer.

Deb Hopkins presented the proposed 2021 Dorset Futurity Budget with a proposed payout amount of \$4500. Linda Mastin moved to accept the futurity budget as presented. Rachael Gately seconded. Motion carried.

-Breed Standard Education: Michael Pope presented photos of properly and improperly slick shorn presentations according to the Dorset slick shearing policy. Pictures are to be posted on CDC Facebook page, put on the CDC website, presented in the CDC newsletter and presented in an educational banner to be on display at major junior shows. Jeremy Crouch moved to accept the photos and written captions. Rachael Gately seconded. Motion Carried.

Discussion on the registration

of piebalds and purebred Dorsets with color was addressed for clarification. They are not eligible for the purebred Dorset registry as the color disqualifies them but can be registered in the DA registry as they meet the minimal requirement of having one purebred registered Dorset as a parent and there are no phenotype requirements.

There were two names presented for the Dorset Certified Judges list: Brent Jennings and Skip Anderson. Rachael Gately moved to accept their names onto the certified judges list. Jeremy Crouch seconded. Motion carried.

Wether Incentive Award presentation at the All American Junior Show: it was clarified that at the AAJS the Champion Polled Dorset Market Lamb and the Champion Horned Dorset Market Lamb will have to compete against each other for the one \$500 incentive offered at that particular show. Need to make sure they are wethers as ewe lambs are not eligible for the incentive.

- **-Production Committee:** Nothing new to report at this time.
- -Dorset Youth Grant Program: The 2021 winners were selected from the 85 applications received and have been notified. They are: Junior-Selah Blum, CO; Intermediates-Kendall Driscoll, CA and Emma Whitlock, MO and Senior-Dylan Waldron, ID. The committee concluded adjust points awarded to keep from creating ties and will adjust so.
- -Newsletter and Website: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2021 Winter newsletter had strong advertising support once again and the CDC netted \$580.35 on it. This special issue was sent to all buyers of Dorset sheep the previous year whether they were CDC members or not. The 2021 Spring/Summer connection advertising deadline is April 15th. The board decided it will be printed if \$2500 worth of advertising revenue comes in, if not it will be an online issue only, like the fall issue.
- **-Dorset Hall of Fame:** The CDC has two 2021 Hall of Fame Inductees to be recognized at the Annual Membership Meeting tomorrow at the 2021 Annual

Meeting on the fairgrounds. The CDC needs new nominations for the 2022 class and the deadline for nomination will be January 2022.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins and Jeremy Crouch reported that the 2021 All-American Junior Show will be July 1-4, 2021 at the Illinois State Fairgrounds, Springfield, IL. The Dorset exhibitors and their families will have a meet & greet dessert social on Saturday sponsored by the Junior Dorset Association. CDC already has the class sponsorships spoken for from last year's cancelled show and Deb needs to collect remaining funds. Also, Kendrick Horned Dorsets donated a horned ewe lamb that was sold last year. We still need some additional funding to cover our complete breed sponsorship. Jeremy stated that the Illinois Dorset Association will be also be sending in a donation towards the show. Thanks to everyone the CDC will be all set for the 2021 shows in Illinois. The AAJS will be in Massachusetts 2022, in Wisconsin 2023 and in Michigan 2024. -National Junior Association: The junior association is planning on having a meet & greet dessert social at the 2021 All-American and their 2021 Annual Meeting will be in Louisville in November. The scholarship application has been updated for the 2021 applicants and is posted online. Thanks to Allison Smith, who orchestrated an online NDJA benefit auction this spring, and the numerous supporters of the sale, over \$4000 was raised once again to put into the junior association account. Deb needs to get the NJDA board together for a zoom meeting to make summer/fall plans since they did not meet in person last fall in Louisville.

OLD BUSINESS:

-2021 Great Lakes & New England Director Election Results: Rachael Gately was re-elected to serve her second three year term as the New England Director. Bob Schembs was elected to serve as the new Great Lakes Director. He is replacing retiring Great Lakes Director Michael Pope. Thanks to Michael for his service of six years to the CDC and its membership. -2021 Sedalia Coverage: Deb Hopkins will ship banners out to Heartland Group for presentation, as they did a

great job last year. The CDC will need Facebook picture coverage and Linda Mastin and/or Rachael Gately will get done.

