
The numbers in all of the Dorset Shows: Open and Junior; Polled, Horned & Dorset Advantage were all up in head entered in part to the new class divisions now being offered. The Dorset shows were once again of exceptional quality from top to bottom. It seems like it only gets better each and every year. A true testament to a breed and its breeders in remaining progressive in producing quality breeding stock, no matter what kind of Dorsets you raise.

Things got started on Friday, November 10th with the junior showmanship classes and ladies leadline. Over 45 Dorset Junior Exhibitors participated in the Breeding Sheep Showmanship and did very well with a Dorset exhibitor always in the top five of the classes, and Madelyn Syme, CT won the 11 year old class. In the Leadline competition 16 exhibitors lead Dorsets. Campbell Reese, OH won the 8-10 year old class leading her Horned Dorset. Congratulations to all of these young Dorset breeders!

On Saturday, the Junior Market Lamb Show and Junior Dorset Breeding Sheep Show took place. There were 25 Dorset Market Lambs exhibited in two classes. Kendall Ellerbrock, IL showed the Champion and Trace Titus, IL exhibited the Reserve Champion Dorset Market Lamb. The breeding sheep shows were of high quality and very deep. The entire show results and pictures are in the back of this newsletter.

That evening the National Junior Dorset Association held their annual meeting in which over 75 youth members and their families attended. Futurity and Scholarship awards were presented, and NJDA board of director elections were held. What a great group of kids to work with, you make the Dorset breed proud.

The Open Shows took place Tuesday, November 14th with the Horned Dorsets starting things off followed by the Polled Dorset Show. It was the first time the Polled show awarded three premier exhibitors. The winners were: Fitted Premier-Lauden Acres, PA, Slick Shorn Premier-Olivia Waggoner, PA and Wether Type Premier-:Tyler Myers, OH. There was multiple competition in all divisions and it was very well received. Horned Dorset Premier Exhibitor was Keaton Snipes/Konnor Barns, OH. Congratulations to all that participated, all the sheep looked great!





2017 CDC BOARD FALL TELE-CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Dick Reece at 7:30 PM EST on December 12, 2017. Directors on-line were: Michael Pope, Glenn Stunkel, Bob Heuvel, Mike Wright and Jerry Gross. CDC Exec/ Sec/Treas. Deb Hopkins was also on-line to take minutes.

<u>-Secretary's Report:</u> Deb Hopkins presented in writing the meeting minutes from the 2017 Annual Board Meeting held March 16, 2017 in Eaton, OH. Glenn Stunkel moved to accept the minutes as printed. Mike Wright seconded. Motion carried.

-Treasurer's Report: Deb Hopkins presented the current fiscal report for the time period from September 1, 2017 to November 29, 2017. It was reported that total income was \$17,312.50; total expenses were \$24,120.26, for a net loss for the period of \$6,807.76. Account balances were: Checking \$38,697.05, Money Market \$10,146.35, CD \$26,168.76, Dexter/Navigant Savings \$25.00, Junior Association \$32,604.99 for a total of \$107,642.15 on hand. Jerry Gross moved to accept the treasurer's report. Bob Heuvel seconded. Motion carried. Deb Hopkins reported that the 2016-2017 fiscal records were going to the accountants for the annual tax from filing and noted that the association's bottom line was \$7,412.63 in the black for a comfortable income for the third year in a row making the association much more stable. -CDC Stats: Deb Hopkins reported the current 2017-2018 stats. 854 head have been registered to date (up 231 head from last year) and 567 head transferred (up 219 head from last year). There has also been 29 head of Dorset Advantage sheep registered and 45 head transferred in that time period. Deb Hopkins also reported the year-end stats for 2016-2017. There were 5585 head registered (up 102 head from the previous year) and transferred 2647 head (down 5 head from the previous vear). There were 454 Dorset Advantage Sheep registered (up 87 head from last year) and 285 Dorset Advantage sheep transferred (up 114 head from last year). The top fifteen states in registrations were: 1)Indiana 734 head; 2)Iowa 614: 3)Illinois 467; 4)Ohio 386; 5)Pennsylvania 369; 6) Minnesota 355; 7) South Dakota 295; 8)Oregon 269; 9)Oklahoma 259; 10)Virginia 253; 11)Wisconsin 214; 12)Kansas 175; 13)California 171; 14)Tennessee 159; and 15) Washington 145. The top ten individual registrars were: 1) Thomas J. Dagel,

