2022 All-American Junior Show Heading East to Massachusetts

The 2022 All-American Junior Sheep Show is going to be held at the BIG E Fairgrounds, West Springfield, MA from June 30-July 3, 2022. The New England planning committee is working hard to make it another excellent showing experience for all of our exhibitors and their families. The special attraction to the New England show is that the 3-on3 Basketball Tourney is played at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame and the museum is exclusively open to AAJS



for all exhibitor and families to enjoy the exhibits. Another exciting thing is that the Northeast Youth Sheep Show will be held on the heels of the AAJS the following weekend, at the exact same venue, so folks traveling from afar can make it truly a summer "showcation" and get to participate in two major junior breeding sheep shows in the one trip. The local committee is also looking into some fun activities between shows for the stayovers.

The show will feature classes for both Fitted Polled, Slick Shorn Polled & Horned Dorsets and Dorset Advantage breeding sheep and market lambs. The Polled Dorset show has been split into two separate shows, Fitted and Slick Shorn. The AAJS will be implementing a Supreme Champion Ram & Ewe drive on Sunday and it just made sense to split the major breeds into the two separate fitted and slick shows, and for many wool breeds to split out into their white and natural colored divisions to have representation of their different divisions within breed into the Supreme drives. Special awards will be presented to the Supreme Champions.

If you have never attended an All-American Junior Show please make plans to attend this very special event! It is much more than just a sheep show as there are several activities for the whole family. Several events are in the planning stages for the exhibitors and their families to enjoy including the 3-on-3 Basketball Tourney and Pizza night on Friday, and a chicken BBQ dinner & Ag Olympics Saturday evening. The show of course also offers several educational activities for our exhibitors including a judging contest, skil-a-thon, individual and team showmanship classes beside the breed and market lamb classes. A fun virtual shearing educational activity has also been added along with Leadline and Dress-A-Sheep competitions. There will be 25 breeds represented at this year's show!

This will be the third year for the expanded show schedule in which major activities are done on Thursday, it has worked out great the past two All Americans' to allow us more time for all of the activities associated with the All American. 2021 CDC BOARD FALL ZOOM MEETING MINUTES - TUE., DEC. 7, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Rachael Gately at 7:34 PM EST on December 7, 2021. Directors on-line were: Glenn Stunkel, Linda Mastin, Bob Schembs, Jeremy Crouch and Bart Caldwell. CDC Exec. Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins was also online in attendance to take minutes.

Secretary's Report: Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2021 Annual Board Meeting held March 18, 2021 in Greenville, OH. Jeremy Crouch moved to accept the minutes as printed and updated. Bob Schembs seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2021 to November 30, 2021. It was reported that total income was \$11,260.52; total expenses were \$21,722.42, for a net loss for the period of \$10,461.90. Account balances were: Checking \$89,629.41, Money Market \$10,207.30, CD \$26,439.80, Dexter/ Navigant Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$36,748.14 for a total of \$163,049.65 on hand. Bart Cardwell moved to accept the treasurer's report. Glenn Stunkel seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2020-2021 fiscal records were going to the accountants for the annual tax form filing and noted that the association's bottom line was \$18,144.18 in the black due to the increase in registration and transfer work last year.

CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2021-2022 stats. 536 head have been registered to date (down 114 head from last year) and 333 head transferred (down 39 head from last year). There has also been 56 head of Dorset Advantage sheep registered and 81 head transferred in that time period. Deb Hopkins also reported the year-end stats for 2020-2021. There were 5518 head registered (up 585 head from the previous year) and transferred 2693 head (up 95 head from the previous year). There were 883 Dorset Advantage Sheep registered (up 191 head from last year) and 563 Dorset Advantage sheep transferred (up 99 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were: 1)Indiana 1027 head; 2)Iowa 806; 3)Ohio 626; 4)Illinois 486; 5)Oklahoma 386; 6)Pennsylvania 359; 7)Virginia 358; 8)Minnesota 279; 9)South Dakota 246; 10)Kansas 219; 11)Wisconsin 205; 12)Idaho 194; 13)Oregon 162; 14)California 143; and 15)Missouri 125. The top individual registrars were: 1)Purdue University, IN (Wether) 105 head; 2)Wilfong Dorsets, VA (Frame & Wether) 102; 3) Thomas J. Dagel, SD (Frame, Wether & Production) 92; 4)Kelli & Brett Slack, IN (Wether) 78; 5)Robert Vander Schaaf, IA (Production) 69; 6)Steve Swenka Family, IA (Production & Wether) 68; 7)Paul R. Cassell, VA (Horned) 67; 8)McCord Enterprises, OR (Horned) 66; 9)Jeffrey A. Hunter, IN (Production) 63; 10)Fisher Club Lambs, ID (Wether) 61; 11)Vermazen Dorsets, IA (Production) 60; 12)Kirsten Sass Hatfield, OH (Wether) 56; 13)H.F. Sanford & Sons, MN (Frame) 53; 14)Virginia Tech, VA (Wether & Production) 49; 15)Greenleaf Valley, PA (Horned) 47.

Correspondence: Deb Hopkins reported that she has received thank-you notes from the Collegiate, Junior College and 4-H Judging contests in Louisville. The CDC also receive a thank you from the Great Lakes Regional Junior Show, Dorset Ewe Grant Recipient Selah Blum, a Kathie Harmann Memorial Winner Kara Nelson, NDJA Scholarship Winner L.R. Burns, NAILE Leadline Class Winner Campbell Reese and several All American Junior Show exhibitors thank-yous. A special donation was made to the NJDA in the name of Wendy Lacadie's mother, thank you to them for their generosity

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins presented the final futurity standings for the 2021 program. A total of \$3,715 was paid out to 17 participants. Awards and rosettes were presented to regional and national winners for an additional \$859.47. There were 145 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$3600 in nomination fees. The Dorset Advantage division had 20 ewe lambs nominated bringing in \$325 in nomination fees. The yearling ewe program had 2 nominations taking in \$50 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 43 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$925 in nomination fees. Of the total 208 ewe lambs nominated 94 (45%) were purchased by junior buyers and were eligible for futurity participation. The futurity had a record number of 7 group nominators. Deb also wanted to remind breeders with online sales to get the filled out Online Futurity Sales Nomination forms into the CDC office before the sale dates as online sales have contributed greatly to the program by offering almost half of the ewe lambs nominated.

-Breed Standard Education & Promotion: Ron Waldron and Mclayn Musick were voted onto the certified judges list. Deb Hopkins reported that the CDC did not pay out on the Dorset Wether Incentive plan and perhaps a committee needs to look at the program to re-do the guidelines. Linda Mastin, Bob Schembs and Bart Cardwell were appointed to the committee. Deb reported that the Dorset Slick Shearing Road Map banner has been used at the AAJS and NAILE Shows. The slick shearing picture guidelines still need to get up on the website for reference.

-Newsletter/Webpage: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2021 Fall Edition was completed as an online edition. It was posted on the CDC website and emailed out at the end of October, pre-Louisville. Advertising support was minimal. Deb Hopkins reported that our ad designer Dale Smith notified her of his retirement from the position. Thank you to Dale for over 20 years of service to the CDC. With that being said, Deb presented a proposal from Kasey Gordon to be the advertising designer, sales and newsletter set-up person for the Dorset Connection moving forward. Linda Mastin moved to accept Kasey's proposal for being the Dorset Connection Adverting Designer, ad sales and newsletter set-up person. Bob Schembs seconded. Motion carried. Deb also reported that our website designer Frank Tiffany was looking to ease up on his commitments so Deb also presented a web site design proposal and maintenance program from Novel Designs. Jeremy Crouch move to accept the mobile friendly website proposal from Novel Designs. Bob Schembs seconded. Motion carried. Thank you to Frank Tiffany for his many years of service to the CDC and we are glad he will still be working with us on the registry program maintenance. Deb will reach out to Novel Designs and Kasey Gordon to start working with them for the upcoming 2022 Winter Dorset Connection and new website.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2022 All American will be at the Eastern States Fairgrounds in West Springfield, MA from June 30-July 3. The New England committee is working hard and getting organized to host a great event. Deb will put together the CDC class sponsorship list and publicize next spring. Sink/Padgett has already offered to donate a horned ewe lamb to be sold for benefit of the show and Pine Knob Farm will donate towards the polled portion of the show by selling a yearling ewe at Ohio. Deb will also once again send out AAJS raffle tickets in breeder's first registration work of the year and will appreciate folks retuning the sold tickets to support the show. The AAJS will once