NEW BUSINESS:

-2021 NAILE National Dorset Shows: Deb Hopkins reported that she participated in a March zoom meeting for Louisville. We will be dedicating this years' Open Polled & Horned Dorset Shows to Marion Meno and her daughters will be on hand during the shows. Deb will get an honoree award to present to them during the show. Deb has submitted re-worked premium books sections.

Louisville will run November 12-18,

being held Monday, November 13th.

2021 with the Open Dorset Show

The Open Polled Fitted & Horned Dorset Show judge choices submitted were: 1st: Joel Parker, 2nd: Skip Anderson, 3rd: Richard Jacobsen and the Open Polled Slick Shorn Show judge choices were: 1st: Evan Snyder, 2nd: Brent Jennings, 3rd: Terry Burkes. Open Horned Dorset show was under 50 head for second year in 2019 so we need to get the numbers up this fall to keep the show moving forward. Junior Breeding sheep show judges will be selected by mail ballot at a later date.

-2022 CDC Director Elections:

Western & Great Plains will be electing directors next winter.

Nominating committees will need to be made known to the office for announcement in the 2021 fall newsletter. Great Plains Director Bart Cardwell and Western Director Linda Mastin have each served one three year term and are eligible to run for a second term.

2021 CDC ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Michael Pope at 3:04 PM in conjunction with a social hour hosted by the Ohio Dorset Breeders. Thank-you to the Ohio Dorset Association for being great hosts for the 2021 Annual CDC Membership Meeting. Michael Pope introduced Eastern Director Glenn Stunkel, New England Director Rachael Gately, Western Director Linda Mastin and North Central Director Jeremy Crouch as well as Great Lakes Director Elect Bob Schembs. Michael also introduced past CDC Presidents Mike Galleher and Dick Reece.

Executive Sec/Treas. Deb

Hopkins presented the minutes from the 2019 Annual Membership Meeting that was held at the Illinois Dorset Sale in Springfield, IL on Friday, March 29, 2019. Steve Myers moved to accept the minutes as written. Burnell Oberholtzer seconded. Motion Carried.

Deb Hopkins presented the financial report for the fiscal 2020-2021 year to date as of March 8, 2021. Total income is \$26,653.97, total expenses is \$41,798.05, for a current net cash loss of \$15,144.10. Account balances - Checking Account: \$66,123.05; Savings Account: \$25.00; CD: \$26,389.22; Money Market: \$10,195.86; Junior Association \$30,803.43 for total cash assets of \$133,536.56. Cody Crouch moved to accept the treasurer report as presented. Burnell Oberholtzer seconded. Motion carried.

Deb Hopkins presented the 2020-2021 statistics to date. As of February 28, 2021: 1499 head have been registered and 603 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 103 head from the same period last year and the transfers are down 177 head from the same period last year. In the Dorset Advantage registry, 131 head have been registered to date and 105 head have been transferred. The registrations are up 61 head from the same time period last year and transfers are down 2 head from the same period as last year. Deb also stated that in the last fiscal year 2019-2020 the CDC registered 4933 head (down 305 head from the previous year) and transferred 2598 head (down 307 head from the previous year). In the Dorset Advantage registry, last year 692 head were papered (down 98 head from the previous year) and 464 head were transferred (down 60 head from the prior year). Due to COVID these numbers were definitely off dues to lacks of in person sales and shows. The top ten states in registrations for the fiscal year of 2019-2020 were: 1)Indiana-966 head; 2)Iowa-635; 3)Illinois-428; 4)Ohio-396; 5)Oklahoma-360; 6)Pennsylvania-288; 7) Virginia-270; 8) Nebraska-254; 9)Kansas-214 and 10)Michigan-201. The 2019-2020 top ten registrars were: 1)U.S. Meat Animal Research Center, NE (Production)-157 head; 2)Ben Machin, VT (Horned)-106;

3) Purdue University, IN(Wether)-90; 4)Peter Janicki, WA (Horned)-80; 5)TIE:Alberda Family Dorsets, MI (Production)-7888; 5)TIE:Robert VanderSchaaf, IA(Production)-78; 7)Paul R. Cassell, VA (Horned)-69; 8)TIE: Jeffrey A. Hunter, IN (Production)-65; 8)TIE:Meeuwse Farms, LLC, MI (Production)-65; and 10)Kelli & Brett Slack, IN (Wether)-56 head.