-Correspondence: Deb Hopkins reported that she has received many thank-you notes and letters from participants in the Louisville judging contests including the 4-H Skil-athon Contest as the CDC sponsors awards in all of the judging events in Louisville and from the contest organizers themselves. The CDC also received thankyou's from many All American participants, the Great Lakes Regional Junior Show, the North Central Regional Junior Show, a Northeast Youth Show Junior show exhibitor and Klarissa Minish for the CDC providing materials for the Youth Sheep & Goat Fitting Clinic she put on in Missouri. **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

-Dorset Futurity: Deb Hopkins presented the final futurity standings for the 2017 program. A total of \$3,240 was paid out to 28 participants. Awards and rosettes were presented to regional and national winners for an additional \$463.21. There were 103 polled ewe lambs nominated for the program taking in \$2,600 in nomination fees. 50 polled ewe lambs were purchased by juniors and eligible for participation. The Dorset Advantage division had 3 ewe lambs nominated bringing in \$75 in nomination fees and 2 lambs were purchased by juniors but none of them submitted point record forms. The yearling ewe program had a 10 nominations taking in \$250 in nomination fees. The horned ewe lamb futurity had 36 ewe lambs nominated taking in \$825 in nomination fees. 11 horned ewe lambs were purchased by juniors and eligible for participation. This year all of the futurity final awards were presented at the National Junior Dorset Association meeting in Louisville because the meeting was post-show and the presentations were very well attended. Deb also presented the Online Futurity Form she made up for breeders who are nominating ewe lambs in online sales. It is very difficult to keep track of all that goes on in these sales. This form will be published in upcoming connection

and put on the CDC website for breeders to fill out and submit to the CDC for their online sales. Deb also presented the 2018 Futurity Budget for approval. Really need to get breeders to nominate more Dorset Advantage ewe lambs as the juniors are looking for them.

-Breed Standard Education: Discussion on the continuation of registering DA rams was discussed. After much discussion, it was decided to continue registering DA rams and to update information that they are eligible for DA registration but you still always need to have a purebred registered Dorset parent in a DA pedigree to register. For the Certified Judges List an application was received from Rocky Swearingen. Bob Heuvel moved to accept his certification. Jerry Gross seconded. Motion passed. -Newsletter/Webpage: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2017 Fall Online Edition of the newsletter was a well received issue with more advertising and a lot of show and sales results, all in color. The online newsletter had 6 ads in it and netted \$521.75 in income. The 2017 Spring/Summer Issue only had five printed ads in it and cost the association \$746.50 to get printed and mailed out. Hopefully this year with the National Sale in Sedalia we will get some more ads for that issue. Plans are underway for the 2018 Winter Issue and 10 pages of advertising has already been committed.

-All-American Junior Show: Deb Hopkins reported that the 2018 All American will be in the Indiana State Fairgrounds in Indianapolis, IN in from July 6-8. The Indiana committee is working hard and getting organized to host a great event. The CDC needs to raise funding for the breed sponsorship. A polled and horned ewe lamb needs to be donated with the possibility of other items, like semen straws. Deb will also have the class sponsorship list available at the Ohio Dorset Sale and Jerry Gross will reach out to the wether type breeders. This worked well last year and we had all classes sponsored.

-National Junior Dorset Association:
Dick Reece, Michael Pope & Mike Wright reported the Junior Dorset Association had another well attended meeting in Louisville, as there was some concern due to the early show release. The association awarded two \$1000 College Scholarships to Alexandra Ruwe, IL and Abby Donkers, MN. Abby was not able to attend in person but sent a very nice letter that was read before the group. The new 2017-2018 Officers are: President & Great Plains Director: Allison Smith, KS; Vice President & Director-At-Large: Katie Muir, IN:

-Production Committee: Bob Heuvel reported on the NSIP meeting he attended in Utah. He said NSIP made all the breed associations feel welcomed as they are now serving 15 different breeds. They are looking at different projects for NSIP to sponsor and get involved in. The CDC is actually the only registry to offer data on their registration papers. Now with the evolution of data processing with Lamb Plan that gets run every two weeks, might be better to now to just ask for the NSIP/Lamp Plan ID number of that animal to put on registration papers so then all one needs to do is to look up that number in the NSIP data base to get the most recent accurate performance numbers. Bob will come up with proposal to present at next board meeting to get approved as Deb will need to redesign registration papers and application forms. Thank you Bob for attending this NSIP meeting representing the Dorset breed. -Dorset Youth Ewe Purchase Grant: Deb