again be doing the Ram Semen Benefit Online auction in the spring and we need some lots of Dorset semen offered to help support the ever growing All American.

-National Junior Dorset Association: Deb Hopkins reported that the Annual Junior Association Meeting held their Annual Meeting in Louisville on Saturday night November 13, 2021. There were over 80 people in attendance for the meeting and pizza party. The association presented the \$1000 Tracy Repasky Scholarship to L.R. Burns, OR. The 2021 Dorset Futurity Awards were also presented along with the first Dorset Showman at a National Event show brushes. Allison Smith will once again be organizing a NJDA Benefit Online Auction. It will be March 2022 on Show Circuit Online Sales. Allison is looking for animals, semen, or anything sheep related for the sale. Consignors can donate all or a percentage of their sales. Last year the sale generated over \$4000 for the association so they could carry out their scholarship and ewe purchase grant programming for the youth. The NJDA voted in the following board of directors: President Keegan Padgett, IN; Vice President: Kyle Schakel, IN; Secretary/Treasurer: Breanna Knittel, IL; Madelyn Syme, CT; Emma Oberholtzer, PA; Raevyn Odum, CO and Megan Smith, MT. The NJDA board is making plans for more activities in 2022 and will be having zoom board meetings in the new year to organize.

-Production Committee: Nothing to report at this time.

-Dorset Youth Ewe Purchase Grant: Deb Hopkins reported that there were 37 applications received for the three age divisions with the Junior Division having twice as many as the other age division, so probably will award two in that division. Deb will get them scanned and emailed out to the committee for their evaluation. Deb will also update the scoring rubric to give a wider point range so scoring will be easier for the evaluators. Deb also reported that one of the ewe grants from last year has gone unclaimed after two notifications but they still have to the end of the year to claim.

-Dorset Hall of Fame: Deb Hopkins reported that the CDC is in need of some Hall of Fame nominations so inductee(s) can be recognized at the upcoming CDC Annual Meeting in Ohio. The board will contact some folks to get nominations in.

-2022 Western & Great Plains Director Elections: Deb Hopkins reported that the committee chairmen and committees were announced in the fall newsletter and the committees have received all of their directions from the CDC office as nominees need to be sent into the office January 1st.

NEW BUSINESS:

-2022 National Sale & Annual Meeting: The National Sale for Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding Sheep will be at the Ohio Dorset Sale, Greenville, OH on March 18 & 19 and the 2022 Dorset Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage will be at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale in Sedalia, MO on June 15-17. The CDC Annual Membership Meeting and Hall of Fame Induction will be at the Ohio Dorset Sale on Friday, March 18 soon after the sale show. The CDC Board meeting will be Thursday evening at 6:00 PM, Deb will get a meeting room at the sale headquarters. Sale management will be providing sale day online bidding.