Committee Reports:

-Dorset Ewe Futurity: Rachael Gately gave the current update on number nominated and reminded juniors to get forms in a timely manner. Online sales have contributed greatly to the nomination numbers. Many lambs are being bought up by juniors for the program. Only change that has been made to the program is in breaking ties, to use the higher placing at the Regional Show to break ties in both the regional and national standings.

-Breed Standard Education/Certified Judges List: Michael Pope announced that the new names added to the certified judges list were: Skip Anderson and Brent Jennings. He encouraged breeders to submit names of judges for the certified list in their areas that do a good job evaluating Dorset sheep. Michael also announced the development of slick shearing photos to be used in education of the CDC slick shearing policy. It will be announced in the next newsletter, posted on the CDC website and a banner will be made to have at shows for educational purposes. Michael also announced the new CDC Wether Incentive program that will be awarded this year at 5 major junior shows as long as the number requirements are met.

-Production Dorset Committee: Glenn Stunkel reminded production breeders enrolled in NSIP to provide those individual NSIP numbers when registering so they can get listed on the registration papers so folks can look up their current performance numbers on the NSIP website.

-Dorset Youth Grant Program: Linda Mastin reported that they had 85 applicants and decided to award an extra grant this year to the large number of applications. The four winners selected were: Junior: Selah Blum, CO; Intermediates: Kendal

Driscoll, CA and Emma Whitlock, MO and Senior: Dylan Waldron, ID. She encouraged applications for next year that are due December 1st.

-National Junior Dorset Assoc.: NJDA President Olivia Waggoner and North Central Direct Mclayn Musick presented a report to the group that the junior association is planning on having a meet & greet dessert social at the 2021 All-American and their 2021 Annual Meeting will be in Louisville in November 13. The scholarship application has been updated for the 2021 applicants and is posted online. ARLAN, KENT & DAN SPILDE

At about the age of 8 years old Arlan Spilde bought his first sheep which included a ewe with a ewe lamb. He showed those sheep in 4-H. That led to the purchase of his first registered sheep which at that time was Hampshires. Arlan then owned a number of other breeds before falling in love with the Dorsets. At that time, Polled Dorsets were in the beginning stages and were to expensive to acquire. So, he did what a lot of others did which was to buy Horned Dorset ewes and a Polled Dorset Ram to start breeding them Polled. He showed the Dorsets through the 1960's and into the early 1970's in Wisconsin and also some in Illinois and Minnesota.

In the Mid 1970's the flock was maintained for some years with no outside blood being introduced. Then the year before his two boys, Dan and Kent, were old enough to show in 4-H, he went to the Midwest Stud Ram Sale and purchased a Morehead fall ram to breed the ewes and began to ramp things back up. They had quite a bit of local success over the next few years and from there on Arlan and his boys were hooked. In the mid-1980's Arlan purchased a Horned Dorset Ewe that had been bred by Bob Black. She had twin ewe lambs and that was the start of the Horned Dorset flock. Going forward, both the Polled Dorset and Horned Dorset flocks were shown quite heavily throughout the Midwest. This continued all the way through the 1990's. Many champions in both the Horned and Polled were won at numerous state fairs, national shows, and national sales! In 1996 the Horned Dorset flock was sold out to the Paul Cassell Family of Virginia. Arlan and his two sons continued to have great success with the Polled Dorsets, particularly at the major sales, Wisconsin State Fair, and NAILE.

Now the next generation is getting involved as his grandchildren have been showing his Dorsets over the past 10 plus years. Arlan, Dan, and Kent currently have an annual online sale and consign to the Ohio Dorset Sale every year. The Dorsets continue to be shown at their

county fair, Wisconsin State Fair, and the national show in Louisville.