- -Dorset Youth Ewe Purchase Grant: Deb reported that there were 30 applications received for the three age divisions. She will get them scanned and emailed out to the committee for their evaluation. Winners will be notified by early January.
- -Dorset Hall of Fame: Deb Hopkins reported that she needs names submitted for the Dorset Hall of Fame. Nominations need to be in by April 1, 2018. She will announce deadline on the CDC Facebook page to get more nominations submitted for this year's selection.

OLD BUSINESS:

-2018 New England & Great Lakes Director Elections: Deb Hopkins reported that the committee chairmen were announced in the fall newsletter. The committees have received all of their directions from the CDC office as nominees need to be sent into the office January 15th for voting in February.

-Registry Program: Deb reported that there was a meeting in Louisville of the breed secretaries using the program to go over things and make suggestions for improvement to the program. Frank Tiffany was in attendance and took down the items for improvements, and will be working on program after the first of the year to update. The Montadale Association has

also purchased the program for use in their association as new breed secretary Kendra Fleck will be registering the sheep. That now makes 4 other breed associations now using the CDC program.

NEW BUSINESS:

-2018 National Sale & Annual Meeting: The National Sale for Polled & Horned Dorset Breeding Sheep, Dorset Wether Sires & Dams and Dorset Advantage will be at the Midwest Stud Ram Sale in MO on June 27-29. The CDC Annual Membership Meeting and Hall of Fame Induction will be Friday morning during a "breakfast" type meeting. She will get in contact with the Missouri Dorset group to see if they can assist once again. The board of directors meeting will be Thursday at 6 PM and Deb will contact the local hotel headquarters to set-up a meeting room. The topic of "un-registered" sheep getting sold at Midwest Sale, without even so much as a filled out application registry form being handed in was discussed. The CDC would really like the sale management to adopt policy that sheep will not be sold until registration papers or a completed registry application form has been handed in. We have had too many high dollar sheep get sold without papers then buyers, sale management and CDC office ends up chasing them well into the fall each year.

-NAILE National Dorset Shows: Attending board members, Dick Reece, Mike Wright, Michael Pope and Glenn Stunkel commented on the shows and things went very well for the Dorset breed. Entries were up from the previous year in all of the shows as 222 head were entered in the Open Polled Show, 174 head in the Junior Polled Dorset Show, 45 head in the Junior Dorset Advantage Show, 68 head in the Open Horned Dorset Show and 51 head in the Junior Horned Dorset Show. It was the first time that three premier banners were awarded in the Open Polled Show for the three different divisions. There were some growing pains with the new rule that all groups must be of the same division type so after much discussion, Bob Heuval moved to keep the three premiers and the rules the same. Motion died for lack of a second. Michael Pope moved the following NAILE Rule change: "Per NAILE rules, in the event of a tie for a premier exhibitor banner, the flock class is the tie breaker, should this happen within a Dorset divisional premier, only flocks that completely represent their division will count towards a tie breaker. Exhibitors are solely responsible for determining what to show in their flock and are solely responsible for how it would affect them in the event they are in a tie.", and to delete the rule that groups

must be of the same divisional type. Jerry Gross seconded. Motion carried by a 3 to 2 count. Mike Wright moved to add a Slick Shorn Yearling Ram and Yearling Wether Sire class to the Open Polled Dorset Show, and to delete out the wether type classes in the Open & Junior Horned Dorset Shows due to lack of participation and interest. Bob Heuvel seconded. Motion carried. Deb will put in for these changes at the 2018 NAILE Show.

Slick Shearing rule was also discussed. Michael Pope did the pre-show ringside check and thinks there might need to be some re-definition to the rule or more assistance in enforcing the rule. Pretty straight forward on the belly wool but the upper leg preparations vary greatly. Maybe there is a better way to educate and enforce the slick shorn rule than at the show prior to entering the ring. Since no official motion was made, it was thought for the directors to research how to better enforce the slick shearing rule, get some more breeder input and discuss how to enact policy at the next board meeting.