-NAILE National Dorset Shows: Directors in attendance reported on the 2022 shows at NAILE. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2022 national open shows were named in honor of longtime breed secretary Marion Meno. Marion's daughter Barb Henry and her husband John were on hand to accept the award in Marion's memory. The show numbers were up in all of the Dorset shows and the new fitted/slick shorn class format worked very well in the Polled Dorset shows. Deb reported that she had been contacted by the NAILE sheep show supt. to give suggestions for the show, which she did and outlined what improvements need to be made to keep this show's prestige. The lack of banners and some rosettes for the open shows was noted. They are being ordered and will be mailed out by NAILE to the winning exhibitors.

2022 Judge Nominations were selected for the ballots as follows: Polled Fitted/Horned Dorsets: Skip Anderson, John Mrozinski, Brad Angus, Tim Hall; and Polled Slick Shorn: Dustin Cruit, Craig Beckmier, Brent Jennings, Brad Angus. These names will be put on the ballots send out to NAILE exhibitors for preference ranking submitted to NAILE. Deb also asked the board for some Junior Show judge suggestions as there will need to be new judges needed and the names of Tim Gadsby, Aaron Crome and Katherine Kuykendall were suggested along with Sara Kuykendall for Breeding Sheep Showmanship.

-By-Law Committee Appointment: Racheal Gately appointed Bob Schembs, Linda Mastin and Deb Hopkins to the by-law review and up-dating committee to start going over the current set of by-laws and present updates for consideration moving forward.

-Secretary's Travel: The board requested that the executive secretary personally attend the 2022 National Sale at the Ohio Dorset Sale, May Ohio Showcase Sale if possible, All American Junior Show in Massachusetts and NAILE. Deb will make arrangements to get the class winning photos from Sedalia posted to the CDC Facebook page and will promote sale from afar on the Facebook page. Racheal Gately will be going and can take ring shots for posting.

THE INS & OUT OF THE DORSET ADVANTAGE REGISTRY

The Continental Dorset Club instituted the Dorset Advantage Registry in 2014 to provide a place for the Dorset breeders to promote the purebred Dorset genetics in the popular white face cross/speck divisions at junior shows. Dorset Advantage is a hybrid vigor enhanced sheep where at least one of their parents is a purebred registered Dorset and hence they carry the positive attributes of the Dorset breed in general. The versatility of the Dorset Advantage is most readily apparent in their ability to serve both maternal and terminal aspects of sheep production. The Dorset Advantage percentage registry was established to showcase the positive influence of purebred Dorset genetics when they are included in planned crossbreeding scenarios. And, to help provide producers with a label and genetic record of these hybrid sheep who are superior based on the genetic potency of their purebred Dorset ancestry.

The CDC was able to promote the Dorset Advantage breed at numerous junior shows immediately by implementing classes at the six CDC sponsored regional junior shows, the All American Junior Sheep Show and the National Junior Show in Louisville as well as a division for them to be sold at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale. The breed has grown leaps and bounds since 2014 and has grown in registrations by 350 % and in transfers by 410%. Currently several junior shows have classes for the Dorset Advantage sheep, and each year more and more participation numbers are seen in the shows. The Dorset Advantage registry is drawing many new breeders and junior exhibitors into the Dorset breed as they realize the importance of the purebred Dorset genetics in their final product.

With this growth and the introduction of many new breeders, a lot of questions on how to register a Dorset Advantage have been coming into the CDC office on a daily basis. We thought it was time to re-introduce the original Dorset Advantage rules for registry and their breed standard of excellence/scorecard.

Following are the rules and regulations for registering a Dorset Advantage:

There is a separate Dorset Advantage registration form available on the CDC website or from the CDC Office. The important thing to remember is that all rules and regulations apply to registering a Dorset Advantage as it does a purebred Dorset. The non-registered parent needs to be

identified on the application form with a flock name & number and breed make-up description. The DA registration form provides extra spacing and explanation for this information. The lamb being registered will be owned by the owner of the dam. In the case where one does not own the purebred registered Dorset sire; ram service forms or semen sale forms are still needed. Transfer of ownership on the DA being registered can be directly done on the form and the transfer fee will also need to be paid along with the registration fee.