Over the years, Arlan has mentored and aided several breeders and both of his sons have continued that habit. A quick visit to the Spilde area at Louisville every November will quickly reveal the depths that they are willing to go to help other exhibitors and breeders, many of which are juniors. There are several young Dorset breeders that look up to the Spildes for their success, their willingness to mentor, and their never wavering determination to make this sheep thing a family affair! In talking with the boys, we believe it has been roughly 55 years of uninterrupted Dorset ownership for Arlan and his family and expect it will probably continue for many more years.

The Continental Dorset Club is actually also going to include Kent and Dan Spilde also in this 2021 Hall of Fame induction as a special surprise as we could not break-up the family and could not recognize Arlan without including the Spilde Brothers-Kent & Dan. Congratulations to the whole family!



JOSEPH "SKIP" HEEG

Joseph "Skip" Heeg has had a long association with the Dorset breed. From his youth showing Dorsets for some local families in the Finger Lakes Region of New York on the county fair circuit he has had a special bond with the breed. Later, as Shepherd for the University of Massachusetts (1966-1968) he exhibited Dorset at the BIG E to represent the University, though he admits that they were primarily research animals at the time. From there, he took a decade long active break from the breed.

It was in 1979 that Skip along with his family started Heeg's Dorsets in Tully, NY. The foundation of this flock was based on ewes purchased from the University of

Connecticut, Cornell University, and the remaining Dorset ewes from the University of Rhode Island flock. He subsequently infused the flock with select genetics pieces from such breeders as Myers, Cardinal Creek, Poynter and Riverwood Farms. As he built up this flock to a nationally recognized and winning program, he gave back to the Continental Dorset Club by running and becoming a Director for the New England Region in 1988. He then went on to become President of the CDC from 1989-1991, following in the footsteps of one of his mentors Don Grant.

Even after the children, Kenneth and Jason, left the farm until he was moved by his employer, Agway, to Pennsylvania in 1196, Skip and his wife Cheryl, continued producing high quality Dorsets, including a record high selling ewe, National Champions, as well as Sire of the Year by the name of "Double Clutch". Certainly, the pride of the Heeg's Dorset breeding program was this ram called "Double Clutch". After winning his class in Louisville, Skip leased him to Green Mountain Dorsets and Riverwood Farms, which helped Skip, win the Sire of the Year Award in Louisville. Skip then sold the flock in its entirety to Green Mountain Dorsets of Vermont, where his close, lifelong friend Dave Harmann was Shepherd at the time. Professionally Skip was a top notch livestock nutritionist that moved him from New York working for to Pennsylvania and then to Florida, where he worked for many horse, beef and dairy operations. Upon retirement Skip & Cheryl moved to Tuscon, Arizona to be closer to their sons. It was after the move that Skip lost Cheryl to her battle with cancer way too early in life.

Unfortunately just last year, Skip lost his own personal battle with cancer. Skip enjoyed his retirement though acting as a consultant for his youngest son, Jason, and his family's enterprise, Heeg's Crazy H Club Lambs out of Shepherd, Montana. He gave genetic and nutritional advice to help build a strong Dorsets, Hampshire and Shropshire breeding program, He enjoyed getting hands on whenever possible, helping with lambing as well as traveling to a few shows and sales.

Skip was once asked what his favorite type of sheep was. To this he replied, "The ones that turn the green!" While that statement was sure enough a reflection of his driven personality, the Dorset breed had the highest place in his heart. This was the breed that he chose and that chose him to build a family around, both of blood and friends.

DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

Develop a Good Flock Health Program with Your Veterinarian

A good flock health program should begin with a discussion with your veterinarian. In addition to this discussion, it is important to remember that other animal welfare factors, beyond a health program, will impact the health of sheep in the operation. These aspects as well as others should be considered.

For example, nutrition during late pregnancy will have a direct impact on the amount and quality of the colostrum a ewe produces which in turn impacts the health and vigor of newborn lambs. Ewes should also be in average body condition (BCS of 3) to help prevent issues with pregnancy toxemia.

However, as part of the health program, producers should consult their veterinarian about a vaccination program. A ewe vaccination program stimulates the immune system in the ewe, causing her to build the necessary antibodies to provide passive immunity to her lambs through colostrum. Thus, a ewe vaccination program is the first line of protection for the newborn lamb.