NAILE 2018 Judge Nominations were selected for the ballots as follows: Polled Dorsets: Dustin Cruit, John Mrozinski, Steve Reid; and Horned Dorsets: Aaron Crome, Farabee McCarthy, Brad Payne. These names will be put on the ballots send out to NAILE exhibitors for preference ranking submitted to NAILE. Deb also asked the board for some Junior Show judges suggestions as there will need to be several new judges required. The names of Kelly Bruns, Jeremy Bradford, Evan Snyder, Dale Davis were suggested along with Aaron Crome for Junior Breeding Sheep Showmanship Judge.

DORSET COMMERCIAL CONNECTION

Are Your Sheep Warm Enough?

Baby, it's cold outside! Different parts of the country have experienced some really frigid temperatures over the past month. This has sparked some interesting conversations related to feeding sheep to account for the added energy required to keep warm. Some of the discussions centered around increasing grain or hay, which led me to this article about ruminant digestion and how sheep keep themselves warm.

Understanding how sheep digest feed starts with a look at the four stomach compartments. The rumen is the part where bacteria break down the fibrous portions of the forages that sheep consume. This includes both cellulose and hemicellulose. These feeds then move to the reticulum where the animal regurgitates the food to do a more thorough job of chewing, also known as chewing the cud. The next compartment is the omasum, which absorbs much of the water used in the fermentation process. The final compartment is the abomasum where the enzymes and acids break down the microbes and any remaining feed components into nutrient forms that the animal can absorb.

While in the first two compartments, feed goes through a fermentation process to digest fiber, starch, sugars and proteins into volatile fatty acids (VFAs) and microbial protein. The animal absorbs the VFAs in the rumen. These VFAs are considered the major energy source for a ruminant.

Sheep produce heat from two methods: through the fermentation process and from nutrient metabolism in body tissues. These both

help sheep maintain body temperature, or in other words keep warm, during cold weather. The key is that sheep need to consume enough energy to support their energy needs for maintenance as well as heat production. Just how much additional energy do sheep require during extreme cold? Well, it depends on several factors. Two factors relate to body condition and fleece length. Sheep Production Handbook mentions a critical low temperature of 50 degrees for a freshly shorn sheep, while the critical low temperature for a sheep with 2 1/2" of fleece length is 28

degrees. We also know that sheep in good body condition are better able to withstand colder temperatures than sheep in poor body condition.

Environmental factors can also influence critical temperatures. Obviously, the actual temperature is one factor. Wind speed is another factor: the higher the wind speed, the more additional energy a sheep requires to maintain body temperature. According to Sheep Production Handbook "High-quality hay may be the preferred nutrient source, since it has a larger heat increment (heat produced in the body from digestive processes) than concentrates." Hay has the added advantage of being easier to feed in remote areas. However, as ewes get closer to lambing, their energy needs may increase such that they require more easily digested feeds in order to meet their added energy requirement. Thus, grain becomes the feed of choice in late gestation.

Why is this important? The first reason that comes to mind for most producers relates to animal welfare. All producers seek to manage sheep such that the sheep are comfortable. A very good second reason relates to health and vigor in newborn lambs.

Much early research in this area is still applicable today. Alexander (1962) (Energy metabolism in the starved

newborn lamb. Australian J. Agr.Res. 13(1): 144-164) suggests that "a low summit metabolism in lambs mav be associated with poor prenatal Inutrition. This may cause mortality since the lamb must increase heat production if it is to survive cold weather shortly after birth". "Adult sheep have been observed to be so underfed that their body temperatures fell 4 degrees C when



Free choice high quality forage is an excellent way to increase energy in a ration as well as provide added heat production needed to keep sheep warm in inclement weather.

the surrounding temperature dropped from 35 degrees C to 20 degrees C" (Graham 1964).

The next time the temperatures drop during the winter, remember that your sheep require additional amounts of energy in order to keep warm. How much additional energy is difficult to determine. However, free choice high-quality hay can certainly assist the sheep with maintaining body temperatures and is likely the feed of choice. For those ewes nearing the end of gestation, consider increasing their grain supplementation.



All Dorsets are scheduled to be shown on Wednesday, June 27 and sold on Friday June 29, compacting all of the Dorset activities with three days at the National Dorset Sale in Missouri.