This is not a breed-up registry into purebred Dorset status. The only way a DA can be registered out of a DA animal is for it to be bred to a purebred registered Dorset. You cannot breed a Dorset Advantage to another Dorset Advantage to get an animal eligible for the Dorset Advantage registry. Also, one cannot breed a DA to a non-Dorset to get a Dorset Advantage eligible animal. There always has to be at least one purebred registered Dorset parent in the equation.

The Dorset Advantage also has a standard of excellence and scorecard. *Continued on page 14*

DORSET ADVANTAGE REGISTRY PROGRAM

Eligibility:

-The sire OR dam must be a registered purebred within the Continental Dorset Club.

-The purebred parent may be horned or polled; male or female.

-A Dorset Advantage sheep may be 50% Dorset or higher (ex. a Dorset Advantage registered ewe bred back to a Dorset can also be registered as a Dorset Advantage, a two purebred registered Dorset parent mating that produces a lamb with non- white color patterns can be registered as a Dorset Advantage.)

-DORSET ADVANTAGE SHEEP CAN'T BE BRED UP TO PUREBRED STATUS, NO MATTER THE PERCENTAGE AND THEY MAY NOT COMPETE IN THE PUREBRED DORSET SHOWS EVER.

Rules for Registration:

-Same as purebred sheep, EXCEPT, sire OR dam must have CDC purebred registration number along with flock name and private ID. Non-purebred parent will either be designated as "unregistered" with a private flock name and ID OR will include a CDC Dorset Advantage registration number (ex. DA-123456) with a private flock name and ID.

-Guidelines for Membership, Ownership, Transfers, and Fees are the same as for purebred sheep.

Shows / Sales:

-The CDC will endeavor to include a Dorset Advantage division at the six sponsored Regional Junior Shows, the All-American Junior Show and the NAILE Junior Show.

-To be eligible to show the animal must carry a CDC Dorset Advantage paper showing 1/2 blood or higher Dorset percentage.


-Dorset Advantage sheep will show slick shorn.

-If a separate Dorset Advantage division is not offered at a show, then they are to be shown in the AOB Division. They are never to be shown with other purebred, registered Dorsets.

Futurity Program:

-A separate division was incorporated into the futurity program for Dorset Advantage Ewe Lambs in 2014, and will expand to include yearling ewes in 2015 if enough Dorset Advantage ewes get renominated. If not they will compete in the general Yearling Ewe Division.. All the same futurity rules and regulations apply. Pine Knob

Continued from page 12 **DORSET ADVANTAGE STANDARDS OF EXCELLENCE** (A Guide For Selection and Judging) "SUPPORTING PUREBRED DORSET GENETICS"

Overview

Dorset Advantage is a hybrid vigor enhanced sheep where at least one of their parents is a purebred registered Dorset and hence they carry the positive attributes of the Dorset breed in general. The versatility of the Dorset Advantage is most readily apparent in their ability to serve both maternal and terminal aspects of sheep production.

General Appearance

Dorset Advantage are sheep that have good body length and exceptional muscle. A variety of frame sizes and mature body weights are acceptable within the breed due to the various genetic makeup of the non-purebred registered Dorset parent. Hair color on the face and legs may also be variable due to the genetic make-up of the non-Dorset parent. Dorset Advantage sheep are to be shown slick shorn meaning the sheep are to carry a uniform length of wool growth that was shorn 7 days prior to show, with the only exceptions being on the poll, front legs below the knees and rear legs below the hocks.

SCORE CARD

Neck-Shoulder-Chest 20 points

A Dorset Advantage's neck should be moderate in length, trim and well set with head erect and alert. Rams should show masculinity with a good crest. The neck should be free of wrinkles and or dewlaps. Any dewlaps, wrinkles, and or skin folds should be heavily discriminated against and are considered highly objectionable traits. (A Dewlap is a pendulous fold of skin under the throat of an animal.) Shoulders should be smooth, oblique, and well laid into the ribs. The chest should be deep ribbed, well sprung, and with width to the chest floor.