Vaccinations allow sheep to build immunity to common diseases present within a flock. Producers and their local veterinarian can design a vaccination program that best protects the flock from diseases on the farm. Many producers may only vaccinate for a few diseases while others prefer to vaccinate for a larger number. At the very least, producers should vaccinate with C, D and T to prevent overeating disease and tetanus. Additional vaccines can be included if other diseases are present on the farm.

To begin developing a good vaccination program, producers should understand the different types of vaccines, proper vaccine handling and proper injection techniques.

Vaccine Types

There are two different types of vaccines available.

- 1. *Killed vaccines* are made from viruses or bacteria that are no longer active. This type of vaccine stimulates the animal's body to produce antibodies which prevent the animal from getting the disease if the animal is exposed. These vaccines can be given to pregnant animals because there is a low risk of the animals developing adverse reactions to this type of vaccine. This type of vaccine is stable for a longer period of time. Animals vaccinated with killed vaccines develop an immune response more slowly and to a lesser degree than animals vaccinated with modified live vaccines.
- 2. **Modified live** vaccines utilize a live virus. Modified live vaccines have been treated so that the disease viruses will not cause the disease but will allow the animal to produce immunity to the disease. This vaccine type must be used within a short period of time after mixing. A word of caution; modified live vaccines do have the potential to cause abortions, and associated problems, in bred females that have never been vaccinated with a modified live vaccine.

Handling Vaccines

In order for vaccines to work properly, they must be handled properly! Properly handling the vaccine from the time it is purchased until the time it is administered to the animals will ensure the best immunity. There are handling differences between the two vaccine types, so be sure to follow the label

directions.

When buying vaccines, purchase them from a reputable vendor that will deliver a high-quality vaccine. Most vaccines should be stored in a refrigerator between 35 and 45 degrees F. Heat can make the vaccines ineffective, so they should not be allowed to warm up to room temperature at any time. Also, be sure that the vaccines do not freeze. This could also make them ineffective.

If you buy vaccines that need mixed, use only the rehydrating solution packaged with the vaccine. Determine how many animals you need to vaccinate and only mix enough to vaccinate that number. Any leftover vaccine should be thrown away as it loses its effectiveness during storage. For some vaccines, this could be as quickly as one to two hours after it has been rehydrated.

If vaccinating a large number of animals, you may need to use a cooler to keep vaccines cool until the task is completed. Pre-cool the cooler and then place a cold pack inside to maintain temperature. Place the vaccine in the cooler and place the cooler in an area out of direct sunlight. Again, follow label instructions.

Injection Techniques


Medication labels are considered legal documents. Therefore, producers should always follow label directions for dosage and route of administration when working with medications. Most products recommend either an intramuscular (IM) injection, that places the product directly into the muscle, or a subcutaneous (SQ) injection, that places the product between the muscle and the skin. Subcutaneous injections should be preferred because it causes less damage to any muscle tissue that may be harvested for meat.

All IM injections should be given in the neck, while SQ injections may be given in either the neck or under the skin in the flank of the animal. The graphic below shows where injections should be given. Basically, the injection should be placed in front of the shoulder, above the spine that runs along the bottom of the neck and below the cartilage that runs along the top of the neck.

In addition to proper injection site, all product labels list a withdrawal period. A withdrawal period ensures that medication residues are no longer present in food products harvested from treated animals. Withdrawal periods are more typically found on antibiotic medications.

A good vaccination program helps to prevent diseases in a flock and should be part of other disease prevention measures. Always consult your veterinarian to design a flock health program that fits your individual farm situation.

The triangle on this sheep's neck indicates the area where IM or SQ injections should be given.

Your animals will need to meet the CDC slick shearing policy in order to enter the showring.


Following is a picture of the new banner along with the actual photos and verbage used on the sign to explain the policy:











The area where most of the issues arise is the wool left on the belly behind the navel to the rear flank. I know folks do this to make the sheep appear to have more volume and body depth but leaving wool in this area is not allowed on slick shorn sheep. Another trouble spot is wool left on legs above knees and hocks, trying to make the animal appear to have more bone, again not allowed on slick shorn animals. If you want to leave wool on your animals we do offer fitted classes but the frame animal that is totally fitted is probably not where you want your slick shorn Dorset to be judged.


2021 NATIONAL JUNIOR DORSET ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING IN LOUISVILLE