DORSET HALL OF FAME PROGRAM 2018

Nominations for the Dorset Hall of Fame are due by April 1, 2018. Presentation of the 2018 Class of the Dorset Hall of Fame inductees will be at the Midwest Sale where the CDC Annual Meeting will be taking place. If you know of a deserving individual please get the nomination form filled out and sent into the CDC Office.

People selected to the "Hall of

Fame" will be recognized by the CDC with an appreciation plaque at the annual meeting and will be listed on the CDC website recognizing their contributions to the Dorset breed. Any person in the sheep industry may make nominations. Once a name is submitted they will remain nominated so no repeat nominations need to be made the following year.

NAILE GROUP CLASS DEFINITIONS UPDATED

2017 NAILE was the first National Open Polled Dorset Show with three divisional Premier Exhibitor banners being awarded. All in all it was a great addition to the show but as with anything new there some growing pains in interpreting the regulations.

At the recent board meeting the following rule changes will be implemented for 2018: "Per NAILE rules, in the event of a tie for a premier exhibitor banner, the flock class is the tie breaker, should this happen within a Dorset divisional premier, only flocks that completely represent their division will count towards a tie breaker. Exhibitors are solely responsible for determining what to show in their flock and are solely responsible for how it would affect them in the event they are in a tie.", and to delete the rule that groups must be of the same divisional type. Also, it was moved to add a Slick Shorn Yearling Ram and Yearling Wether Sire class to the Open Polled Dorset Show, and to delete out the wether type classes in the Open & Junior Horned Dorset Shows due to lack of participation and interest.

LARRY MROZINSKI


Lawrence Edward "Larry"

NEW FUTURITY NOMINATION FORM FOR ONLINE SALES

With the ever increasing popularity of online breeding sheep sales, it has become difficult in keeping track of the ewe lamb futurity nominations. The CDC has developed a "Online Ewe Lamb Futurity Nomination Form" that needs to be filled out by the breeder of the ewe lamb before they are sold online. The form will ask for identification the ewe lamb being nominated and lot number. This way the CDC office can then bill out for the nomination fees and also have record of ewe lambs that were actually futurity nominated.

2018 National Dorset Ewe Lamb Futurity Rules & RegulationsCONSIGNOR RULES:

- 1. Entries are for all ewe lambs born after September 1, 2017. Ewe lambs will compete in their specific age divisions.
- 2. Nomination fee is \$25.00 per head payable to the Continental Dorset Club. If a breeder would like to be able to nominate all of their ewe lamb consignments during the 2018 sale season then the flat fee would be \$250. Ewe Lambs must be nominated and designated prior to entering the show ring of their class at the futurity sale. Payment of nomination fee is to be made prior to the sale of the ewe lambs. Breeders wanting to take advantage of the group rate must make the CDC aware of their intention by their first sale.
- 3. Each ewe lamb must bear the proper identification which corresponds to the registration certificate. This includes flock identification and federal premise & individual identification numbers. Both must appear on the registration paper for a ewe to be eliquible for the program. Both tags also need to be in the ewe when she is being shown to earn points. If re-tags occur due to loss of federal tags then the CDC office must be notified immediately before the ewe is shown again. After transfer to the futurity participate, the registration certificate will be identified that this is a futurity ewe lamb.
- 4. Each ewe lamb must conform and abide by the rules and regulations of each individual sale to which it is consigned. All normal entry fees and commission apply.
- 5. The CDC will not be held responsible for any dispute and/or disagreements between buyers and sellers.
- 6. Any open consignment or production sale are eligible to offer futurity lambs. Sale managements must notify the CDC office with records of sales on any futurity ewe lambs for them to be eligible for the program.
- 7)Online sales are eligible for the Dorset Ewe Lamb Futurity Program. An online futurity nomination form has been designed that consignors must supply to the CDC office pre-sale that includes a list of nominated ewe lambs. The CDC will bill the consignor direct for nomination fees. No transfers will be completed until the list and payment has been received.