Back-Loin-Rump-Leg 45 points

The back should be strong, straight, level and it should carry out to the dock with the tail head fairly high set. The loin should be long, wide, and deep. The rump should be long, wide, level and very well muscled. The leg should be thick through the center extending well into the stifle area and carrying low towards the hock. Emphasis should be placed on total body length in relationship to height at the shoulder. Dorset Advantage should be long as or longer than they are tall. The loin, rump, and leg are three important parts of the sheep. Dorset Advantage must excel in these areas having at least 50% of their length in their hind saddle.

Feet-Legs-Pasterns 30 points

Legs should be well set under the corners. They should be straight, strong, and of ample bone. The forearm area as well as the rear leg should show good expression of muscling. The feet should point straight ahead and not turn out at an angle. Sheep should have short, strong pasterns. All these skeletal parts should move with strength and correctness when the animal is on the move.

Skin 5 points

The skin should be free of any large wrinkles and loose folds. Skin should be soft and attractive.

Serious Defects

The following defects are very undesirable. They should be discriminated against in shows and sales, and in the flock

selection process. (After each defect the section(s) of the scorecard in which that defect is found and the total points assigned to that section are listed.)

- 1. Inverted eyelids
- 2. Abnormally large tear ducts
- 3. Lack of muscling (Back-Loin-Rump-Leg 45 pts)
- 4. Weak pasterns (Feet-Legs-Pasterns 30 pts)
- 5. Post legged (Feet-Legs-Pasterns 30 pts)
- 6. Sickle hocked (Feet-Legs-Pasterns 30 pts)
- 7. Cow hocked (Feet-Legs-Pasterns 30 pts)

8. Splayed footed (Badly turned out front feet) (Feet-Legs-Pasterns 30 pts)

Highly Objectionable Traits

The following traits are highly objectionable and affect the basic functionality of the breeding animal. These traits will be vigorously discriminated against in shows and sales. In addition, the CDC Board of Directors strongly encourages you to display a high level of integrity when selecting animals in your flock for registry in the Continental Dorset Club displaying any of these traits. (After each trait the section(s) of the scorecard in which that trait is found and the total points assigned to that section are listed.)

1. Dewlaps, excessive loose skin or large wrinkles and folds. (Dewlap is a pendulous fold of skin under the throat.) (Neck-Shoulder-Chest 20 pts)

- 2. Incisor teeth slightly missing dental pads
- 3. Abnormal testes:

A. Scrotal circumferences less than 30 centimeters for one year and under and 32 centimeters for yearlings and older. (Reference: S.I.D. Sheep Production Handbook, pg. 936)

B. Testicles unequal in size.

Disqualifications

Any animal having any of the following characteristics will be disqualified from shows and sales, and are ineligible for registry in the Continental Dorset Club.

1. Spilt scrotum exceeding more than 1/2 inch in split length

2. Obvious parrot mouth (overshot upper jaw) or monkey jaw (undershot upper jaw)

3. Cryptorchidism (rams lacking two or one testicles)

4. Any signs of surgical alterations or any mechanical alterations (other than tail docking, and horn and/or scur care to protect the health of the animal or for management purposes).

*Violators will be subject to disciplinary action as outlined in the Continental Dorset Club Constitution and Bylaws.

The standard of excellence and scorecard is based on the functionality of the animal like other breed standards in the industry. There is no specific mention of color as it is understood that this maybe be varied on the genetics introduced by the non-registered parent and should not be a detriment to the animal in the show ring. There is also no mention of wool quality as these animals are to be shown slick shorn. This breed standard of excellence and scorecard also provides judges with a guide on how to evaluate the breed in the show ring and for breeders to strive for these positive characteristics in their breeding programs. §

Factors Affecting Lamb Quality and Value

Sheep producers constantly strive to improve lamb quality and value within their flock. Both of these impact acceptability for their buyers, which could be either packers or lamb consumers. This in turn impacts profitability of the sheep operation. Here are a few tips to consider that can improve the quality and value of lambs produced by your flock.

First, let's start with understanding quality. Eating quality is a perception by consumers based on some key characteristics such as tenderness, juiciness, flavor, and overall acceptability. Basically, we want all lamb consumers to have a good eating experience. We can help to ensure this good eating experience by considering factors that affect lamb quality and value.

There are several points that producers can control to manage lamb quality. Aspects such as genetics, feed, growth rates, body condition and husbandry practices can greatly impact lamb quality.

Genetics

Genetic impacts start with selecting breeding stock with appropriate muscling. Consumers certainly prefer larger loin eyes when selecting lamb chops. However, avoid genetics that carry the Callipyge gene. This genetic mutation increases muscling but can also greatly decrease tenderness. So, while sheep with Callipyge genetics produce lamb chops with larger loin eyes, those lamb chops tend to be very unacceptable to consumers from a tenderness standpoint.

Feeds

Feeds impact lamb flavor profiles. Lambs finished on a high forage diet produce a more intense flavor as compared to lambs finished on a grain diet. However, be sure to avoid extended periods of high grain diets because this can result in off flavors and soft fat that leads to decreased shelf life. The decision to finish lambs on grain or grass should be made based on customer preferences.

Growth Rate

Rations obviously impact lamb growth rate, but tenderness remains similar between fast and slow growth rates. Regardless of the growth rate it is very important that lambs maintain a consistent growth rate from weaning to slaughter. This is most critical during the last two weeks prior to slaughter.

Rations will also impact the amount of time is takes for lambs to develop intramuscular fat, also known as marbling, found in the meat. However, meat quality differences can be minimal if lambs are fed to a particular end point weight. At this end point collagen degradation rates will be greater in lambs with high growth rates. What this means in terms of lamb quality is that the collagen tissues break down more quickly in lambs fed to gain weight faster and thus results in a more tender meat.

Body Condition or Finish


All lambs should be marketed when they reach a desired body condition or finish. Lambs fed to a yield grade 2 or 3 are often the most ideal for packers and consumers. A lamb with a yield grade 2 will have 0.16 to 0.25 inches of backfat at the 12th rib, while a lamb with a yield grade 3 will have 0.26 to 0.35 inches of backfat. This is important because animals with an adequate amount of finish should yield a high-quality carcass that has enough fat to produce meat with good eating qualities and enough backfat to prevent cold shortening. Whenever a carcass is hanging in a cooler for chilling the muscle tissues can shorten. This "cold shortening" can lead to tough meat but is lessoned whenever a lamb has adequate finish because it chills more slowly. Very small lamb carcasses may need a two-step chilling process to avoid excessive cold shortening.

Appropriate amounts of finish impact the value of lambs to packers. Over finished lambs will have a lower value because it costs the packer time and money to trim the excess fat. Lamb meat with appropriate amounts of fat will be more acceptable to most consumers. On the other hand, under finished lambs can develop quality issues due to excess drying of the meat while hanging in the cooler.

Husbandry Practices

Husbandry practices affect meat quality due to stress at the farm, during transport and pre-slaughter. Minimize stress when handling or transporting lambs by minimizing noise and handling gently. Don't mix lambs from different groups, check the loading ramps and trailer for any areas that could cause bruising and don't overload the trailer. Also, be sure to move animals slowly and avoid vigorous exercise. Chasing lambs around the pen can be quite stressful to sheep at any age.

Whenever an animal is stressed



Meat quality can be impacted by producer management practices as well as processing practices just before and after slaughter.

or has vigorous exercise prior to slaughter, glycogen becomes depleted in the muscle tissues. Animals store glycogen, a form of sugar, in muscle tissues. This impacts the pH level of the muscle tissue after slaughter. Once an animal is killed, the glycogen changes to lactic acid which decreases the meat pH from about 7.2 to 5.5.