EXHIBITORS RULES:

- 1. ALL juniors who meet the requirements for the Junior Show at the North American International Livestock Exposition are eligible. Rules for the NAILE are:
- -Junior exhibitors 21 years old and under as of January 1, 2018 are eligible, no lower age limit but must be physically capable of showing their own sheep.
- -Junior members must be present to show their own sheep unless physically impaired.
- -Animals ownership registered with the CDC office by September 1, 2018
- -Ownerships must be in the youth's name. Youth partnerships, farm names or family ownerships are not acceptable.
- -Up to date youth or lifetime membership in the CDC.
- 2. Ewe lambs are to be registered in the **INDIVIDUAL NAME ONLY**. No partnerships, farm, family, 4-H club or FFA Chapter names accepted in the futurity program.
- 3. The purchasing junior can not be an immediate family member of the breeder or employee of the breeder as listed on the ewe's registration paper. Immediate family members would be described as any first generation child, grandchild, sister, brother, niece or nephew.
- 4. Ewe lambs and points earned in the futurity are not transferable to any other person other than the original owner, nor are points transferable from one lamb to another.
- 5. No futurity entrant may earn premiums on no more than two ewe lambs. Total points earned by two ewe lambs can not be combined.
- 6. If registration papers are not received by the first show, it is the exhibitors responsibility to show the lamb in the proper age category and have sales receipt to prove ownership to the show management.
- 7. If the exhibitor has more than one ewe lamb in the same class, another junior member may exhibit the ewe lamb as long as the exhibitor is showing the other ewe lamb.
- 8. **Premiums:** A minimum of \$2810 will be awarded to be divided up among the six districts and the NAILE Junior Show. The guaranteed money total will be given as follows:

If total nomination fees of ewe lambs and donations are greater than the \$2,810 total, premiums will be increased accordingly. It should be noted that the actual futurity pay out has been well over the guaranteed premiums since its inception. Futurity ewe lambs can either compete on a district level and at NAILE <u>OR</u> they can compete on just the district level if they can not get to the NAILE Junior Show in November.

2018 HORNED DORSET EWE LAMB FUTURITY DIVISION RULES & REGULATIONS

The Horned Ewe Lamb Futurity will be run exactly the same as the Polled Ewe Lamb Futurity with the following exceptions:

- 1) There will only be **ONE** national premium scale payout. The final show eligible will be the National Junior Horned Dorset Show at NAILE, Louisville, KY. The guaranteed premium scale is: First:\$200, Second:\$150, Third:\$100, Fourth:\$85, Fifth:\$65. Final placing will be announced during the Horned Dorset Junior Show in Louisville.
- 2)Junior participants can only collect premiums on **ONE** ewe lamb though you can participant with an unlimited number of ewe lambs.
- 3)Points turned in can only be from other horned dorset ewe lamb competition. You can submit points when the horned ewe lambs are shown with polled dorsets or in AOB competition but you can only base your class totals and placings on horned dorsets **ONLY**. For example: You are showing in an AOB class of 10 head and five are horned dorsets. Your lamb placed second among the horned dorsets. Your point form will read that you placed second out of five no matter where you placed in the whole class. When you are showing in a horned dorset class only then the whole class total number will count.
 - 4)ALL OTHER POLLED EWE LAMB FUTURITY RULES APPLY. ONLINE SALES ELIGIBLE.

2018 DORSET ADVANTAGE EWE LAMB FUTURITY DIVISION RULES & REGULATIONS

The Dorset Advantage Ewe Lamb Futurity will be run exactly the same as the Polled Ewe Lamb Futurity with the following exceptions:

- 1) There will only be **ONE** national premium scale payout. The final show eligible will be the National Junior Dorset Show at NAILE, Louisville, KY. The guaranteed premium scale is: First:\$200, Second:\$150, Third:\$100, Fourth:\$85, Fifth:\$65. Final placing will be announced during the Junior Dorset Show in Louisville.
- 2)Junior participants can only collect premiums on ONE ewe lamb though you can participant with an unlimited number of ewe lambs.
- 3)Points turned in can only be from other Dorset Advantage ewe lamb competition. You can submit points when the Dorset Advantage ewe lambs are shown in AOB or Crossbred competition but you can only base your class totals and placings on Dorset Advantage animals **ONLY**. For example: You are showing in an AOB class of 10 head and five are Dorset Advantage animals. Your lamb placed second among the Dorset Advantage. Your point form will read that you placed second out of five no matter where you placed in the whole class. When you are showing in a Dorset Advantage class only then the whole class total number will count.
- 4)ALL OTHER POLLED EWE LAMB FUTURITY RULES APPLY. ONLINE SALES ELIGIBLE AS WELL AS ANY OTHER CONSIGNMENT SALE WHERE REGISTERED DORSET ADVANTAGE EWE LAMBS ARE SOLD.