Meat from stressed animals with depleted glycogen levels does not go through this pH drop, which has a direct effect on meat quality. The meat color will maintain a dark color, produce a more intense flavor, has a decreased shelf life and stays red when cooked. This last factor often causes consumers to overcook meat which leads to a dry and tough piece of meat.

Pre-slaughter husbandry practices can help to manage glycogen reserves in muscle tissue. Unweaned lambs sent to slaughter should be processed on arrival at the processing facility to minimize stress. Weaned lambs that have been hauled a long distance should receive a rest period prior to slaughter. All lambs should have access to water to prevent dehydration which could lead to meat quality issues such as dark colored meat. Dehydration also leads to decreased carcass weight.

Lambs should be held off feed for a 12-hour period prior to slaughter. This keeps lambs cleaner, which decreases the likelihood of fecal contamination on the carcasses.*Continued on Page 19*

For lambs that may be scouring prior to shipment, feeding additional hay may stop the scouring. However, avoid feeding hay in high enough levels or for extended periods of time that result in lambs losing weight within the two weeks prior to slaughter.

Overall, increasing the quality and value of lambs begins with paying close attention to nutrition, selecting animals with adequate muscling, feeding them to an appropriate body condition, keeping lambs clean and making sure that lambs are gaining weight throughout the finishing phase and especially during the last two weeks before harvest. Minimizing stress to the lambs will also impact meat quality. Paying close attention to these few simple production aspects can result in higher quality meat and more satisfied consumers.

CACHE VALLEY VIRUS (CVV)

Who can be affected?

SHEEP & GOATS

Deer, cattle, and horses can also be infected and spread the virus through mosquitos, but do not develop clinical signs. Rarely, humans can be infected.

How is it spread?

MOSQUITOS carry CVV that can cross the placenta and infect the fetus(es) at 27 - 54 days into the pregnancy. Those infected earlier during that period are more likely to abort and re-cycle, whereas those infected later in that time period are more likely to produce malformed kids/lambs.

Can you prevent CVV?

- Unfortunately, there is NO VACCINE
- Minimize exposure to mosquitoes during and shortly after breeding season
- Concentrate breeding outside of mosquito season
- Once infected, dams are protected from reinfection for their lifespan

Periods of drought tend to decrease mosquito presence and thus CVV transmission, while wet and humid periods cause an increase. Multiple years of low incidence creates extremely vulnerable populations of does/ewes which leads to a seemingly catastrophic incidence level during the kidding/lambing season following the next wet season. The 2020 drought followed by the wet 2021 Summer in New England is a prime example.

How is CVV diagnosed?

CVV can be difficult to diagnose because it is no longer viable when the effects are seen. Diagnosis is best made by identifying antibodies in either the chest fluid or heart blood of the stillborn kid or lamb. Antibodies can also be found in a blood sample from the dam, but do not necessarily mean she was infected during the specific pregnancy in question.



What will you see?

DAM

- Early embryonic death (doe/ewe aborts at 28-50 days pregnant and consequently comes back into heat)
- Abortions
- Dystocia difficulty kidding or lambing

KIDS & LAMBS

A dam's entire set can be affected, or it may only affect certain individuals (signs between individuals may vary)

- Delivered at term dead or alive with one or more of the following abnormalities:
 - Arthrogryposis bent legs & fused joints
 - Scoliosis/torticollis twisted spine
 - Hydrocephalus/hydranencephaly enlarged skulls w/ decreased brain matter/function
 - Underdeveloped muscles
 - Parrot mouth
 - Cryptorchid undescended testicles
- Delivered at term, but mummified
- Abnormally weak, drowsy, and unsteady lambs

What should you do if you suspect CVV?

Keep the stillborn kid/lamb in question cold, and contact TVFS for testing within 12-24 hours.




